
Juneteenth Celebration: Saturday, June 17 from 3:30 - 6:30 PM



Enjoy live jazz, the Buffalo Soldiers Motorcycle Club, songs by event chairman Noah Griffin, glitter tattoos and much more - Saturday, June 17 from 3:30 to 6:30pm. This Juneteenth event, on Main Street in downtown Tiburon, commemorates June 19, 1865, when Union General Gordon Granger arrived in Galveston, Texas to inform enslaved African Americans that the Civil War had ended and they were free. Our community's Juneteenth celebration features speakers including Ruben Kalra, Belvedere's representative to Tiburon's Diversity Inclusion Task Force and Mayor Jim Lynch. Juneteenth became a federal holiday in 2021.

Individual coyote behavior is impossible to predict, but as we enter the summer months, there may be an increase in coyote activity in Belvedere. On June 11, the City Council adopted a comprehensive **Belvedere Coyote Response Plan** to help us monitor and respond to any issues that may arise. But we need your help: If you see a coyote, use one of two easy methods to make a report. Use the online coyote reporting form (**Reporting Form**) (Available on the City of Belvedere Website in the "Coyote Awareness" section) or call the dedicated Coyote Reporting Hotline at 415-435-8942.

Timely reports of coyote sightings or encounters from residents like you are critical to the success of our efforts.
