As of September 18th, there are $\underline{158}$ survivor families finding temporary housing at $\underline{16}$ commercial parks throughout Northern California. \underline{Six} of these sites are located within Butte County.

Survivor households continue to move into Butte County temporary housing communities. The transitional sheltering assistance (TSA) program has ended and there are no qualified households currently waiting for housing.


