PROCLAMATION APRIL 23, 2021 GENERAL FEDERATION OF WOMEN'S CLUBS FEDERATION DAY IN THE CITY OF CORNING

WHEREAS, the General Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC) was organized on April 24, 1890, and duly chartered by President William McKinley and the United States Congress on March 2, 1901; and

WHEREAS the General Federation of Women's Clubs is one of the world's largest and oldest non-denominational women's volunteer service organizations, with members in fifty states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and twenty countries.

WHEREAS the GFWC provides opportunities to develop personal leadership skills, study issues and educate the public, commemorate women's history, and participate in constructive public service, thus continuing the commitment to community improvement.

WHEREAS the Maywood Woman's Club of Corning; the oldest in the Shasta District of the California Federation of Women's Clubs, continues to be an excellent example of the contributions made by Women's Clubs. Since the Clubs founding on September 27, 1898, it has actively participated in such events as the women's suffrage movement, planning and fund raising to build and furnish Woodson Park with trees, tables, and swing sets, founding of the Maywood Colony Library, and by 1908 forming the Corning Library Association to help bring the Carnegie Library to the Community. In 1903 the Club tackled the need for Corning's first High School followed by their leadership in the successful Bond Issue to build the Grammar School.

WHEREAS, the example set by the Maywood Woman's Club and their members, both past and present, illustrate the importance and impact that leadership from Community Service Clubs provide toward the continued enhancement of our Communities.

WHEREAS the General Federation of Women's Clubs will celebrate April 24, 2021 as GFWC Federation Day, commemorating more than a century of volunteer service to their communities, and the Maywood Woman's Club will celebrate the 119th anniversary of their Charter, established on April 2, 1902 with the California Federation of Women's Clubs.

NOW, THEREFORE I, ROBERT SNOW, as Mayor of the City of Corning, do hereby proclaim April 24, 2021 as General Federation of Women's Clubs "Federation Day" in the City of Corning. A Colusa Street resident addressed the City Council informing them of issues occurring in his neighborhood, specifically at one residence and stated that he had a person from this area come to his door selling drugs. He stated that the Police Department has responded and been helpful and he requested Code Enforcement action be taken.

Diane Ramirez of Waste Management/Corning Disposal addressed the Council to mind the Community of the new garbage billing process and explaining that Waste Management/Corning Disposal bills quarterly in advance, unlike the City's prior monthly billing process in arrears. The new billing cycle will begin April 1st and there will be no late fees/penalties during the first six (6) month transition period.

Ms. Ramirez also spoke on behalf of Empower Tehama stating that they are seeking a better location for meeting. She explained that currently they have been offered shared space at Dignity Health, however they wish to find a singular space to utilize.

An audience member spoke on behalf of the Corning Manta Rays Swim Team. He was advised to schedule a time to speak with the City Manager to discuss this further.

7. Authorize payment for Invoice 21-206658-2 in the amount of \$6,640 under Task Order "A" to Armstrong Consultants, Inc. for the 2020 Airport Fence Project.

Presented by Public Works Consultant Robin Kampmann who stated that if approved, this will be the final payment to Armstrong Consultants, Inc. for the fencing project at the Airport.

Councilor Burnett moved to authorize payment for Invoice 21-206658-02 in the amount of \$6,640 under Task Order "A" to Armstrong Consultants, Inc. Councilor Demo seconded the motion.

Presented by Public Works Consultant Robin Kampmann who stated that this is in conjunction with the previous request relating to the Airport Project. She stated that Staff is seeking Council approval of the Notice of Completion and authorization to record and file the document with the Tehama County Clerk and Recorder, and release of the retention funds being held within the 35 days from file and recording date as specified.

Councilor Demo moved to accept the Notice of Completion and authorize filing with Tehama County for recording and authorize the release of Retention Funds in the amount of \$20,453.52 35-days after the Notice of Completion has been filed. Councilor Burnett seconded the motion. Ayes: Snow, Demo, Burnett, Hargens and Valerio. Abstain/Absent/Opposed: None. Motion was approved by a 5-0 vote.

9. Award the 2021-03 City Street Tree Pruning in City's Southwest Quadrant to West Coast Arborists, Inc. in the amount of \$140 per tree; authorize appropriation of \$5,000 from the City's General Fund Reserves; and authorize the City Manager to execute the Contract.

Presented by Public Works Consultant Robing Kampmann who stated that the City received only one bid as presented. The bid received was higher than the bid received in 2019/20, therefore Staff is requesting the appropriation of the additional funds. Jerry Lequia reported a tree on Highway 99W at Tehama Street that is half down and a potential liability; Mrs. Kampmann stated she will have Public Works investigate.

Councilor Demo moved to award the Bid for the 2021-03 City Street Tree Pruning in the southwest quadrant to West Coast Arborists Inc. in the amount of \$140 per tree; approve appropriation of \$5,000 from the City's General Fund Reserves to Fund 111-8002-3000 Tree Pruning/Public Works Streets; and authorize the City Manager to execute the Contract. Councilor

Valerio seconded the motion. Ayes: Snow, Demo, Burnett, Hargens and Valerio. Abstain/Absent/Opposed: None. Motion was approved by a 5-0 vote.

10. Adopt Ordinance 694, an Ordinance adopting the City of Corning Zoning Code Update.

Presented by Planner 1 Christina Meeds who stated that a Joint Meeting was held with the City Council and Planning Commission to present the Zoning Code Update. Mayor Snow announced that primarily the changes made in the update were driven by State Law.

Councilor Demo moved to accept for first reading Ordinance 694, an Ordinance of the City of Corning amending Title 17 (Zoning) by repealing and replacing in their entirety the following Sections of the Zoning Code: 17.04, 17.06, 17.08, 17.10, 17.12, 17.14, 17.16, and 17.51, and adding new Sections addressing "Multi-Family Residential Objective Design and Development Standards", Accessory Dwelling Units", and "Reasonable Accommodation", and approve Ordinance Summary for publication. Councilor Burnett seconded the motion. Ayes: Snow, Demo, Burnett, Hargens and Valerio. Abstain/Absent/Opposed: None. Motion was approved by a 5-0 vote.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

In Spring 2020, the City of Corning began updating the City's Zoning Code, working under an SB-2 grant from the State of California department of Housing and Community Development. Staff and the City's Consultants, Interwest, have completed a draft of the updates, which are being presented to review by the public, Planning Commission, and City Council.

The proposed amendments to the Zoning Code are focused in the following areas:

- Addressing recent changes in State housing legislation that require the City to make changes to the Zoning Code.
- Modernizing outdated portions of the Zoning Code, and;
- Streamlining the processes established in the Zoning Code that must be followed when developers and homeowners submit projects and work with the Planning Department.

The changes to the Zoning Code are coordinated with amendments to the City's Housing Element (a chapter of the Corning General Plan), which is being concurrently updated to meet the requirements of state law.

No properties will be rezoned as part of this process; the Zoning Map is not proposed to be changed.

Below is a list of proposed revisions and additions in the Zoning Code. The sections of the Code which are proposed to be updated are included in the attachments to this report.

- Updated the General-Purpose statement in Section 17.04.030 of the Code, addressing the relationship to the General Plan's goals and policies. In addition, purpose statements promoting high-quality design and preserving the quality of life and character of existing residential neighborhoods were added.
- Revised and added new housing-related definitions in Chapter 17.06, including terms such
 as "group residential," "assisted living," "family day care," etc.. Definitions for various
 housing types were also added or updated to match the revisions in the residential zoning
 districts section.
- Prepared new purpose statements that discuss uses found in each residential zoning district, relationship with the associated General Plan land use categories, and maximum density limits allowed (Chapter 17.10).
- Created a new development standards table in Chapter 17.10 for residential zoning districts to make it easier to find lot size requirements, setbacks, and building height information.
- Updated the types of residential uses allowed in residential zones to allow a variety of housing options in the City.
- Updated residential zoning districts to allow multi-family by right in the R-2 and R-3 districts (Chapters 17.12 and 17.13).

- Updated maximum density limit in the R-4 district to 28 dwelling units per acre to match the Multi-Family Residential land use designation in the City's General Plan (Chapter 17.14).
- In the R-3 and R-4 districts (Chapters 17.13 and 17.14), a new requirement was added calling for a minimum of 10% of the units in multi-family developments containing 20 or more units to be three bedrooms. This will help address the housing needs of larger families.
- Updated the height limit in the R-3 district to accommodate up to 3-story buildings (40 feet maximum) for townhouses, condominiums, and apartments (Chapter 17.13).
- In Chapter 17.14, updated the height limit in the R-4 district to accommodate up to 4-story buildings (55 feet maximum) for apartments, condominiums, and mixed use (residential over commercial/office).
- Developed objective development and design standards for affordable multi-family housing projects (Chapter 17.11) meeting the eligibility requirements for streamlining under state law (SB 35).
- Updated the City's Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) regulations to meet new State law that took effect Jan. 1, 2020. The new regulations provide clear standards for building or converting living space into an ADU and will help Corning property owners seeking to provide housing opportunities.
- Revised Ch. 17.11 Multi-Family Residential Development and Design Guidelines to clarify and streamline the review process.

Planning Commission Recommendation:

At the March 16, 2021 Planning Commission Meeting the Commission voted in favor of the Zoning Code Update 5 to 0 and recommended Staff propose the Zoning Code Update to the Corning City Council for adoption.

WHEREAS, the City recognized that portions of the Corning Zoning Code required updates to conform with recently enacted provisions of state law, to update information, and to streamline the process of reviewing and approving new residential projects; and

WHEREAS, the City applied to the State of California for grant funding under the "SB-2" process to fund the updating of the Zoning Code consistent with the purposes of SB-2; and

WHEREAS, the City received a grant from the State of California to fund updates to the Zoning Code and the Housing Element of the General Plan to further the objectives listed above; and

WHEREAS, work on the updated Zoning Code commenced in early 2020; and

WHEREAS, Staff and the City's consultants have created a draft updated Zoning Code which achieves the goals set forth in the City's application to the State of California through the SB-2 grant process; and

WHEREAS, the updates revise the text of the following sections of the Zoning Code: 17.04, 17.06, 17.08, 17.10, 17.12, 17.14, 17.16 and 17.51; and

WHEREAS, new Zoning Code sections have been created addressing "Multi-Family Residential Objective Design and Development Standards," "Accessory Dwelling Units," and "Reasonable Accommodation" in order to comply with the requirements of state law and provide specific guidance to staff, the public, and businesses on these topics; and

WHEREAS, the draft updated Zoning Code was made available for public review in November 2020; and

WHEREAS, the environmental impacts of the Zoning Code Update have generally been addressed in the Final General Plan EIR prepared for the most recent update of the Corning General Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds that the foregoing recitals and findings are true and correct, and adopts this Ordinance based on the entirety of the record;

The City Council of the City of Corning does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1 -- REPEAL AND REPLACEMENT OF EXISTING ZONING CODE SECTIONS:

- a) The following existing sections of the Corning Zoning Code are repealed in their entirety: 17.04, 17.06, 17.08, 17.10, 17.12, 17.14, 17.16, and 17.51
- b) The following updated sections of the Corning Zoning Code are adopted to replace the sections repealed in item a) above: 17.04, 17.06, 17.08, 17.10, 17.12, 17.14, 17.16, and 17.51

These sections are included in their entirety in the attachments to this Ordinance.

SECTION 2 -- ADOPTION OF NEW ZONING CODE SECTIONS:

a) The following sections are added to the Corning Zoning Code:

"Multi-Family Residential Objective Design and Development Standards,"

"Accessory Dwelling Units," and

"Reasonable Accommodation"

These sections are included in their entirety in the attachments to this Ordinance.

SECTION 3 – SEVERABILITY:

Severability any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this article is for any reason held to be invalid or if unconstitutional by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this article. The Council hereby declares that it would have passed this Ordinance and each section, sentence, clause, or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, or phrases be declared invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4 - EFFECTIVE DATE AND SUMMARY PUBLICATION:

This Ordinance shall take effect 30 days after its final passage and pursuant to its publication within fifteen days after its adoption in the *Corning Observer*, a newspaper of general circulation published and distributed in the City of Corning.

WITNESSETH, that, for the considerations hereinafter mentioned, the Owner and Contractor agree as follows:

ARTICLE I. The Contractor agrees to furnish all labor, materials, tools and equipment and to perform all work required to construct and complete in a good and workmanlike manner, and in strict accordance with the Contract Documents, those certain improvements entitled:

CITY OF CORNING 2021 Multi-Street Improvement Project

These Special Provisions, the Bid Proposal, and the Plans and Specifications attached hereto and incorporated herein by express reference are a material part of this contract and are expressly incorporated herein as though fully set forth in this paragraph. These documents are collectively marked EXHIBIT "A".

ARTICLE II. The Owner agrees to pay the Contractor for the performance of the Contract, subject to additions and deductions provided therein at the following prices, and the Contractor agrees to receive and accept said payment as full compensation for furnishing all materials and for doing all the work contemplated and embraced in this agreement, and for all loss or damage arising out of the nature of the aforesaid work or from the action of the elements and from any unforeseen difficulties or obstructions which may arise or be encountered in the prosecution of the work until its acceptance by Owner, and for all risks of every description connected with the work, and for all expenses incurred by or in consequence of the suspension or discontinuance of the work, and for well and faithfully completing the work and the whole thereof in the manner and according to the Contract Documents and the requirements of the Engineer under them to wit: As shown on the Proposal attached hereto and incorporated herein.

ARTICLE III. The Contractor and Public Works Director shall produce a schedule for the project start date after the date of execution of the Contract. He/She shall diligently prosecute the same to completion as shown on the Proposal attached hereto and incorporated herein.

ARTICLE IV. Licensing, Insurance & Labor Code Requirements

- Contractor agrees to secure and maintain a general liability insurance policy in a sum not less than \$1,000,000.00 during the term of the Contract Agreement and any extension thereto, and shall name the City of Corning as an additional insured under the general liability insurance policy. Contractor shall also secure and maintain, during the term of the Contract Agreement, Automobile Liability Insurance at limits competitive in the construction industry of like kind, which shall be applicable and cover those vehicles operating on the project, and any transfer obligation to/from the project, as well as Workers Compensation Insurance where applicable and/or required under California law.
- Contractor shall purchase and maintain a City of Corning Business License and any other applicable license issued by the State of California required for such work.
- A contractor and/or subcontractor shall not be qualified to bid on, be listed in a bid proposal, subject to the requirements of Section 4104 of the Public Contract Code, or engage in the performance of any contract for public work, as defined in this chapter, unless currently registered and qualified to perform public work pursuant to Labor Code

Section 1725.5. In accordance with the provisions of Section 1770, and following, of the Labor Code of the State of California, the City of Corning has ascertained that the general prevailing rate of wages applicable to the locality in which the work is to be done will be listed in the "General Prevailing Wage Rates as determined by the Director of Industrial Relations," which is on file at City Hall and available from the California Department of Industrial Relations Internet website at www.dir.ca.gov.

It is mandatory that the Contractor to whom the contract is awarded and any subcontractor under him pay not less than said specified rates to all persons employed by them or either of them in the execution of the contract. The successful bidder shall post a copy of such determination at the job site and nothing herein shall be considered as an acceptance of the said terms of said proposal conflicting herewith.

ARTICLE V. Indemnity, Defense, and Hold Harmless. Contractor agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold the City of Corning harmless from any and all losses, liability, damages, injury (to person or property), fines, fees, penalties, and/or other damages that arises, in any way, under the terms of the Contract Agreement and/or any alleged and/or actual negligent act, intentional act, or other circumstance caused by or performed by Contractor, its agents, subcontractors, and/or employees. The obligations of this provision do not apply to injury, loss, damage, or other harm that arises from the sole and absolute negligence and/or intentional act of the City of Corning, its agents and/or employees.

ARTICLE VI. Termination of Contract. Should contractor fail to perform satisfactorily during this agreement, City reserves to itself the right to cancel any remaining portion of said contract upon thirty days written notice to Contractor, by notice in writing provided to Contractor at his usual place of business. Should Contractor breach any of the terms and conditions of this contract, or violate any laws, the City reserves unto itself the right to direct Contractor to immediately cease performance and then terminate this contract thereafter, upon thirty days written notice, and pay contractor such amounts as he may then be entitled to on a pro-rata basis (pro-rated according to amount of work satisfactorily completed)..

ARTICLE VII. Integration and Modification. The Contract Agreement, its exhibits and attachments are the operative contract of the parties; there being no other written or oral agreements. Any modifications to this Agreement must be in writing and signed by all parties.

ARTICLE VIII. Savings Clause. Should any one part of this Agreement be deemed illegal or invalid, all other provisions shall remain valid and enforceable so long as the Agreement's purpose is not materially altered.

ARTICLE IX. Ability to Contract. Contractor represents and warrants that it has taken all necessary actions to bind the corporation as set forth in the Contract Agreement and any addendum thereto.

ARTICLE X. If during the performance of Contactor's work Contractor, its agents, or employees discover a dangerous condition that presents a possible danger to the general public, or is otherwise reasonably perceived by Contractor as a danger to the public, Contractor shall immediately notify Public Works of the condition and if necessary shall post a warning at the area presenting such condition to warn the general public of the same and thereafter safely and timely resolve the condition or until such time as the Public Works Department can assess or otherwise address the condition.







SUMMARY:

Staff is requesting City Council authorization to pursue collection on one delinquent water and sewer service account by initiating a property lien as allowed in the City's Municipal Code. The combined total owed for this property as of April 8, 2021 is \$1,172.14.

This property is scheduled for "Sale of Tax Defaulted Property" by way of internet auction on May 14 – 17, 2021. To avoid permanent loss of these fees once the property is auctioned, Staff now seeks Council authority to notify the property owner of the City's intent to lien this property for delinquent water and/or sewer fees. If approved, Staff will serve notification to inform the property owner of their right to appeal or protest the filing of this lien at the next City Council meeting scheduled for April 27, 2021.

BACKGROUND:

The Corning Municipal Code provides in Section 13, Section 13.04.430 (Sewer) that:

Section 13.04.430 (Sewer): Nonpayment of charges and fees shall result in disconnection of service. Any charge or rental levied by the City pursuant to this Chapter on any premises within the corporate limits of the City having a connection to the City sewerage System is made a lien upon the premises. The Director is authorized, and it shall be his duty, to disconnect any industrial sewer connection or domestic sewer connection on premises located either within the corporate limits of the City or outside the corporate limits of the City, upon failure of the person to whom such charge or rental is billed to pay such charge or rental prior to delinquency. (Ord. 541 (part), 1993); and

Section 13.08.150 (Water): Charges as lien-Nonpayment-disconnection. Any charge levied by the City by or pursuant to this Chapter or the Resolutions made pursuant to the authority hereof on any premises within the corporate limits of the City having a connection to the City Water Distribution System is made a lien upon premises. The water superintendent is authorized, and it shall be his duty to disconnect the water upon failure of the person to whom such charge or rental is billed to pay the charges as set forth in this Chapter. (Ord. 111 §20, 1953).
