Survivor Housing: Commercial Mobile Home Parks

Survivor families are finding temporary housing at **19** commercial parks throughout Northern California, where FEMA is currently leasing a total of **358** pads. As of August 8th, **313** survivor households are housed in these commercial parks.

Housing Success: Gridley Industrial Park

As of August 8th, **70** survivor households are licensed into the recently completed temporary housing community in Gridley. At **400** planned pads, this site is the largest temporary housing community being constructed by FEMA. This site gives survivors the opportunity to move back to Butte County and closer to the communities of Paradise, Concow, and Magalia while rebuilding continues.
