Butte County Right-of-Way Tree Removal

Hazard trees in the County right-of-way are assessed by a contract arborist and removed by a tree contractor if they pose a threat to the public right-of-way. The Department of Public Works manages the contract arborist and the tree removal contractors.

Zone Captain Questions

A group of local community members established a Zone Captain program to connect property owners by neighborhood. The group is following the Block Captain model used in Sonoma and Santa Rosa.

The goal is for a committed captain to establish their zone, which are based on the evacuations zones. The captain is a point person for information. See [County Zone Captains listed online](#).

Each week, the Zone Captain lead send questions to the County so she can gather answers and help inform residents. Each week, the update will include the current questions and answers.

1. How can lots be prioritized [for debris removal]?

The Town, County, and State worked together on priorities for debris removal. The County provides the debris operation a regular list of submitted building permits, so they know where people desire to rebuild. The State does not deploy to these sites immediately, one-by-one, but does take these into consideration when they are working in an area. This helps fire survivors who intend to rebuild be prioritized when possible.

Overall, the State aims to work as efficiently as possible by focusing in areas where may parcels are enrolled in the program. There are priorities to clean parcels where property owners had to move temporary housing units off the property until debris is cleared. There is also a focus on cleaning properties near sensitive sites, such as watersheds, schools, etc.

The County encourages property owners to submit building permits so the review process can begin, and the permit can be ready to issue when the property is certified clean of fire debris.

Property owners can always call the State Debris Removal Operation Center at 530.399.0434 to ask questions about the progress of the debris removal effort for their property.
