

I hope all is well and you've had a great summer enjoying picnics, going on vacation, and partaking in the many events here in Mount Pocono and the surrounding communities. But as the calendar pages turn Fall will soon be upon us.

The air starts to turn a little cooler and the leaves will be turning beautiful shades of red, yellow and orange, the slowdown from the busy hustle and bustle of the summer months is a great time to relax and take in the natural beauty that makes Mount Pocono a wonderful place to live and visit.

One of the mainstays of Fall here in Mount Pocono is Harvest Fest, when downtown Mount Pocono becomes full of food, vendors and music. This year will be the 23th Harvest Fest, and it promises not to disappoint continuing the tradition that we all love and enjoy. Join the fun on Saturday, September 23, from 10 am until 5 pm.

Another Mount Pocono Fall event is the Mount Pocono Borough's Park & Recreation Trunk or Treat. While this is only the 2nd annual Trunk or Treat, last year's inaugural event was a huge success, with dozens of participants, games and little Halloween superheroes, pirates, ghosts, and just cute kids dressed up for the festivities. This year promises to be even bigger and better than last year, with a DJ Food Trucks, Prizes for decorated Trunks and Small Games/prizes. So don't miss out on the fun on October 21st from 3 PM to 5PM at the Pocono Mountain Volunteer Fire Company Carnival Grounds.

There are other Fall festivals and special event in the community's surrounding Mount Pocono, and Fall is a great time to take advantage of all there is to offer in the Pocono's.

Speaking of beautiful colored leaves . . . . . . Well, I did mention those at the beginning, if you've never taken the time in the fall foliage season to visit the Knob Overlook on Knob Road in Mount Pocono, you've missed one of the best views of the beauty of the Pocono's in the Fall (our cover page features The Knob in all its foliage glory!). From the Knob you can see the Camelback ski area and Big Pocono State Park, Delaware Water Gap, Shawnee ski area and to the north I've always been told you can see a peak in New York state by Port Jervis, although to be honest I can't definitively prove that one.

But you get the point, there's a wonderful unobstructed view of a wide and large portion of the beautiful Pocono Mountains and when the leaves turn brilliant colors the view is spectacular. The second addition will be replacing the old flagpole with 3 new flagpoles to be able to proudly display our American flag, the Pennsylvania flag and a third flag, (Maybe a Mount Pocono Borough Flag?), or another deserving flag as appropriate.

### What the Forks?

Our newsletter's name hearkens back to the 1830s when this area was known as "The Forks" - a reference to the intersection of several major roadways at what is now known as the "Five Points.".

The railroad stop & post office here were also known as "Forks, Pa."

Local merchants eventually adopted "Mount Pocono" to identify the area. That was thought to be a more attractive moniker to the growing New York & Philadelphia tourist trade.

The name stuck and was selected for the new borough when it was officially incorporated in July, 1927.



# PonyPlus is Available Now

A new Pony is galloping into service.

DOWNLOAD NEW iOS / Google App. On Friday September 1, 2023, PonyPlus will have a new, easier to use app to book and ride the PonyPlus service.

PonyPlus is an on-demand, curb-to-curb service allows anyone to request a shared ride using a smartphone app in two designated service areas in Monroe County.

For \$2 per trip, customers can book a ride from 6:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, and the PonyPlus app will provide confirmation of the trip or a message to adjust the request based on the availability of vehicles. The service runs in the Tri-Boro Connector area (Delaware Water Gap, East Stroudsburg, and Stroudsburg boroughs) and the Pocono Summit Connector area (Pocono Summit and Mount Pocono Borough).

Riders will book a trip via the PonyPlus app, which is available on the App Store (iOS) and Google Play (Android), and payment is made by using a credit card in the app or giving exact cash fare to the driver. PonyPlus buses will be instantly recognizable by colorful graphics and logos, and drivers have all been vetted by MCTA for the safety of our passengers. All vehicles are ADA accessible and have a secure position for one wheelchair. Passengers traveling with children under age 8 must supply and install the appropriate car seat or booster seat.





# When the Horse Show(s) Came to Town

with Susanne Fretz McCool

The "Pocono Mountains Horse Show" was held from 1930 to 1941 at the "Arena in the Clouds" located where Knob and Knox Roads meet in the Borough. According to the book Better in the Poconos: The Story of Pennsylvania's Vacationland by Lawrence Squeri, the show was sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce as a fund-raiser for the Monroe County General Hospital, But it really was part of a higger campaign to

the Monroe County General Hospital. But it really was part of a bigger campaign to associate The Poconos with 'good taste' and 'the better elements' of society.

A community project, the programs were sold by the Ladies Aid of the Mount Pocono Methodist Church, while the Pocono Mountain Volunteer Fire Department Auxiliary sold refreshments.

Promoters weren't above a bit of creative public relations puffery to draw the crowds. For the first show in 1930, they boosted attendance by promising appearances by Governor Pinchot and other celebrities. None showed up that year, but that didn't stop the show from becoming one of the nation's premier equestrian events which did ultimately attract "A-list" names.

The shows promoted the Poconos as a destination and were intended to associate the area with the glamor of high society since by the 1930s, the automobile had made horses playthings for the rich.

During the depression, the Pocono business community sought to align the vacation area with the rich and famous. They saw things like the horse show and the Laurel Blossom Festival of the same era as enhancing all of the Poconos resorts - even the middle class ones with patrons who only saw horses at race tracks!

A famous editorial of the period candidly said that Monroe County did not want visitors with "Coney Island tastes," but preferred to attract "the better class." Of course, it was the 'big three' of the time - Buck Hill, Pocono Manor, and Skytop - which directly gained the most, since their guests *were* the high society.



After the final Pocono Mountains Horse Show in 1941, a new high stepper confab came to town in the late 40s. We asked former county commissioner Susanne McCool, whose parents were responsible for the "Mount Pocono Horse Show," to tell us what she remembered about it:

My parents, John and Viola Fretz, and a group of businessmen from the Mount Pocono Area, brought the horse show back to our business, the Airport Inn, which today is known as Bailey's.

The show was held in the big field behind our hotel for three years – 1946, 1947 and 1948. Licensed by the American Horse Shows Association, it was actually part of the circuit which held prestigious shows at Madison Square Garden, among other places. These Horse Shows also benefited the General Hospital.

My sisters, Linda and Paulette, and I, were quite young then, but I still remember toddling around the field with our Aunt Audrey Grabowsky, watching people brushing their horses, braiding their tails, and putting ribbons in their manes and tails. When the shows were over, we would walk around the empty fields picking up those pretty ribbons.

Although I was very young, I can remember when our grandstands were being built behind our hotel. Duke Keiper, a local builder and friend of my parents, oversaw the project. I remember the day they tested the lights in the grandstands, a memory that has somehow stuck with me.

I believe some folks flew into the shows as the Mount Pocono Airport Association was conveyed to the Pocono Mountains Airport Association on September 26, 1945. My dad and other local businessmen were members of the Airport Association. Prior to this, the airport was owned and operated by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. The Coolbaugh Historical Society has records on how the airport was conveyed to the association. Butthat's a story for another day!
