#### Survivor Housing: Commercial Mobile Home Parks

Survivor families are finding temporary housing at <u>19</u> commercial parks throughout Northern California, where FEMA is currently leasing a total of <u>372</u> pads. As of June 20<sup>th</sup>, <u>296</u> families have moved in. This allows survivors to stay close to the homes they lost as they rebuild.

## Housing Success: Tribal Partnership

Additional pad locations have been identified at Enterprise Rancheria and Rolling Hills RV Park to house Camp Fire survivors. Enterprise Rancheria has <u>11</u> pads for manufactured housing units and Rolling Hills has expanded to a total of <u>48</u> pads for travel trailers.

#### TRANSITIONAL SHELTERING ASSISTANCE

- As of COB 6/19/19: <u>43</u> households are checked in to the Transitional Sheltering Assistance (TSA) program with assistance being provided to <u>97</u> individuals in <u>21</u> participating hotels.
- 594 additional households, who were initially using the program as well, have since transitioned out of TSA to other housing solutions.
- TSA is scheduled end to July 9. Check out July 10.
