REGULAR MEETING

JUNE 8, 2020

CALL TO ORDER, MOMENT OF SILENCE, AND SALUTE TO THE FLAG: Chairman Cole called the June 8, 2020 Regular Meeting of the Board of Supervisors to order at 7:00 PM followed by a moment of silence and the salute to the flag. The Meeting was held remotely due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

ROLL CALL: Supervisors in attendance were Kevin Cole, Charlie Bauer, and Bernie Blystone. Also present was Secretary/Treasurer/Zoning Officer, Debra E. Merritt and Roadmaster, Dan Klapthor.

IDENTIFICATION OF RECORDING DEVICES: There were no recording devices identified.

PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD (AGENDA ITEMS AND OTHER MATTERS): There was no public participating in the meeting, therefore no comments were offered.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS: There were no comments from the Supervisors

PUBLIC REQUESTS BY PRIOR ARRANGEMENT: There were no requests made by prior arrangements.

BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS:

CAJA – There were no minutes received from CAJA. Mr. Bauer reported that CAJA had met, however there was nothing new to report.

ZONING/PLANNING -

SEWAGE - There was no report received from Peter Homchenko, Sewage Enforcement Officer.

PROJECTS AND UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Quote Award for Gravel. Quotes were requested for 3,618 tons of 2A Aggregate, tailgated to Kreitz and Henry Roads, in Cambridge Township at a rate of 650 tons per day. Quotes were received from the following: Hasbrouck Sand and Gravel, at a unit price of \$11.43 per/ton, totaling \$41,353.74; Hillside Stone, LLC, at a unit price of \$13.48 per/ton, totaling \$48,770.64; ACA Sand Gravel at a unit price of \$13.95 per/ton, totaling \$50,471.10; and, IA Construction, at a unit price of \$18.15 per/ton, totaling \$65,666.70.

Motion by Mr. Bauer to award the quote for 3,618 tons of 2A Aggregate, tailgated to Kreitz and Henry Roads, in Cambridge Township at a rate of 650 tons per day to Hasbrouck Sand and Gravel, at a unit price of \$11.43 per/ton, totaling \$41,353.74. Second by Mr. Blystone.

Further Discussion: Mr. Bauer questioned whether the Township could purchase more gravel since the price came in so low. Ms. Merritt stated that when we wanted to do the same thing last year, we were advised that we had to submit a new request for quotes. Mr. Klapthor stated that he would check with the Township's Municipal Services Representative, Troy Cyphert to determine whether that would be an option.

Adoption of Resolution No. 04 of 2020 - Amending the Personnel Policy.

NEW BUSINESS:

Ordinance to Amend the Township's Non-Uniform Pension Plan Administered by the Pennsylvania Municipal Retirement System. Ms. Merritt reported that the Township has been notified that it must amend its Non-Uniform Pension Plan administered by PMRS in accordance with Article IV of the Pennsylvania Municipal Retirement Law, 53 P.S. §881.101 et seq, which requires that plans confirm to IRS approved plan documents. Accordingly, an Ordinance must be passed amending the Township's Pension Plan. There are no substantive changes to the pension plan.

Motion by Mr. Bauer to authorize the Secretary/Treasurer to advertise Ordinance No. 01 of 2020, an Ordinance electing to amend its non-uniform pension plan administered by the Pennsylvania Municipal Retirement System pursuant to Article IV of the Pennsylvania Municipal Retirement Law, agreeing to be bound by all provisions of the Pennsylvania Municipal Retirement Law, as amended, and as applicable to member municipalities, for consideration at the July 13, 2020 Regular Meeting. Second by Mr. Blystone.

ROADMASTER'S REPORT: A written report was submitted by the Roadmaster. Mr. Bauer questioned whether the Township would be undertaking the paving previously discussed. He stated that there appeared to be some sections of Ellis Road where the road had washed away and wondered whether using the paver would be an option there. Mr. Klapthor stated that he was aware of those spots, however the paver was designed for somewhat larger areas, not for little spots. He stated that he was planning on cold patching those areas prior to the seal coating being done.
