TRANSITIONAL SHELTERING ASSISTANCE

- As of COB 6/12/19: <u>46</u> households are checked in to the Transitional Sheltering Assistance (TSA) program with assistance being provided to <u>98</u> individuals in <u>21</u> participating hotels.
- <u>591</u> additional households, who were initially using the program as well, have since transitioned out of TSA to other housing solutions.
- TSA is scheduled end to July 9. Check out July 10.

HOUSING

Survivor Housing: Commercial Mobile Home Parks

Survivor families are finding temporary housing at <u>19</u> commercial parks throughout Northern California, where FEMA is currently leasing a total of <u>371</u> pads. As of June 13th, <u>297</u> families have moved in. This allows survivors to stay close to the homes they lost as they rebuild.

Housing Success: Moose Lodge

The first commercial park site *within the burn area* should be ready to license in survivors next week. The Moose Lodge in Paradise has contracted with FEMA and has made improvements in order to be able to make <u>14</u> travel trailer pads available to Camp Fire survivors.

Housing Success: Hegan & Aztec

Construction has begun on the temporary housing community at Hegan Lane & Aztec Drive in Chico! This site is 13 miles from Paradise and has a planned capacity of <u>82</u> pads for manufactured housing units.
