Dear Local Treasurer:

Please find enclosed a listing of properties in your city/township/village that were foreclosed upon pursuant to Public Act 123 1999. Under PA 123, your board may purchase any or all of these properties by paying the minimum bid prior to the public auction which will be held on <u>August 26, 2019</u>.

Properties purchased can only be used for public purpose. The Attorney General's office has concluded that Public Purpose generally means an activity that meets all of the following standards:

- 1. The activity will benefit the community as a body.
- 2. The activity is directly related to the functions of government. (i.e. parks, cemeteries, parking)
- 3. The activity does NOT have as its primary objective the benefit of a private interest.

If property purchased by a city, village, township, or county under this subsection is subsequently sold for an amount in excess of the minimum bid and all costs incurred relating to demolition, renovation, improvements, or infrastructure development, the excess amount shall be returned to the delinquent tax property sales proceeds account for the year in which the property was purchased by the city, village, township, or county.

If you are interested in purchasing any of the properties, please fill out the attached application so the property can be withheld from the auction. We will need to have your public board meeting minutes giving approval and payment by the first Tuesday in July.

If I do not hear from you by that date, I will assume you have no interest in the parcels and I will proceed with placing them in the public auction.

The office of the Kalamazoo County Treasurer has the following demo policy:

If there is a tax foreclosed parcel in your jurisdiction that meets one of the following criteria:

- 1. The property has been declared a public nuisance in accordance with a local housing, building, plumbing, fire, or other related code or ordinance.
- 2. The property is an attractive nuisance because of physical condition or use.
- 3. The property is a fire hazard or is otherwise dangerous to the safety of persons or property.
- 4. The property has had the utilities, plumbing, heating, or sewage disconnected, destroyed, removed or rendered ineffective for a period of 1 year or more so that the property is unfit for its intended use.
- 5. The property is improved real property that has remained vacant for 5 consecutive years and that is not maintained in accordance with applicable local housing or property maintenance codes or ordinances.
- The property has code violations posing a severe and immediate health or safety threat and has
 not been substantially rehabilitated within 1 year after the receipt of notice to rehabilitate from
 the appropriate code enforcement agency or final determination of any appeal, whichever is
 later.

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PURPOSE OF EXTREME TEMPERATURE & WEATHER POLICY AND PLAN

This plan establishes the role of Kalamazoo County Government during extreme temperature and weather emergencies.

This plan is also intended to provide guidance for local governments, non-governmental organizations, the private sector and faith-based organizations in the preparation of their extreme temperature or weather emergency response plans and other related activities in order to protect vulnerable populations.

I. PURPOSE

To protect the public's health during extreme cold and extreme heat events in Kalamazoo County.

To provide guidance when extreme weather occurs.

To initiate public information and media alerts and emergency response actions.

II. POLICY

Kalamazoo County Office of Emergency Management will work in cooperation with the Kalamazoo County Health and Community Services Department (KCHCSD), the American Red Cross, and Kalamazoo County Emergency Medical Services as well as the media for the purpose of coordinating timely and accurate messages to the public for their health and safety. These organizations along with other health care providers will be on alert during extreme cold and hot weather periods and take action as necessary to minimize exposure related illness and fatalities.

III. DEFINITIONS:

Extreme Cold weather conditions — colder than normal temperatures, especially when combined with wind; a situation that may lead to a dangerous condition that threatens the public's health and may result in cold related illness and/or fatality.

Extreme Heat weather conditions - higher than normal temperatures, especially when combined with high humidity; a situation that may lead to a dangerous heat index that threatens the public's health and may result in heat related illness and/or fatality.

Advisory, Watch, and Warning notification from the National Weather Service (NWS) -

- Wind Chill Watch: Be Prepared: NWS issues a wind chill watch when dangerously cold wind chill values are possible.
- Wind Chill Advisory Be Aware: NWS issues a wind chill advisory when seasonably cold wind chill values but not extremely cold values are expected or occurring.
- Wind Chill Warning: Take Action! NWS issues a wind chill warning when dangerously cold wind chill values are expected or occurring.

- Excessive Heat Watches—Be Prepared! Heat watches are issued when conditions are favorable for an excessive heat event in the next 24 to 72 hours. A Watch is used when the risk of a heat wave has increased but its occurrence and timing is still uncertain.
- Heat Advisory—Take Action! A Heat Advisory is issued within 12 hours of the onset of extremely dangerous heat conditions. A heat index of 100°F or higher is expected for a period of 3 hours or more. A heat advisory shall be continued through the overnight hours, following a day with excessive heat, if the heat index is not expected to fall below "around 75°F". A heat advisory can be issued for a heat index less than 100°F when the cumulative effect of successive days of near advisory heat leads to potentially life threatening conditions.
- Excessive Heat Warning—Take Action! A heat index of 105°F or higher is expected for a period of 3 hours or more. An excessive heat warning shall be continued through the overnight hours, following a day with excessive heat, if the heat index is not expected to fall below "around 75°F". An excessive heat warning can be issued for a heat index less than 105°F when the cumulative effect of successive days of near warning heat leads to life threatening conditions.

IV. PROCEDURE

- 1. Local jurisdictions will monitor vulnerable populations when the National Weather Service issues a heat or wind chill advisory, watch, or warning.
- 2. Local jurisdictions will advise Kalamazoo Co. Emergency Management of any actions being taken to prepare for an excessive heat or wind chill event.
- 3. When an Excessive Heat Warning or Wind Chill Warning is issued by the National Weather Service, Kalamazoo County Emergency Management will:
 - a. Notify:
 - i. Chief Law Enforcement Officers as designated in the Kalamazoo Co. Emergency Action Guidelines
 - ii. Kalamazoo County Health and Community Services Emergency Preparedness Coordinator
 - iii. Kalamazoo County Government Liaison, American Red Cross of Southwest Michigan; Disaster Program Manager, American Red Cross of Southwest Michigan
 - iv. 5" District Medical Response Coalition Emergency Preparedness Coordinator
- 4. During a heat related event, the KCHCSD "Extreme Temperature & Weather: Plan & Protocol" will be followed.
- During a wind chill event, local jurisdictions will identify and have available adequate response
 resources for any population identified that could be endangered. Designated facilities will be
 established and if necessary, the Red Cross can be consulted for sheltering standards and support
 equipment.
 - a. Media announcements can be made by the local jurisdiction advising of the location(s) of facilities.

- b. The possibility of making personal contact with transient/homeless individuals may be necessary due to their unavailability of media resources.
- 6. If local resources are in danger of becoming exhausted or a local jurisdictions request logistics support for preparedness activities, notification will be made to Kalamazoo Co. Emergency Management.
- 7. Kalamazoo Co. Emergency Management will monitor all local jurisdictional activities and resource requests. If necessary, the appropriate County Emergency Action Guidelines will be implemented. If needed, the Emergency Operations Center will be activated as appropriate for the level of resource requests and response support.
- 8. If a widespread power outage occurs during an extreme heat or cold event, local jurisdictions will notify Kalamazoo Co. Emergency Management, who will monitor the outage in cooperation with the local utility provider.
 - c. If the outage is projected to last over 4 hours during a designated heat or cold event, consultation will be made with the local jurisdiction representative if the County Emergency Action Plan should be enacted.

ROLE OF PUBLIC HEALTH

Kalamazoo County Health and Community Services (KCHCS) will work in cooperation with the Kalamazoo County Office of Emergency Management, the American Red Cross, and Kalamazoo County Emergency Medical Services as well as the media for the purpose of coordinating timely and accurate messages to the public for their health and safety. These organizations along with other health care providers will be on alert during times of extreme temperature or weather and take action as necessary to minimize any related illness and mitigate fatalities.

Emergency and disaster planning involves a coordinated, co-operative process of preparing to match urgent needs with available resources. Kalamazoo County Office of Emergency Management takes the lead in Kalamazoo County's unified efforts in response to emerging issues, emergencies, and disasters. The Sheriff's Office Written Directives specifies tasks and responsibilities adopted in their role in a multi-agency response to an emergency.

Based on historical data, various literature, and reports from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), KCHCS views the following as vulnerable populations:

- Individuals experiencing homelessness and temporarily displaced
- Individuals misusing drugs (heroin/methadone), alcohol, or other substances
- Economically disadvantaged individuals and those without home heating or air conditioning
- Elderly and youngchildren
- Individuals suffering from pre-existing heart conditions and diabetes
- Individuals suffering frommental health illness

DEFINITIONS FROM THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE

Extreme Cold Event – An Extreme Cold Event is a weather condition with excessively low temperatures or a combination of cold temperatures and wind that has the potential to cause cold-related illnesses or injuries. An extreme cold event is defined in hours, a day, or series of days when:

- The lowest expected temperature or wind chill is forecasted to be approximately 5 degrees Fahrenheit or lower
- Weather or environmental conditions are such that a high incidence of cold-related illnesses or injuries can reasonably be expected

Complex Cold Emergency – A Complex Cold Emergency is a condition of an Extreme Cold Event with complications requiring additional response. Examples of such complications are power outages, heavy precipitation (snow or ice), or an extended period of low temperatures combined with strong winds.

Wind Chill – Wind Chill, or the apparent temperature, is a measure of what the temperature actually feels like. Wind Chill is a factor of both the actual temperature and wind speed, and is the best indicator for a pending extreme cold event. Wind Chill is the key indicator of Extreme Cold defined by the National Weather Service.

Wind Chill Advisory – The National Weather Service (NWS) issues a Wind Chill Advisory when the wind chill could be life threatening if action is not taken. Wind Chill Advisories are issued when wind chill temperatures are forecast to fall below 0°F to below -10°F.

Wind Chill Watch – The NWS issues a Wind Chill Watch when there is the potential for wind chill to become life-threatening. Typically, these are issued 24 hours or more in advance for community planning purposes. Wind Chill Warnings are issued when wind chill temperatures are forecast to fall below -11°F to below -14°F.

Wind Chill Warning — The NWS issues a Wind Chill Warning when the wind chill is life threatening. Wind Chill Warnings are issued when wind chill temperatures are forecast to fall below -15°F to below -25°F.

Excessive Heat Outlook: issued when the potential exists for an excessive heat event in the next 3-7 days, looks at a combination of temperature and humidity over those days. An Outlook provides information to those who need considerable lead time to prepare for the event, such as public utility staff, emergency managers, and public health officials. See the <u>mean heat index and probability forecasts</u> maps.

Excessive Heat Advisory: A heat index of 100°F or higher is expected for a period of 3 hours or more. A heat advisory shall be continued through the overnight hours, following a day with excessive heat, if the heat index is not expected to fall below "around 75°F". A heat advisory can be issued for a heat index less than 100°F when the cumulative effect of successive days of near advisory heat leads to potentially life threatening conditions.

Excessive Heat Watches: issued when conditions are favorable for an excessive heat event (heat indices in excess of 105°F during the day combined with nighttime low temperatures of 80°F or higher) in the next 24 to 72 hours. A Watch is used when the risk of a heat wave has increased but its occurrence and timing is still uncertain. A Watch provides enough lead time so that those who need to prepare can do so.

Excessive Heat Warning are issued when an excessive heat event is occurring, imminent or is expected with a very high probability of occurring in the next 36 hours. An excessive heat event is defined as a heat index of at least 105°F for more than 3 hours per day, or a heat index more than 115°F for any period of time. The warning is used for conditions posing a threat to life or property.

COMMUNICATIONS

The Office of Emergency Management will monitor the weather and be the lead agency in notifying KCHCS, Kalamazoo County Government – Administration Office, and respective partners. The following outlines when communication response activities may take place for Extreme Cold or Excessive Heat weather, and the notification and activation protocol.

EXTREME COLD

The Extreme Temperature and Weather Plan for **EXTREME COLD** is in effect each year between **November 15** and **April 15**. During this time period, The Extreme Temperature and Weather Plan may be instituted when:

- > Temperature of 5°F or colder or wind chill of 0°F or colder in the next 24 hours.
- > Other conditions (i.e. strong winds, forecasted precipitation for more than two hours, an extended period of cold, and sudden cold after a warm period) deemed to be severe enough to present a substantial threat to the life or health of vulnerable citizens.
- The issuance of a Wind Chill Advisory, Watch, or Warning by the NWS.

EXCESSIVE HEAT

The Extreme Temperature and Weather Plan for **EXCESSIVE HEAT** is in effect each year between **May 15 and September 15**. During this time period, The Extreme Temperature and Weather Plan may be instituted when:

- ➤ Heat indices in excess of 105°F during the day combined with nighttime low temperatures of 75°F or higher are forecast to occur for two consecutive days.
- > Other conditions, Hazardous Weather Outlook or Excessive Heat is possible within the next 3 to 5 days.
- The issuance of a Heat Advisory, Watch, or Warning by the NWS.

Messaging will occur when wind chill temperatures are forecasted to fall below -15°F to below -25°F or a Complex Cold Emergency has been issued.

Messaging will occur when:

- An Excessive Heat Warning is issued
- An Excessive Heat Event is occurring, imminent or is expected with a very high probability of occurring in the next 36 hours.
- The heat index is forecasted to be at, no less than 105°F for more than three hours per day
- The heat index is more than 115°F for any period of time.

See Excessive Heat Warning definition for additional examples of when messaging should occur.

Notification & Activation Protocol

The Office of Emergency Management (OEM) will monitor the weather and notify the appropriate staff based on the Level of the event. It is the responsibility of KCHCS Emergency Preparedness Coordinator (or their designee) to monitor the weather, communicate with OEM on a potential activation, notify KCHCS staff, and ensure the implementation of KHCS's protocol based on the Level of the event.

SHELTERS & CENTERS

Shelters and Missions in Kalamazoo County are open throughout the year providing meals, sleeping quarters, and respite for those seeking services. On days when the Extreme Temperature and Weather plan is activated, the County endorses the efforts of local municipalities and existing organizations to extend services and hours of operation in order to allow clients the option of remaining indoors during the day.

Warming & Cooling Centers are independently managed facilities that are made available during the day throughout extreme temperature conditions when normal coping mechanisms are ineffective or unavailable. These facilities are given the task of gathering the information needed for potential overnight operation, in order that a data driven decision can be made. If the need is such they will move to Partner-Managed Shelters which can be open for an overnight stay and then closed during the day, or can be open continuously as needed.

These shelters would include facilities that have been vetted by the American Red Cross (and fall on our shelter list), American Red Cross trained volunteers would support the shelter, and locations who self-identify or have been pre-identified. These facilities will also have the opportunity to receive Human and Material Resources (pending the overall situation). These shelters will provide the opportunity for the Red Cross to maintain its readiness for a larger Mass Care response (Apartment Fire, Vehicle Incident, Power Outage, etc.), and open Red Cross Managed Shelters.

The operation of Centers, especially during Extreme Temperature and Weather, will be coordinated with Kalamazoo County Office of Emergency Management, the American Red Cross, and Kalamazoo County Emergency Medical Services along with the municipality where the Centers are to be opened in order to:

- Ensure a Center is meeting all applicable laws and regulations;
- Avoid a duplication of efforts of other agencies/organizations;
- Obtain support from a broader system if the need exceed the operator's capabilities (e.g., transition to an overnight shelter);
- Maintain situational awareness (knowing what is going on with all aspects of the weather and temperature) so that operators can make informed decisions.

For more information of the American Red Cross Sheltering Standards and Procedures, see Appendix A.

Centers are not overnight shelters. A Center is designed for non-continuous (non-24/7) operation. If a heat or cold-related emergency persists or is predicted to persist beyond the operational hours of the Center, or it is unsafe for individuals to return to their dwellings, an Independent Shelter may need to be opened.

Before an emergency occurs, Center operators should discuss the logistical and legal considerations involved in operating a center with legal counsel and the American Red Cross.

Independent Shelters

Independent Update: For those Independent Shelters, we are still in the process of completing these Facility Agreements and Shelter Surveys, and we have Shelter Training scheduled with these organizations on Saturday, June 22, 2019. They will be appearing on the Red Cross Disaster Shelter list once the Facility Agreements are complete.

Shelter Evaluations

If a private/faith based shelter or center is established in Kalamazoo County, the Kalamazoo County Health & Community Services Department's Environmental Health and Personal Health Divisions will be notified and will contact the establishing entity to determine the projected time of opening, the expected number of people, and the duration of operation. Based on this information the following actions may take place:

- Shelter/Center inspection
- 2. Food safety assessment
- 3. Provision of WIC and immunization services

In the event that a heat or cold-related emergency persists, a center that choses to transition into a shelter, will be provided with the appropriate guidelines on how to complete an environmental health evaluation. See Appendix B. These centers and shelters will also be provided with information pertaining to the prevention of communicable diseases. See Appendix C.

Depending on the nature and severity of the event, the following may occur under the authority of the Health Officer/Director or their designee at an opened shelter.

Public Health Surveillance

Communicable disease and injury surveillance is conducted as needed, depending upon the nature and severity of the event. As a part of any operational period inspection a health and medical section is completed ensuring that any diseases or injuries have been reported at the site. If the situation warrants and a shelter is to be opened the Supervising Epidemiologist (Epi) or a designee will educate the shelter manager on reportable communicable diseases, provide them with the list of reportable diseases, and the phone number for the health department to report any disease that may arise in the shelter. The shelter director or designee will report any outbreak of disease, reportable or not, to either the Communicable Disease/Epi unit or the shelter inspector. The Communicable Disease/Epi unit in conjunction with the Environmental Health Division will perform an investigation if warranted.

Preventative Health Services

Depending on the event's scope and duration, additional health services may be provided at the shelter/center such as WIC and immunizations upon request by the American Red Cross of Southwest Michigan Disaster Program Manager or his/her designee. A KCHCS employee will visit the shelter to provide the services as needed.

AMERICAN RED CROSS DURING EXTREME WINTER WEATHER

Purpose

To clarify roles and responsibilities of the American Red Cross regarding responses to severe winter weather including the operations of warming centers and cold weather centers.

Background

During the winter months, local communities often turn to the Red Cross to respond to needs created by severe weather emergencies. When these emergencies occur, the Red Cross will maintain communication and coordination with community leadership and partners to find solutions to meet these community needs. Since each community has different resources, it requires local judgment to determine what resources and services the Red Cross should provide during these times.

All Red Cross support will be guided by Red Cross Leadership at the region (state) level, and take into account the best way to resource materials and volunteer support throughout the state, with a focus on Blizzards/ Ice Storms, Electric Power Outages, and Excessive Cold.

Blizzards/Ice Storms

When a community is affected by a blizzard or ice storm that strands travelers, cuts food supplies to the homebound, cause's structural damage, and/or creates other typical disaster impacts, the Red Cross region will account for available need and resources, and respond with mass care services in coordination with county and state Emergency Management.

Electric Power Outages

A power outage is defined as the sustained loss of electric power to a consumer. Red Cross chapters in coordination with the Red Cross region may participate in coordinated community action to deal with such situations. The Red Cross region will account for available need and resources, and respond with mass care services in coordination with county and state Emergency Management.

Excessive Cold

Prolonged periods of extreme cold may pose significant problems to a community. As with other community emergencies, the Red Cross region should coordinate with Emergency Management entities to determine the most appropriate response to address a particular need. As needs arise, the Red Cross chapter will coordinate with the Red Cross region to account for available need and resources, and respond with mass care services in coordination with county and state Emergency Management.

Warming Centers and Independent Shelters opened by community partners intended to serve the pre-existing homeless populations affected by extreme cold can be supported with materials and volunteer guidance. This should be provided only if this does not affect the Red Cross chapter or region from responding to potential Blizzard/ Ice Storm or Electric Power Outage incidents.

Expenses related to frozen or burst pipes in homes as a result of severe winter weather are generally not covered and do not qualify individuals and families for lodging and/or financial assistance. Assistance should be provided through community referrals, as appropriate.

Change in Housing Units 2000-2010




This map shows the percent change in housing units from the 2000 to 2010 period. Which areas gained or lost significant numbers of housing units? Source: U.S. Census Bureau






New Construction Was Absent for Several Years





US National Mover Rate by Age Group (2016-2017)




Occupation of Rented or Owned Dwellings






Median Wage and Median Housing Indices






Many Home Owners Pay Too Much for Housing

Percent of Households that Spend More than 30% of Gross Income on Housing - 2015




Low Income Housing Tax Credit Properties



This U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development web map displays Low Income Housing Tax Credit properties in the United States


% RenterOccupiedUnits



Item 1 CALL TO ORDER

Supervisor Martin called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

Item 2 PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Trustee Strebs led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Item 3 ROLL CALL OF BOARD MEMBERS

All present.

<u>Item 4</u> <u>ADDITIONS AND DELETIONS TO AGENDA</u>

None.

<u>Item 5</u> <u>PUBLIC COMMENT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS</u>

David Benac, 1410 Henderson, spoke against opting out of commercial recreational marihuana. Adam Tucker, representing 2233 N. Burdick, said we are invited to visit his business next Monday around 5 pm. He said that their businesses will provide an estimated 150 to 200 jobs.

Item 6 CONSENT AGENDA

Clerk Miller moved, seconded by Trustee Strebs, to approve the consent agenda which included action on the following items:

Item 7 PUBLIC HEARINGS

<u>Item 7A Kalsec Industrial Facilities Tax Exemption Application</u>

Supervisor Martin opened the public hearing at 7:37 pm.

Jim Justice, on behalf of Kalsec, stated that they are asking for exemption on \$4.5 million investment. Since the last tax exemption the Township granted, they have added 50 jobs. Kalsec employs about 300 people locally. Clerk Miller and Trustee Hathcock asked questions about the details of the exemption, which were answered by Manager Mitchell and Attorney Seeber. Trustee Strebs asked about the jobs protected by the previous exemption. Mr. Justice answered that the number of jobs promised to be protected is 50. Trustee Leuty asked about

vertical integration, whether the implication was that research and production could be concentrated here. Mr. Justice replied that this was certainly the intent. Treasurer Miller thanked Kalsec through Mr. Justice for the continued investment in the Township. Trustee Leigh pointed out that the purpose was to bring more jobs to the community. Trustee Strebs asked what happens if Kalsec does not meet the expectations set forth in the agreement. Attorney Seth Koches answered that Kalsec will provide an annual report about jobs retained. An Industrial Facilities Tax (IFT) can be revoked if agreements are not fulfilled.

Supervisor Martin closed the public hearing at 7:43 pm.

Item 8 UNFINISHED BUSINESS

None at this meeting.

Item 9 NEW BUSINESS

Item 9A REQUEST TO APPROVE KALSEC INDUSTRIAL FACILITIES TAX

EXEMPTION APPLICATION

Treasurer Miller moved, seconded by Trustee Leigh, to approve the Kalsec Industrial Facilities Tax Exemption Application by adopting the Resolution. Roll call vote, 6-1 (Trustee Hathcock). Motion carried.

Item 9B REQUEST TO ACCEPT RECREATIONAL MARIHUANA FACILITIES OPT-OUT ORDINANCE FOR FIRST READING

Manager Mitchell pointed out that this applies to the commercial aspects of recreational marihuana only. We are opting out but moving forward with Planning Commission consideration of zoning to allow approval of recreational marihuana facilities.

Attorney Seeber stated that the Planning Commission is not ready to hold a public hearing.

Clerk Miller moved, seconded by Trustee Leigh, to accept the proposed Recreational Marihuana Facilities Opt-Out Ordinance for first reading.

Clerk Miller stated that we all realized when dealing with medical marihuana that recreational was on the way, but that the current law has some unclear aspects that need to be worked out before we can proceed. He is eager to expand to recreational when feasible.

Trustee Hathcock expressed the opinion that most people voted in favor of recreational marihuana, and the current ordinance allows us to back away.

Trustee Leigh agrees with the ordinance because state is putting the onus on municipalities, and it will not stop us from opting in later. We have one of the experts in Michigan marihuana law working for the Township's law firm.

Trustee Strebs pointed out we had an in-depth discussion at our last work session. She agrees with taking a thoughtful review of the situation.

Trustee Leuty said that we are a thoughtful board, and if the state does not get their act together, it automatically falls to us to do all the work of approval.

Treasurer Miller asked our attorney when the state will accept recreational applications. Attorney Seeber answered that the state is supposed to have the rules in place by December of this year. Treasurer Miller said it will take the state a while, this gives us a little bit of time.

Trustee Hathcock again expressed his disapproval.

Roll call vote, 6-1 (Trustee Hathcock), motion carried.

Item 9C REQUEST TO APPROVE FIRE CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF PARCHMENT AND CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF KALAMAZOO

Supervisor Martin spoke to proposed contract extension and moved to approve the contract extension for six months, at \$3,500 per month, seconded by Trustee Leuty.

Trustee Leuty stated he sees no negative aspect, Parchment is safer, and so are we. Trustee Leigh agreed. Manager Mitchell commented that the contract also provides them a battalion chief.

Motion carried.

Item 9D REQUEST FOR PERMISSION TO ENTER INTO NEGOTIATIONS FOR NEW CONTRACT FOR MANAGEMENT OF GRAND PRAIRIE GOLF COURSE

Manager Mitchell explained that the Golf Course has been managed by the same couple since 1991. The wife has not taken a payment for the last three years. Some positive aspects are a partnership with WMU and the junior golf program. He explained the revenue and expense report.

Supervisor Martin commented that maintenance has been costly in recent years.

Trustee Leigh commented that we have not received financials from the golf course. She agrees with waiving the 15% for 2019 and working on a new contract.

Clerk Miller agreed with developing a long-term plan, in that the current team will want to retire at some time, and if it becomes a Township park it will cost a lot more.

Trustee Strebs echoed the concern about lack of financials and an audit. She expressed the hope that it could be advertised on social media.

Treasurer Miller suggested postponing the vote on the proposal. The Township has made many expenditures for the golf course.

Trustee Leigh commented that \$140,000 balance previously mentioned is capital, not cash.

Trustee Leuty thanked Ann Marie and Jim for their efforts. He is comfortable forgoing the 15% for this year.

Clerk Miller moved, seconded by Supervisor Martin, to suspend the Grand Prairie Golf Course 15% fee for 2019, and authorize the Manager to negotiate a new contract not to exceed 36 months.

Manager Mitchell asked whether anyone had any concerns adding alcohol to the golf course.

Trustee Leigh had liability concerns.

Trustee Hathcock agreed with selling alcohol.

Treasurer Miller supports the golf course, but does favor voting before we have more information.

Motion carried.

Item 10 ITEMS REMOVED FROM CONSENT AGENDA

There were no items removed from the Consent Agenda.

Item 11 BOARD MEMBER REPORTS

Trustee Strebs reported on the Memorial Day parade in Kalamazoo, and her sympathies and gratitude for those who lost their lives.

Trustee Hathcock said the Planning Commission will work towards resolving issues concerning marihuana facilities.

Trustee Leigh attended an advisory committee for the CCTA, dealing with Metro Connect. She has been bothered by many things that are happening in this country. A rally in front of City Hall protesting anti-abortion laws was held last week. She discussed a recent Supreme Court ruling on abortion. She will be speaking on national issues at our meetings.

Clerk Miller has been working on re-codifying our ordinances. He attended the ISAAC Banquet on May 18. He invited Board members to an ISAAC Housing Task Force workshop "Healing Through Exploring Local History of Racism and Segregation" on June 13, 2019. He has been discussing an amendment to our Non-Discrimination Ordinance dealing with source of income.

Treasurer Miller invited people to an open house for the Eastwood Gateway project, at 4 to 6 pm tomorrow, 1519 E Michigan.

Trustee Leuty shared that the Zoning Board of Appeals met to consider a request for a variance from a 500 foot buffer to 150 feet for a medical marihuana business. It was denied. The Fire Department report is available under Documents/Board packet. Patrick Hudson and Trustee Leuty will be meeting to plan for a new Recreation Plan. He looked through the KABA documents to find that nine houses since March 2015 have installed solar panels. He quoted Jefferson: "The biggest threat to democracy is an uneducated electorate."

Supervisor Martin said that the Fire Department has been extremely busy. Five-inch hose is being tested. The lights in the Board Room are new LEDs. He mentioned our video person, Ursula Mayr's awards from WMU for creating videos for the Spanish Dept.

Item 12 ATTORNEY'S REPORT

Attorney Koches is here to get signatures on the IFT.

She said that we have Jim and Ann-Marie Roscheck - they should be a draw to golf at Grand Prairie.

Item 13 MANAGER REPORT

Talons-Out flight will be happening this weekend. HVAC is being installed. Northside Ministerial Alliance had its last meeting before a summer break. The Township has been approached by persons interested in marihuana micro-businesses. We are working on first right of refusal for foreclosed properties.

<u>Item 14</u> <u>PUBLIC COMMENTS</u>

There were no public comments.

Item 15 ADJOURNMENT

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 9:23 p.m.



OVERSIGHT (METRO) ACT 2002, PA 48 PAYMENTS

BACKGROUND

Under the METRO ACT of 2002, PA 48, the Authority has the exclusive power to assess fees on telecommunication providers owning telecommunication facilities in public rights-of-way located within one or more cities, villages, or townships located, in whole or in part, within a county having a population of 10,000 or more or a city, village, or township that enacts an ordinance or resolution electing to be classified as part of a metropolitan area under the METRO Act.

Telecommunications providers are required to pay an annual maintenance fee under section 8 of the METRO Act by April 29 each year. The Local Community Stabilization Authority is required to disburse the annual maintenance fee to each eligible municipality on or before May 31 each year.

POLICY FOCUS

Funds accumulated as a result of METRO Act payments to the Township from 2003 onwards should be used for the maintenance and construction of public right-of-way's throughout the Township. Public right-of-way means the area on, below, or above a public roadway, highway, street, alley, easement, or waterway. Public right-of-way does not include a federal, state, or private right-of-way.

The Township has established a Street & Sidewalk Maintenance department (446) in the General Fund to assign costs related to the maintenance of Township streets and sidewalks. The budgeted expenditures represent a 50% match of the local roads PAR funds that are allocated to the Township by the Kalamazoo County Road Commission (KCRC)

Commission (KCRC).
The mission of Kalamazoo Township is to provide government services that promote a safe, healthy, accessible, and

economically viable community to live, work, learn and play.

FISCAL IMPACT

A decrease to the Street Improvement fund balance of \$162,450.02, which represents \$155,122.07 of METRO Act payments received from 2003 onwards and accumulated interest of \$7,327.95. An increase to the General fund balance of \$162,450.02 to offset the costs for the Township's portion of the Street and Sidewalk maintenance expenditures for the past 15 years.

All future METRO Act payments will be recorded in the General fund under account number 101.000.671.00.

METROPOLITAN EXTENSION TELECOMMUNICATIONS RIGHTS-OF-WAY OVERSIGHT ACT (EXCERPT) Act 48 of 2002

484.3101 Short title; purpose of act.

- Sec. 1. (1) This act shall be known and may be cited as the "metropolitan extension telecommunications rights-of-way oversight act".
 - (2) The purpose of this act is to do all of the following:
- (a) Encourage competition in the availability, prices, terms, and other conditions of providing telecommunication services.
- (b) Encourage the introduction of new services, the entry of new providers, the development of new technologies, and increase investment in the telecommunication infrastructure in this state.
 - (c) Improve the opportunities for economic development and the delivery of telecommunication services.
- (d) Streamline the process for authorizing access to and use of public rights-of-way by telecommunication providers.
- (e) Ensure the reasonable control and management of public rights-of-way by municipalities within this state.
- (f) Provide for a common public rights-of-way maintenance fee applicable to telecommunication providers.
 - (g) Ensure effective review and disposition of disputes under this act.
- (h) Allow for a tax credit as the sole means by which providers can recover the costs under this act and to insure that the providers do not pass these costs on to the end-users of this state through rates and charges for telecommunication services.
 - (i) Promote the public health, safety, welfare, convenience, and prosperity of this state.
 - (j) Create an authority to coordinate public right-of-way matters with municipalities.

RECREATIONAL MARIJUANA ESTABLISHMENTS OPT OUT ORDINANCE

An ordinance to provide a title for the ordinance; to define words; to opt out of the operation of recreational marijuana establishments in Kalamazoo Township pursuant to requirements of Initiated Law 1 of 2018, MCL 333.27951 *et seq.*, as may be amended; to provide penalties for violation of this ordinance; to provide for severability; to repeal all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict therewith and to provide an effective date.

THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF KALAMAZOO KALAMAZOO COUNTY, MICHIGAN

ORDAINS:

SECTION I TITLE

This ordinance shall be known as and may be cited as the Kalamazoo Township Recreational Marijuana Establishments Opt Out Ordinance.

SECTION II DEFINITIONS

Words used herein shall have the definitions as provided for in Initiated Law 1 of 2018, MCL 333.27951 *et seq.*, as may be amended.

SECTION III NO AUTHORIZED RECREATIONAL MARIJUANA ESTABLISHMENTS

Kalamazoo Township does not permit recreational marijuana establishments to operate within the township, and pursuant to the requirements of Initiated Law 1 of 2018, MCL 222.27951 *et seq.*, as may be amended, and the Rules promulgated thereunder, hereby prohibits all recreational marijuana facilities and establishments within the boundaries of Kalamazoo Township.

SECTION IV VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES

1. Any person, firm, corporation or other entity who disobeys neglects or refuses to comply with any provision of this ordinance or who causes allows or consents to any of the same shall be deemed to be responsible for the violation of this ordinance. Any person, firm, corporation or other

entity who establishes a recreational marijuana facility in Kalamazoo Township shall be deemed to be in violation of this ordinance. A violation of this ordinance is deemed to be a nuisance per se.

- 2. A violation of this ordinance is a municipal civil infraction, for which the fines shall not be less than \$100 nor more than \$500, in the discretion of the Court. The foregoing sanctions shall be in addition to the rights of the Township to proceed at law or equity with other appropriate and proper remedies. Additionally, the violator shall pay costs which may include all expenses, direct and indirect, which the Township incurs in connection with the municipal civil infraction.
 - 3. Each day during which any violation continues shall be deemed a separate offense.
- 4. In addition, the Township may seek injunctive relief against persons alleged to be in violation of this ordinance, and such other relief as may be provided by law.
- 5. This ordinance shall be administered and enforced by the Zoning Administrator or Ordinance Enforcement Officer of the Township or by such other person (s) as designated by the Township Board from time to time.

SECTION V SEVERABLITY

The provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable. If any clause, sentence, word, section or provision is hereafter declared void or unenforceable for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect the remainder of such ordinance which shall continue in full force and effect. The provisions herein shall be construed as not interfering or conflicting with the statutory regulations for licensing marijuana establishments pursuant to Initiated Law 1 of 2018, as may be amended.

SECTION VI REPEAL

All ordinance or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Computer Information

The Township of Kalamazoo Police Department (TKPD) currently utilizes computers in our patrol cars to carry out a variety of functions. These computers are used to access computer-aided dispatch, records management systems, Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN), electronic ticketing, and more. Our current in-car computers are over five years old and out of warranty. Several of them are in need of frequent repair and are often inoperable. In order to have full operability and continuity, it was determined the best course was to replace computers across the entire fleet.

While looking at available options it was found that the most economical option that also fit our needs was a ruggedized laptop computer. When looking at ruggedized laptops there are three major manufacturers: Getac, Dell, and Panasonic. We determined Getac to be the best economic and organizational option.

In checking with authorized vendors, CDW-G and Tele-Rad, the best price for both the computer and warranty was from Tele-Rad (quotes attached). Along with cost benefits, Tele-Rad is also a Michigan company.

Printer Information

The Township of Kalamazoo Police Department (TKPD) currently utilizes a web-based citation program for issuance, tracking, and court reporting. This application utilizes patrol in-car printers for distribution of citations and other court summons. Several of our current printers are inoperable and in need of replacement. Additionally, our current printers are all various ages, conditions and use dissimilar paper. In order to have full operability and continuity, we determined our best course was to replace the printers across the fleet.

After reviewing our printing options the most economical in-car printers that meet our need are made by Printek. Each Printek VP420 printer costs \$605, which includes cabling and a mounting solution. Our current printers are Brother RJ4030 printers. The current cost for these printers without cabling or a mounting solution is over \$1,000.

In addition to the cost benefits of the Printek printers, Printek is also a Michigan company, based out of St. Joseph. This allows for an expedited response should we encounter a need for any warranty work, troubleshooting or repairs.

RESOLUTION ENDORSING THE DECLARATION OF A CLIMATE EMERGENCY AND REQUESTING REGIONAL COLLABORATION ON AN IMMEDIATE JUST TRANSITION AND MOBILIZATION EFFORT TO RESTORE A SAFE CLIMATE

WHEREAS, in April 2016 world leaders from 175 countries recognized the threat of climate change and the urgent need to combat it by signing the Paris Agreement, agreeing to keep warming "well below 2°C above pre-industrial levels" and to "pursue efforts to limit the temperature increase to 1.5°C";

WHEREAS, the destruction already wrought by global warming of approximately 1°C demonstrate that the Earth is already too hot for safety and justice as attested by increased and intensifying wildfires, floods, rising seas, diseases, droughts and extreme weather;

WHEREAS, climate change and the global economy's overshoot of ecological limits are driving the sixth mass extinction of species, as referenced in the UN's Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services;

WHEREAS, the United States of America has disproportionately contributed to the climate and ecological crises;

WHEREAS, restoring a safe and stable climate requires an emergency mobilization on a scale not seen since World War II, to reach zero greenhouse gas emissions across all sectors and to rapidly and safely drawdown or remove all the excess carbon from the atmosphere;

WHEREAS, the term "Just Transition" is a framework for a fair shift to an economy that is ecologically sustainable, equitable and just for all its members;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Charter Township of Kalamazoo commits to a just transition and climate mobilization effort to reverse global warming, which, with appropriate financial and regulatory assistance from the County of Kalamazoo and State and Federal authorities, ends local greenhouse gas emissions as quickly as possible preferably no later than 2030;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Charter Township of Kalamazoo commits to educating our residents about the climate emergency and working to catalyze a just transition and climate mobilization effort at the local, state, national, and global levels to provide maximum protection for our residents as well as all the people and species of the world;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Charter Township of Kalamazoo underscores the need for full community participation, inclusion, and support;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Charter Township of Kalamazoo commits to keeping the concerns of vulnerable communities central to all just transition and climate mobilization effort planning processes and to inviting and encouraging such communities to actively participate in order to advocate directly for their needs;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Charter Township of Kalamazoo joins a national call for a regional just transition and climate mobilization collaborative effort focused on transforming our region and rapidly catalyzing a mobilization at all levels of government to restore a safe climate; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Charter Township of Kalamazoo calls on the State of Michigan, the United States of America, and all governments and peoples worldwide to initiate a just transition and climate mobilization effort to reverse global warming to restore near preindustrial global average temperatures and greenhouse gas concentrations by halting the development of all new fossil fuel infrastructure and by rapidly phasing out all fossil fuels and the technologies which rely upon them; while encouraging efforts to safely draw down carbon from the atmosphere, and creating high-quality, good-paying jobs with comprehensive benefits for those who will be impacted by this transition.

A PROCLAMATION to declare the month of June 2019 to be Elder Abuse Prevention Month and encourage all community members to recognize and act to prevent elder abuse.

WHEREAS, our elders deserve our respect and gratitude for their humanity, experience, and ongoing contributions to the Charter Township of Kalamazoo. Our valued elders are an integral part of our community identity in many ways as they teach and preserve customs from many diverse backgrounds; and

WHEREAS, elder abuse refers to the intentional or negligent acts by a caregiver or trusted individual that causes harm to a vulnerable elder. Elder abuse can take many forms including: financial exploitation, physical abuse, neglect by a caregiver, verbal and emotional abuse, sexual abuse, or forced isolation; and

WHEREAS, elders are more likely to suffer from abuse when they have certain risk factors such as: social isolation or withdrawal, poor physical health, dementia, or mental health or substance abuse issues; and

WHEREAS, caregivers are more likely to perpetrate elder abuse when they have certain risk factors such as; mental health or substance abuse issues, a history of childhood trauma or conflict with the older person, social stresses such as marital conflict, unemployment, or economic problems, a lack of understanding of the older person's disease, or when they have little support from community and family members; and

WHEREAS, elder abuse can happen to anyone and can occur anywhere - in a person's own home, in nursing homes or assisted living facilities, even in hospitals. In America, it affects hundreds of thousands of elders across all socioeconomic groups, cultures, and races. More than two-thirds of elder abuse perpetrators are family members. The National Council on Aging estimates that 1 in 10 Americans over the age of 60 have experienced some form of elder abuse with only 1 in 14 of those cases of abuse reported to authorities; and

WHEREAS, elder abuse is grossly underreported because the elders who are being abused find it very difficult to tell anyone and are often ashamed or afraid; and

WHEREAS, all Kalamazoo Charter Township residents have an ethical responsibility to report suspicions of elder abuse to the statewide abuse hotline at 1-855-444-3911; and

THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that the Kalamazoo Charter Township Board of Trustees hereby declares that June 2019 is Elder Abuse Prevention Month in the Charter Township of Kalamazoo and encourages all residents to honor their elders and to report all known or suspected instances of elder abuse.
