Survivor Housing: Commercial Mobile Home Parks

Survivor families are finding temporary housing at **19** commercial parks throughout Northern California, where FEMA is currently leasing a total of **372** pads. As of July 1st, **307** families have moved in. This allows survivors to stay close to the homes they lost as they rebuild.

Housing Success: Moose Lodge

The first group of temporary housing units has begun licensing in <u>within the burn scar</u>. **12** of the **15** travel trailers available for housing Camp Fire survivors at the Moose Lodge in Paradise have been licensed in as of July 1st allowing survivors the ability to stay close to the homes they have lost as they rebuild.

TRANSITIONAL SHELTERING ASSISTANCE

- As of COB 6/30/19: <u>41</u> households are checked in to the Transitional Sheltering Assistance (TSA) program with assistance being provided to <u>87</u> individuals in <u>21</u> participating hotels.
- 596 additional households, who were initially using the program as well, have since transitioned out of TSA to other housing solutions.
- TSA is scheduled end to July 9. Check out July 10.
