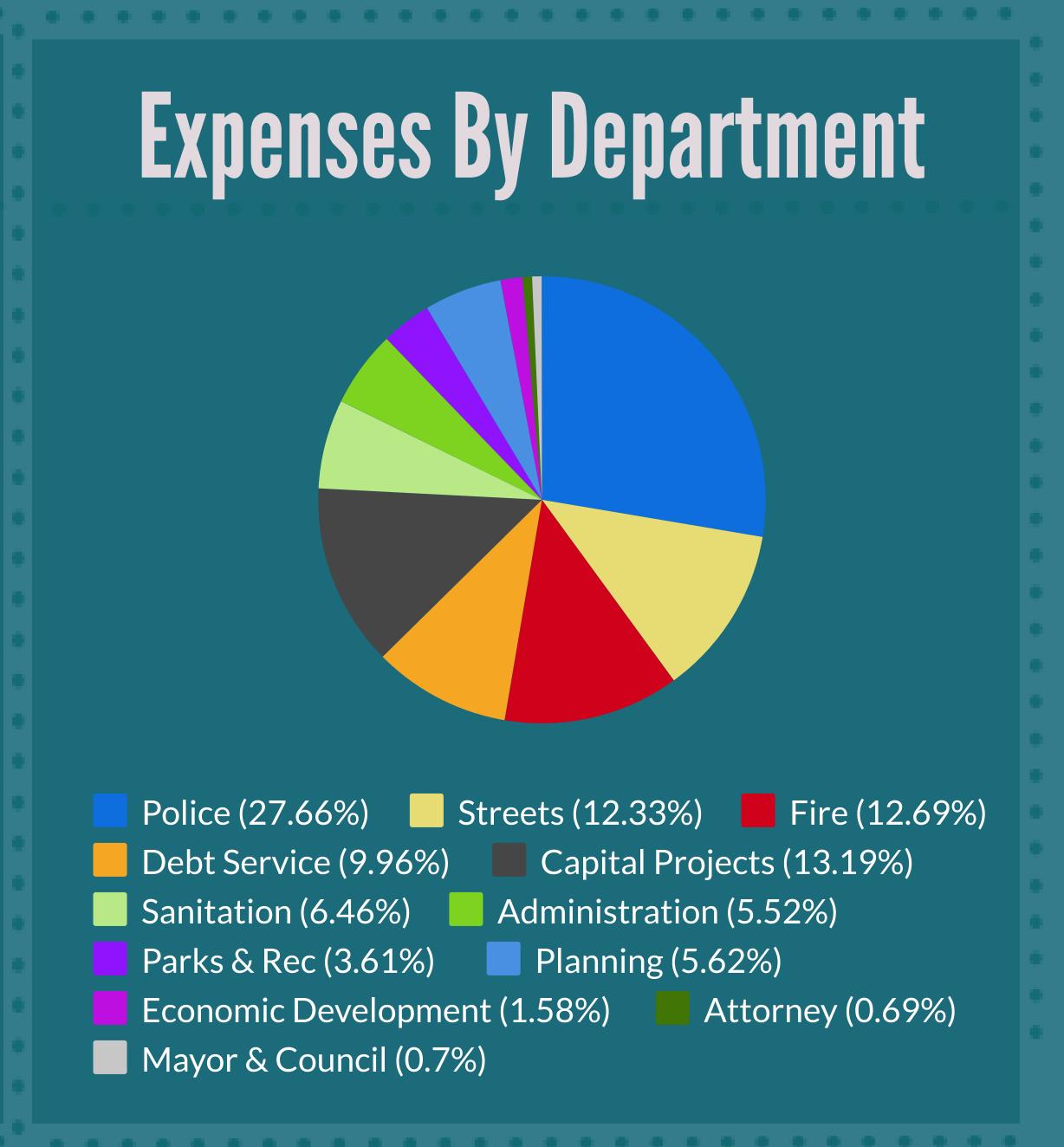




2020-2021 BUDGET BY THE NUMBERS

Revenue Sources TAXES AD VALOREM (60.08%) LOCAL OPTION SALES TAX (18.02%)

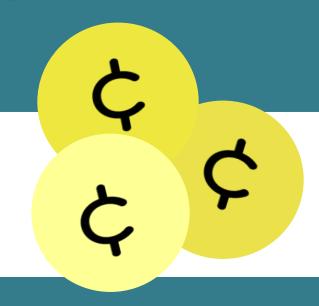


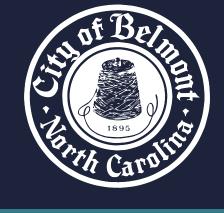
