**Q:** Is there any information on activities in the CA legislature working to curtail insurance companies from cutting off insurance or raising insurance rates?

**A:** The California Department of Insurance is charged with overseeing insurance companies in the State of California. California Insurance Commissioner Ricardo Lara and his staff have been closely involved with recovery efforts since the Camp Fire. **Q:** Any update on trees?

**A:** The Town is still waiting on Cal OES and FEMA to respond to our proposal for a program to remove trees on private property. We have received some favorable indications, but details of the program have not been worked out. As soon as we have information, we will announce the program publicly along with what residents need to do to participate.
