New Business: Updates

Discussing the Safety Commission budget for 2025

All the commissioners discussed the Safety Commission budget for 2025 and wished to install a new mid-block crosswalk at the intersection of Delmar Rd. and Pocono Blvd. Joe said he would suggest that the Park and Recreation Committee include the crosswalk in the blueprint for its park project.

Repairing the railroad trestles on Pocono Blvd.: Update

Master Kim said the Railroad association might inspect the railroad bridge. Joe said he was happy to hear that.

Discussing Safety Campaign (crosswalks): Update

All the commissioners discussed the campaign via a group text. Eddie was worrying about cleaning the solar panels of the RRFBs and SDSs. Ella complained about the safety of the Five Points intersection. Master kim said he believed that the Boughrough was planning to study for safety in the intersection, and Joe said the project was dead. Eddie said the Borough should make all the fire hydrants visible. Some of them are covered with rubles and weeds.

Repairing the road at the intersection of Fairview Av. and Oak St.: Update

Master Kim said PennDot will start repairing the road on September 12. The Borough Road Manager confirmed it.
