Survivor Housing: Commercial Mobile Home Parks

Survivor families are finding temporary housing at <u>19</u> commercial parks throughout Northern California, where FEMA is currently leasing a total of <u>358</u> pads. As of August 26th, <u>261</u> survivor households are housed in these commercial parks.

Housing Success: Hegan & Aztec

As of August 26th, **42** of the **83** manufactured housing units installed at the newly completed temporary housing community located at the intersection of Hegan Lane and Aztec Drive in Chico have been licensed-in. This is the fourth, and final, site to be developed by FEMA to house Camp Fire survivor households as they continue their recovery process.

TRANSITIONAL SHELTERING ASSISTANCE


