



Where can I place my RV or Trailer in the County?

People currently residing in temporary dwellings on a property with fire debris will have to move them to another property until the fire debris is removed.

First, we encourage you to contact FEMA by calling 800-621-3362, to let them know your housing situation has changed. If you are not registered with FEMA, get registered by going to www.DisasterAssistance.gov or visiting a Disaster Recovery Center.

Next, the following options are intended to help you identify other places in the unincorporated area of the County to place your RV or trailer for temporary housing.

- Contact a property owner outside of the burn because all properties outside the burn area that allow residential uses in the unincorporated area of the County, including agriculture zoned parcels, are allowed to have up to two temporary dwellings on them for fire survivors.
- Contact a property owner within the burn area who has a parcel with no fire debris and ask to stay temporarily on that property. This includes vacant properties.
- Contact a property owner about a Temporary RV
 - Inside the burn area, permitted church/religious facility can establish a Temporary RV Park in a parking lot with the approval of an Administrative Permit.
 - Inside the burn area, Property owners in the Commercial zones and Planned Development zones can establish a Temporary RV Park.
 - Outside the burn area, property owners in Commercial, Industrial and other approved zones can establish a Temporary RV Park.

The Department of Development Services has contacted residents who received a permit to be on their burned property. People residing on burned property without any hookups, who therefore did not get a permit, can call 530.552.3701 to talk with Development Services about the changes to the ordinance.
