

CONDITIONS OF RIGHT-OF-WAY PERMIT

Approval of a Right-of-Way permit is subject to the following conditions:

1. All work performed within the Public Right-of-Way shall be in conformance with the City of Carnation adopted Design and Construction Standards and Specifications.
2. Permittee shall provide barricades as necessary to insure public safety.
3. Permittee shall provide adequate temporary signage or manpower to regulate and direct the flow of traffic around the construction area.
4. Permittee shall indemnify and hold the City harmless in any liability suits nonjudgements that may arise as a result of said construction activities by completing attached Hold Harmless Agreement (see below).
5. A pre-construction conference may be required prior to commencing work.
6. Notification to Carnation Public Works shall be required forty-eight (48) hours prior to the start date. Call (425) 333- 4192.
7. Location of all utilities shall be the responsibility of the applicant prior to construction. Any necessary relocation of existing utilities will be done at the permittee's expense.
8. Final inspection is required by the Carnation Public Works Department or the City Engineer.
9. Failure to meet any of the above conditions of approval could result in a Stop Work Order or legal action.

HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT FOR RIGHT-OF-WAY PERMIT

In consideration of the granting of a Street Use permit for encroachments and attachments situated upon a public right-of-way, which is more particularly described in the Right-of Way application, the undersigned agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the City of Carnation, its appointed and elected officials and employees, from and against any and all liability, loss, cost, damage and expenses, including costs and attorney fees in defense thereof, because of actions, claims or lawsuits for damages due to personal or bodily injury, including death at any time arising out of the attachment and encroachment permitted upon by that certain Right-of-way permit. This Hold Harmless Agreement shall not apply to negligence of the City of Carnation, its officials or employees.
