Belvedere's Top Honors Go To ...



New Safety Measures for E-Bikes & E-Scooters



The popularity of e-bikes and e-scooters has caught the attention of our community, with particular concerns about their use by children under 16 years old and in areas of high pedestrian use. In response, the City of Belvedere initiated a collaborative effort involving our Parks, Open Spaces, and Lanes Committee, our Police Chief, our Public Works Director, the Town of Tiburon, and the Reed Union School District. The goal is to strike a balance between accommodating the growing popularity of e-bikes and e-scooters, while ensuring the safety of all community members. Staff is working on a policy to bring to the City Council.

Areas of focus include: speed limits, number of riders, age restrictions, public education and enforcement mechanisms.
