Monday, August 10, 2020

The Board of Trustees of the *Charter Township of Kalamazoo* held a Work Session on **Monday, August 10, 2020** at **5:30 p.m.** in the Board Room of the Charter Township of Kalamazoo Administration Building, 1720 Riverview Drive, Kalamazoo, Michigan 49004-1099, for the purpose of discussing Work Session Agenda items, and any other business that may legally come before the Board of Trustees of the Charter Township of Kalamazoo, Kalamazoo County. Members accessed the meeting remotely using Zoom, due to the COVID-19 epidemic.

PRESENT: Supervisor Donald Martin, Clerk Mark Miller, Treasurer Sherine Miller, Trustees Warren Cook, Nicolette Leigh, Steven Leuty, and Jennifer Strebs.

ABSENT: None.

ALSO PRESENT: Finance Director Nancy Desai, Manager Dexter Mitchell, Attorney Roxanne Seeber, Township Fire Marshal Todd Kowalski.

Supervisor Martin called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Item 1 – DISCUSSION REGARDING FIREWORKS ORDINANCE

Attorney Seeber explained that state law has changed two years ago from a permissive law to one that says “You can’t prohibit fireworks on any of these days.” Definitions also mirror state law. It also provides for permits for professional displays. It also sets environmental standards if there should be fire danger.

Trustee Leigh asked about “homemade fireworks”. Attorney Seeber said this could be added under a new section, “You can’t discharge homemade fireworks.” Fire Marshal Kowalski cautioned about black powder cannons. They could be limited to the days provided. Cannons are less loud than typical consumer fireworks.

Clerk Miller asked further about the dates in state law, and whether this would repeal Ord. 572 as well as Ord. 570. Attorney Seeber will make that addition.

Trustee Cook suggested adding the Bureau of Fire Services under LARA (or its successor agency). He observed that enforcement is with the Fire Department, but the Police get the fee money. Attorney Seeber said this is in the state law.

Trustee Leuty asked about litter. Fire Marshal Kowalski said that “anything that goes up, must come down on your property.” Persons discharging fireworks must clean up the litter. He said that fireworks have caused confirmed fires in Michigan.

Treasurer Miller said that fireworks were happening way outside of stated date limits. How do we get to compliance? Fire Marshal Kowalski said we have language forbidding using fireworks while intoxicated. Other communities will probably follow us, for consistent messaging.

Trustee Strebs suggested adding June 19, “Juneteenth” as an allowed fireworks date. Trustee Leigh and Supervisor Martin disagreed.

Item 2 – DISCUSSION REGARDING 3% SURCHARGE OF WATER & SEWER ALLOCATION

Treasurer Miller asked to remove this item to collect more information.

Item 3 – MANAGER’S UPDATE

The election is over, welcome new Board members, sidewalk for Kalsec is scheduled, we had a 10.5% drop in our health insurance rates. Kalamazoo Public Schools have three options for fall. We are discussing with IT what we will need if we have a second wave of COVID. Several Board members have suggested a Board retreat once the new Board is on board. Our charter millage passed, we are discussing special assessment rates.

Trustee Strebs asked about publication of current police policies. Manager Mitchell said that we are in the process of accreditation. Trustee Strebs said accreditation and access to current policies are two things. Manager Mitchell said it would be better to release the policy that would be in force going forward. Trustee Strebs would rather see current policies be released in the interim.

Item 4 – DISCUSSION REGARDING ITEMS ON THE REGULAR AGENDA

Trustee Strebs asked about Planning Commission item on Kendell, re-zoning to RM-2, it sounded as though there would be opposition on the Planning Commission to that. She said that we have a shortage of affordable housing. Trustee Cook said the property in consideration is among single family homes. This would be spot zoning. Trustee Strebs asked the Attorney about spot zoning. Attorney Seeber said there has not been a public hearing on this issue yet. A spot zone is an island among other zones. Considerations could be the Township Master Plan, other surrounding zones, and services available to support this use. We have corrected mistakes in zoning in the past.

Trustee Cook asked about the check disbursement report concerning Republic Services. Manager Mitchell said there is a potential for an increase in special assessment for recycling. Trustee Cook asked if this is within the contract? Treasurer Miller said we have been charged \$40,000 more each year. We may want to re-negotiate. Supervisor Martin would appreciate updated information about recycling usage.

Attorney Seeber answered a question about trailer parks, some of these vacant trailers will be demolished. A difficulty is that there is no one available to talk with in an ownership role.

Item 9A **REQUEST TO ADOPT ORDINANCE 624**

Attorney Seeber explained that this has been before us several times. Medical and Adult Use provisions are now aligned.

Trustee Leuty moved, seconded by Trustee Cook, to adopt Ordinance 624.

Roll call vote, (7-0).

Item 9B **REQUEST TO ACCEPT FIREWORKS ORDINANCE 625 FOR FIRST READING**

Attorney Seeber explained the provisions of the proposed ordinance, as amended during the work session. We regulate discharge of fireworks to just those days required by the state to be allowed. She has added the word “homemade”, it prohibits discharge if you are intoxicated, age restrictions, and environmental conditions. Display fireworks will require a pyrotechnic expert. We can set a fee and insurance requirement. Bureau of Fire Services or successor agency. Our noise ordinance is preempted during permitted fireworks.

Clerk Miller moved, seconded by Trustee Cook, to accept for first reading.

Trustee Strebs moved to amend the proposed ordinance, Section III, subsection A., item 3, to read "June 19th and June 29th through July 4th until 11:45 pm." and item 4, to read "June 20th and July 5th, if the date is a Friday or Saturday, until 11:45 pm". There was no second.

Trustee Strebs addressed Juneteenth and her reasons for adding it.

Roll call vote, (6-1 Strebs). Motion carried.

Item 11 **BOARD MEMBER REPORTS**

Trustee Strebs congratulated new members of the Board. She agrees with Alan Cohen about distress caused by fireworks. She thanked community members who came out to vote. She shared concern about USPS not operating optimally for the next election. She asked that police policies be released sooner rather than later. She thanked Mike Seals for his service to Kalamazoo County.

Trustee Cook thanked candidates in the Primary. Planning Commission had gravel mine renewals and two public hearings, on marijuana and a lumberyard, both approved. It also denied a site plan on Foster Avenue and approved a site plan for the Latvian Church.

Trustee Leigh lost her election, congratulated Treasurer Miller on her election. We have done a good job in the last four years.

Clerk Miller reported on election statistics. For the first time when precincts have been open, absentee ballots outnumbered precinct voters. 83% of requested ballots were returned.

Trustee Leuty thanked those who helped with our elections, one of our three mandated township functions. He thanked our parks volunteers. He welcomed our new members.

Supervisor Martin thanked those who have served on the Board.

Item 12 **ATTORNEY'S REPORT**

Attorney Seeber reported that the suspension of aspects of the Open Meetings Act will be extended as long as the emergency order lasts.

There is a new FOIA request for elections information being received by many Clerk's offices. Clerk Miller commented that we have not received it.

Item 13 **MANAGER REPORT**

Congratulations and condolences to those who won and lost in the election. Kalsec sidewalk is underway, options for Kalamazoo Public Schools are being decided.

Item 14 **PUBLIC COMMENTS**

Alan Cohen can't take part in the conversation, he wants to take this to Federal Court. He can sue the Township, based on ADA violations.

Ron Huster, 1314 Coolidge, congratulated new Board members.

Item 16 **ADJOURNMENT**

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 8:35 p.m.

An Ordinance to protect the health, safety and general welfare of the citizens of the Charter Township of Kalamazoo through the regulation of use of consumer fireworks as provided in the Michigan Fireworks Safety Act, Public Act 256 of 2011 as amended; and to provide for civil sanctions and civil remedies for violation of this Ordinance.

ORDAINS:

**SECTION I
TITLE**

This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the “Charter Township of Kalamazoo Fireworks Ordinance”.

**SECTION II
DEFINITIONS**

For purposes of this Ordinance, the following definitions shall apply:

- A. Act: The Michigan Fireworks Safety Act, Public Act 256 of 2011, as it may from time to time be amended.
- B. APA: American Pyrotechnics Association.
- C. ARTICLES PYROTECHNIC: Pyrotechnic devices for professional use that are similar to consumer fireworks in chemical compositions and construction but not intended for consumer use, that meet the weight limits for consumer fireworks but are not labeled as such, and that are classified as UN0431 or UN0432 under 49 CFR 172.101.
- D. Consumer fireworks: Fireworks devices that are designed to produce visible effects by combustion, that are required to comply with the construction, chemical

composition and labeling regulations promulgated by the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission under 16 CFR Parts 1500 and 1507, and that are listed in APA Standard 87-1, 3.1.2, 3.1.3, or 3.5. "Consumer fireworks" does not include low-impact fireworks.

- D. Display fireworks: Large fireworks devices that are explosive materials intended for use in fireworks displays and designed to produce visible or audible effects by combustion, deflagration, or detonation, as provided in 27 CFR 555.11, 49 CFR 172, and APA Standard 87-1, 4.1.
- E. Homemade fireworks: Any composition or device designed for the purpose of producing a visible or audible effect by combustion, deflagration, or detonation that is not produced by a commercial manufacturer and does not comply with the construction, chemical composition, and labeling regulations of the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission under 16 CFR Parts 1500 and 1507.
- F. Low-impact fireworks: Ground and hand held sparkling devices, as that phrase is defined under APA Standard 87-1, 3.1, 3.1.1.1 to 3.1.1.8 and 3.5.
- G. MINOR: An individual who is less than 18 years of age.
- H. NFPA 1123: The Code for Fireworks Display, 2010 Edition, developed by the National Fire Protection Association.

SECTION III **CONSUMER FIREWORKS PROHIBITION**

- A. A person shall not ignite, discharge or use consumer or homemade fireworks except on the following days after 11:00 a.m.
 - (1) December 31 until 1:00 a.m. on January 1.
 - (2) The Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding Memorial Day until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
 - (3) June 29 to July 4 until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
 - (4) July 5, if that date is a Friday or Saturday, until 11:45 p.m.
 - (5) The Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding Labor Day until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
- B. No person shall ignite, discharge or use consumer fireworks or homemade fireworks on public property, school property, church property or the property of another person without that organization's or the property owner's express written permission to use consumer fireworks or homemade fireworks on those premises.
- C. Consumer fireworks shall not be sold to a minor. This age requirement shall be verified by any of the following:

- (1) An operator's or chauffeur's license issued under the Michigan Vehicle Code, 1949 PA 300, MCLA §§ 257.1 to 257.923.
- (2) An official state personal identification card issued under 1972 PA 222, MCLA §§ 28.291 to 28.300.
- (3) An enhanced driver license or enhanced official state personal identification card issued under the Enhanced Driver License and Enhanced Official State Personal Identification Card Act, 2008 PA 23, MCLA § 28.301 to 28.308.
- (4) A military identification card.
- (5) A passport.
- (6) Any other bona fide photograph identification that establishes the identity and age of the individual.

D. An individual shall not discharge, ignite, or use consumer fireworks or low-impact fireworks while under the influence of alcoholic liquor, a controlled substance, or a combination of alcoholic liquor and a controlled substance. As used in this subsection:

- (1) "Alcoholic liquor" means that term as defined in Section 1d of the Michigan Vehicle Code, 1949 PA 300, MCLA § 257.1d.
- (2) "Controlled substance" means that term as defined in Section 8b of the Michigan Vehicle Code, 1949 PA 300, MCLA § 257.8b.

E. Environmental concerns prohibition on use of fireworks.

- (1). Notwithstanding the days and times permitting the ignition, discharge or use of consumer fireworks under § 15-30A, if the environmental concerns based on the Michigan Department of Natural Resources Fire Division criteria are elevated to extreme fire conditions or if the environmental concerns based on the Fire Division criteria are elevated to very high for 72 consecutive hours, the Fire Chief or the Fire Marshal, acting under the direction of the Fire Chief, in consultation with the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, has the authority to enforce a no-burning restriction that includes a ban on the ignition, discharge, and use of consumer fireworks, homemade fireworks and display fireworks within the Township.
- (2). If a no-burning restriction is instituted under this section, the Fire Chief or the Fire Marshal acting under the direction of the Fire Chief enforcing the restriction shall ensure that adequate notice of the restriction is provided to the public.
- (3). Not more than 24 hours after the fire condition is downgraded from extreme or very high fire condition, the Fire Chief or the Fire Marshal acting under the direction of the Fire Chief enforcing the no-burning restriction that banned the ignition, discharge, and use of fireworks shall inform the public that the restriction has been lifted in the same manner that the restriction was announced or otherwise made known to the public.

SECTION IV
DISPLAY FIREWORKS PERMIT

- A. Upon application in writing on forms provided by the State Bureau of Fire Services or its successor agency on the department's website and payment of a fee of \$150 the Township Board may grant a permit for the use of a public or private fireworks display.
- (1) Before the Township Board will issue a display fireworks permit, the person applying for the permit shall furnish proof of financial responsibility by a bond or insurance in the amount of \$5,000,000 to protect the public and to satisfy claims for damages to property or personal injuries arising out of an act or omission on the part of the person or an agent or employee of the person.
 - (2) Before granting a display fireworks permit, the Township Board determine the competency and qualifications of an articles pyrotechnic and display fireworks operator, as furnished by the operator on the operator's application form, in accordance with the requirements provided under NFPA 1123, and on the time, place, and safety aspects of the display of articles pyrotechnic or display fireworks.
- B. No display fireworks permit shall be granted to a minor.
- C. The Township shall retain the application fee and a copy of the proof of financial responsibility for all display fireworks.

SECTION V
CONTINUING EFFECT OF OTHER ORDINANCES

All other Charter Township of Kalamazoo ordinances not adopted pursuant to the Act shall continue in effect and may be enforced at any time of the year including, but not limited to, the day before, during or the day after a national holiday. The Township recognizes that its Noise Ordinance is pre-empted during the permissive times specified in Section III.A. of this Ordinance.

SECTION VI
REPEAL OF OBSOLETE ORDINANCES

Ordinance No. 570 "Fireworks" is hereby repealed. Ordinance No. 572 amending Ordinance 570 is hereby repealed.

SECTION VII
SEVERABILITY

Should any part of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional, illegal or of no force and effect by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion thereof shall not be deemed to affect the validity of any other part or portion of this Ordinance.

SECTION VIII
ENFORCEMENT AND SANCTIONS

A. Enforcement. This ordinance may be enforced by any law enforcement officer and the Township Fire Marshal.

B. Sanctions.

1. A violation of Section III. A. of this ordinance by any person, firm, association, partnership, or corporation is deemed to be a municipal civil infraction as defined by Michigan Statute which shall be punishable by a civil fine of :
 - \$1,000.00 for each violation of the Ordinance; and
 - \$500 of such fine shall be paid to the Charter Township of Kalamazoo Police Department in accordance with MCL 28.457.
2. Any person, firm, association, partnership, corporation, or governmental entity who violates the provisions of Section III. B, C, or D of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be responsible for a municipal civil infraction, as defined by Michigan Statute which shall be punishable by civil fine determined in accordance with the following schedule:

	<u>Minimum</u> <u>Fine</u>	<u>Maximum</u> <u>Fine</u>
1st Offense within 3-year period*	\$ 150.00	\$500.00
2nd Offense within 3-year period*	\$ 250.00	\$500.00
3rd Offense within 3-year period*	\$ 350.00	\$500.00
4th or More Offense within a 3-year period*	\$ 500.00	\$500.00

* Determined on the basis of the date of commission of the offense(s).

Additionally, the violator shall pay costs which may include all expenses, direct and indirect, to which the Charter Township of Kalamazoo has incurred in connection with the municipal civil infraction. In no case, however, shall costs of less than \$10.00 nor more than \$500.00 be ordered. In addition, the Charter Township of Kalamazoo shall have the right to proceed in any court of competent jurisdiction for the purpose of obtaining an injunction, restraining order, or other appropriate remedy to compel compliance with this Ordinance. Each day that a violation of this Ordinance exists shall constitute a separate violation of this Ordinance.

SECTION VII
EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect the day after publication, after adoption.

Michigan Fireworks Safety Act was amended in 2018. It eliminated some of the permitted days for fireworks; however it also indicated that a Township can adopt an ordinance regulating the ignition, discharge and use of fireworks EXCEPT on the days specified in the statute. They are:

- (a) December 31 until 1 a.m. on January 1.
- (b) The Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding Memorial Day until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
- (c) June 29 to July 4 until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
- (d) July 5, if that date is a Friday or Saturday, until 11:45 p.m.
- (e) The Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding Labor Day until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.

If a township does not adopt an ordinance, then fireworks are not regulated in the township and they can be ignited, discharge and used ANY DAY. The Township fire marshal and chief have recommended adherence to the State Law, only allowing the discharge and use on the specified national holidays.

In Section V, we recognize that the Township Noise Ordinance is preempted by state law and this ordinance during the specified days/times.
