

ORDINANCE NO. 25

AN ORDINANCE OF CHERRY TOWNSHIP, BUTLER COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA
ENACTING A LOCAL TAX FOR THE PURPOSE OF
FUNDING AREA FIRE COMPANIES

WHEREAS, the local volunteer fire companies of West Sunbury, Marion, and Slippery Rock have appealed to the Cherry Township Board of Supervisors for financial support to compensate for the services provided to the residents of Cherry Township, and


WHEREAS, the Second Class Township Code, Section 3205(4), provides that Municipalities are permitted to impose a tax not exceeding three mills to make appropriations to contract with adjacent municipal volunteer fire companies for fire protection,

NOW THEREFORE, the Board of Supervisors of Cherry Township is enacting a 2-mill fire tax, to take effect beginning with the 2004 tax year. The taxes collected will be distributed in the following increments:

West Sunbury - $\frac{3}{4}$ mill
Marion - $\frac{3}{4}$ mill
Slippery Rock - $\frac{1}{2}$ mill
