With Mount Pocono's 100th anniversary coming in 2027, it's a great time to look back at our history. Some of you may know parts of our story, while others might not. Knowing



our past helps us understand our future. Mount Pocono has changed over the years but has always kept its beauty and peace. As we face future changes, we must also preserve what makes Mount Pocono special.

Early Days: Settlements began at Tobyhanna Mills (now Tobyhanna) and along what is now Route 196. Our town was first called The Forks. An 1860 map shows three houses and a post office/ store at the crossroads. By 1875, we had a railroad depot, two hotels, a few houses, and the post office moved near the depot.

Tourism Boom: Around 1875, Mount Pocono became a popular tourist spot. What started with two hotels grew to ten resorts and many guest homes by the mid-1900s. Tourism became our main industry.

Rediscovery: Although the hotel business declined in the 20th century, the Poconos saw a comeback in the late 1960s with second home developments. Highways made up for the loss of rail service. Families settled here permanently, and by 2010, our population grew to 3,096.

Borough Building: Our Borough building was built as a school in 1899. The Borough bought it from the Pocono Mountain School District in 1961 for \$1. It was renovated in 1994-1995 and now houses the Borough offices and the Municipal Authority. We have been hard at work in 2024 continuing to secure grants that will significantly enhance our community spaces.



I am thrilled to update you on our current applications and proj-

DCNR Grants. The borough has applied for \$700,000 to complete Phase Two of the park improvements at Memorial Park located at the Borough Building.

This phase includes the development of a wellness loop around the entire park, an expanded, updated pavilion area, and increased parking.

Looking ahead, Phase Three will introduce new playground equipment for children ages 5-12, a basketball court, and two pickleball courts.

Another DCNR grant application was made for \$105,000 to purchase a parcel in our downtown area for the creation of a pocket park.

This project aims to support our downtown businesses by providing seating, landscaping, and overall beautification of the area.

DCED Greenways, Trails, and Recreation Program- To cover the 50% matching requirement for the \$700,000 DCNR grant, Mount Pocono has applied for a \$250,000 grant from the DCED Greenways, Trails, and Recreation Program.

The borough's contribution for this match will be \$37,000. If successful, we will garner nearly a million dollars in grant money for an investment of only \$37,000. I anticipate hearing back about this funding by the end of 2024.

Knob Overlook Improvements-Since applying to three local mini-grants (One For Nature, PMVB Impact Grant, and the Pocono Forests and Waters Conservation Landscape Grant), the borough has made landscaping and signage improvements at Knob Overlook.

Future Grant Applications- I expect to be applying for several more grants before the end of the year. These include a CFA Multimodal grant for the Pinehill intersection improvements. In the Fall, we will seek LSA grants (that's the local share of the Casino revenues) to support ongoing projects like the maintenance garage and further park improvements.

Overall, Mount Pocono projects have or will be submitting applications for over \$2.5 million in grant funding for various Borough projects in 2024.

The Borough is committed to continually improving Mount Pocono's community spaces and facilities, and these grants are a crucial part of that effort.

Stay tuned for more updates as we receive further news on our applications and funding status.
