It is also time to change or check batteries in your smoke detectors.


Veterans Day Ceremony

WE ARE WORKING TO GET BEDFORD HOSPITAL REOPENED. WE NEED YOUR HELP!

University Hospitals (UH) abruptly closed its Bedford hospital facility with only 30-days' notice, after assuring us for over a year the future of the hospital was "stable." We are very concerned about the life-or-death implications this has on Bedford and several neighboring communities.

Nearly 100,000 residents live within 5 miles of the now closed emergency room. Residents now have to travel further to seek emergency care and every passing minute is critical in an emergency situation. The additional travel time also means that our EMS squads are unavailable for longer periods of time. Since the Aug. 12 closing, we've already had to rely on mutual aid from neighboring communities, which means longer wait times for people experiencing medical emergencies.

Your health and safety are our top priorities. After UH denied our request to prevent or delay the closing, we immediately filed for the court order and made a formal complaint to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. We are in negotiations with UH through the Cuyahoga County Common Pleas Court.
