City Pool:

Unfortunately, the leak is under the pool deck and a small portion of the concrete will need to be removed to complete the repair.

PLANNING:

POLICE DEPARMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 170 calls for service, a total of 27 officer reports were taken and there were 92 officer-initiated incidents, including 48 traffic stops. Officers made 15 misdemeanor and 4 felony arrests. Officers issued 16 citations, of which; 13 were misdemeanors, 2 was an infraction, and 1 was parking during the period of March 24, 2021 through March 31, 2021.
