Survivor Housing: Commercial Mobile Home Parks

As of September 11th, there are 195 survivor families finding temporary housing at <u>16</u> commercial parks throughout Northern California. <u>Six</u> of these sites are located within Butte County.

Housing Success

With all four FEMA temporary housing communities completed in Butte County, survivor households are quickly moving in and all survivors have moved out of the transitional sheltering program (TSA). The TSA program has ended and there are no households currently waiting for housing.

TOWN OF PARADISE

Over <u>100</u> building permit applications are in "plan check" with the Town of Paradise, and <u>186</u> permits have been issued. Expectations are optimistic that <u>500</u> permits will be issued by the end of the year.

Total enrollment for Paradise Unified School District (PUSD) is <u>1742</u> students (51% of pre-fire enrollment). Disaster experts predicted only 33% enrollment this year, so to have over 50% is a huge accomplishment and a testament to the commitment of staff and the community.
