

# Guidelines for Fire Debris Disposal

**NEAL ROAD RECYCLING AND WASTE FACILITY** 

The Neal Road Recycling and Waste Facility (NRRWF) accepts fire debris and ash from contractors in the Camp Fire Alternative Fire Debris Removal Program.

## Certificate for Disposal

Haulers must present a certificate to dispose of fire debris and ash at the NRRWF. Butte County Environmental Health issues certificates directly to contractors.

## Disposal Fees – Effective March 1, 2019

- Municipal Solid Waste: \$44 per ton (includes fire debris and ash, and green waste)
- Scrap Metal: \$3.50 per ton
- Clean Asphalt or Concrete (no rebar or wire): no charge
- Other Asphalt or Concrete \$8 per ton
  (concrete pieces cannot exceed 2 feet in length, rebar cannot protrude more than 5 inches from concrete)

#### Moisture in Fire Debris and Ash

- NRRWF cannot accept saturated and muddy debris, and has the right to reject unacceptable loads. Haulers should allow material to dry after rain before hauling fire debris and ash.
- <u>Test for Moisture:</u> Perform a paint filter test to determine if material is too saturated for disposal. See how to run a paint filter test:

#### **Green Waste**

 Green waste cannot include logs greater than 6 feet long or 28 inches in diameter, pine needles, leaves, rocks, or dirt.

### Vehicle Weight

• All haulers must adhere to vehicle weights set by California Vehicle Code. California Highway Patrol regularly monitors vehicles disposing at the NRRWF.
