SUBCOMMITTEE UPDATES

RECYCLING MEMBERS: BECKY, DOUG, ROB, & JENNIFER TREES MEMBERS: BECKY, DOUG, SHARON, JULIE, & JONATHAN



In 2021, the recycling subcommittee assisted city staff throughout the recycling provider selection process. This included reviewing the RFP document/contracts and helping select the city's provider.



During the recycling contract renewal process, the subcommittee focused on the types of educational material offered and ensured that was a priority for the city.



Throughout the 2021, the subcommittee continued to work to educate residents on recycling smart with the goal of keeping Belmont's contamination rates low.



This year, the subcommittee began to monitor and track the city's recycling rates to better help educate in the future.

BEES MEMBERS: SHARON & TEDDI

- In 2021, the bee subcommittee hosted a virtual live panel discussion (themed How To: Bees 101) to celebrate National Pollingtor Month. This event consisted of both local and national bee experts to help residents be more "bee friendly" in their backyards.
- The subcommittee partnered with Belmont **Community Garden** to install a water line to serve both the community garden and future pollinator garden. Together, the group raised through private donations for the water source.
- Now that the water source is installed. the pollinator garden planning has begun. This includes funding, site layout, and installation.
- The subcommittee is working to establish gardens throughout town by partnering with local schools and educating the students about bees.

In 2021, the tree subcommittee held three events to celebrate Earth Day/Arbor day. These events contributed to the 2021 Tree City USA requirements and now, designation.

- Contactless tree giveaway The subcommittee celebrated North Carolina's Arbor Day in March by giving away almost 100 redbud saplings to Belmont residents.
 - Virtual Live Panel Discussion The subcommittee hosted a virtual live panel discussion with local environmentalists, which focused on "Getting the most out of your outdoor space."
- Virtual Art Contest The subcommittee hosted a virtual art contest with local elementary school students. The theme was Tree Creatures and winners were presented awards and gift cards at the May city council meeting.

ENERGY MEMBERS: ROB, JENNIFER, & TED



The energy subcommittee hosted a live webinar in October to celebrate National Energy Awareness Month. The panel members consisted of representatives from Duke Energy and Dominion Energy. The webinar focused on how to invest in reducing residents'energy costs and environmental footprint.

This subcommittee assisted city staff with the location selection for the electric vehicle charging stations grant the city received.

In 2021, members of this group worked on gathering the city's energy usage data and explored potential energy rebates, with the intent of reducing the city's energy usage over time.
