Survivor Housing: Commercial Mobile Home Parks

Survivor families are finding temporary housing at **19** commercial parks throughout Northern California, where FEMA is currently leasing a total of **358** pads. As of August 19th, **277** survivor households are housed in these commercial parks.

Housing Success: Hegan & Aztec

Construction is complete at the fourth and final temporary housing community to house Camp Fire survivor households during their recovery process. This site is located at the intersection of Hegan Lane and Aztec Drive in Chico and has the capacity to house **83** households in manufactured housing units. Licensing into the site should begin by the end of the week of August 19th.

TRANSITIONAL SHELTERING ASSISTANCE

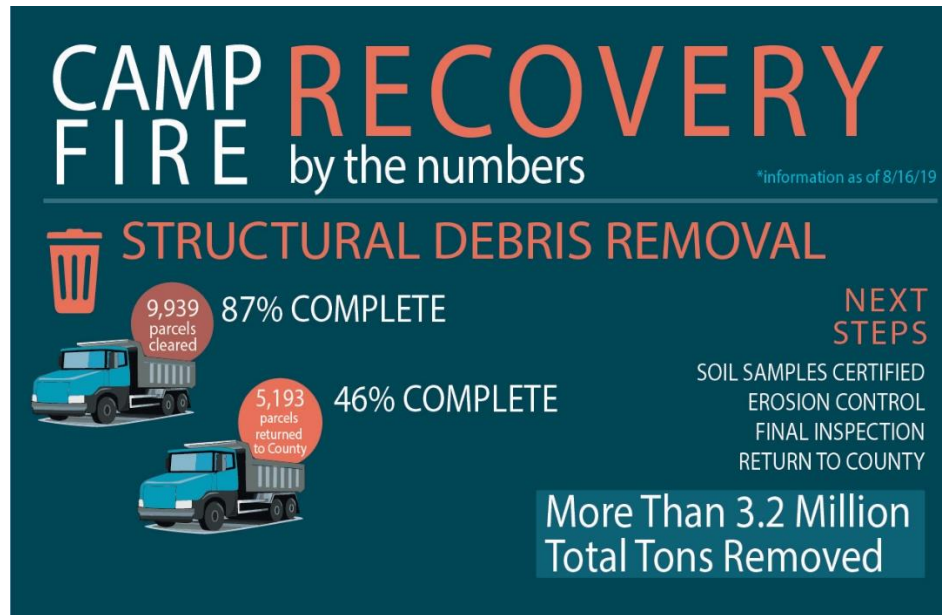
