➢ 86.6% of respondents say they are satisfied with Town services.

Respondents strongly prioritize public works, public safety, and local business development.

Over 2/3rds of respondents support a simple majority requirement local funding measure.



Opinion on Whether the Town is Doing a Good Job Providing Community Services



Opinion on Whether the Town Effectively Manages Public Funds






Shall the Town of Colma's measure to help fund core city services and facilities such as:

- crime investigation and reduction services;
- traffic and parking enforcement; and
- expanding services to support local businesses;

by establishing a one-half cent sales tax, providing \$4 million dollars annually, until ended by voters, with independent audits, no money for Sacramento, and all funds spent in the Town of Colma, be adopted?
