CITY MANAGER:

COVID-19 Updates:

Landlords or renters financially impacted by COVID-19 may be eligible for financial assistance through the CA COVID-19 Rent Relief Program. Call 833-430-2122 or visit HousingIsKey.com to check eligibility & apply.

The Paskenta Band of Nomlaki Indians will be holding a Johnson & Johnson one-shot vaccination clinic on April 10th from 8:00am – 2:00pm for those 18 and older. Advanced reservations are required. Reservations can be scheduled by visiting rollinghillscasino.com. I was told 1,000 doses will be available.

Appointments can still be made for a two-dose vaccination by visiting <u>https://myturn.ca.gov/</u> at the Red Bluff Community Center. All Tehama County residents ages 16 and over are eligible. I was told they have openings this week.

Passenger Tire Collection Event:

The Tehama County Solid Waste Management Agency (Agency) will hold a free Passenger Tire Collection Event on Saturday, April 10th from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. at the Corning Park & Ride parking lot. The following limitations apply to the event: Can haul up to 9 tires without exemption, 20 tires with exemption; MAXIMUM of 40 tires will be accepted; Tires must be OFF-the-Rim; **NO** large truck tires, equipment tires, off-road tires; **NO** tires larger than 17". **NO** oil, paint, batteries, appliances, or other items. **NO** tires from waste tire generating businesses.

FY 2021/22 Budget and Capital Improvement Program:

Department Capital Improvement Program proposals are due April 12th and budget proposals for fiscal year 2021/2022 are due April 16th.

Sacramento Valley City Manager Meeting:

As Vice-Chair I will be attending the remote Sacramento Valley City Manager Meeting on April 8th.

Senate Bill 1383 Organics Program:

I will be meeting with Rachel Ross, Agency Manager of the Tehama County Solid Waste Management Agency, on April 16th about the SB 1383 Organics Program.

I will be attending my father-in-law's funeral on April 12th. I will be going on vacation April 19-23rd.

Summer City Pool Operations:

Open Swim, Lap Swim, Swim Team, Water Aerobics, Swim Lessons, and the 2nd Grade Swim Lessons will all be offered this summer. Pool Parties are currently not permitted as part of the <u>California Blueprint for a Safer Economy</u>. Based on the Governor's recent announcement of his expectation of business to largely return to normal in mid-June, I expect this may change. Staff is currently creating the summer daily pool schedule, which will determine when the pool will be open for open swim, Lap Swim, Swim Team, Water Aerobics, and Swim Lessons. We will not know whether we will be able to extend the pool season this year until lifeguards are hired, and we better know their availability.



PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Vandalism:

Significant vandalism has occurred this week throughout the City Parks, including:

- Concrete bench at the Skate Park was smashed into many pieces. Staff has removed the remnants of the bench.
- Soap was placed in the Martini Plaza Fountain. Staff has cleaned the fountain and it is back in working order.
- Graffiti was discovered at the Woodson Park Restrooms; Staff is in the process of cleaning the graffiti off the buildings.

Water Service Repairs:

The following water leaks have been repaired:

- Water service leak on Dolla Court

PLANNING:

Staff received a Use Permit Application for an ABC license for a new restaurant, Hometown Hub to be located at 955 HWY 99W #119 to serve on-site beer and wine, .and a Use Permit Application for a Chuckwagon at Bartels that will serve coffee and breakfast items from 6:00am to 11:00am 7 days a week. Both items will be presented to the Planning Commission on April 20th.

RECREATION:

POLICE DEPARMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 169 calls for service, a total of 29 officer reports were taken and there were 100 officer-initiated incidents, including 59 traffic stops. Officers made 3 misdemeanor and 3 felony arrests. Officers issued 15 citations, of which; 6 were misdemeanors, 7 was an infraction, and 2 were parking during the period of March 31, 2021 through April 7, 2021.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line training continues for Patrol and Dispatch personnel.

Officer Promotion:

Congratulations to James White, Officer White was promoted to Sergeant effective on March 5, 2021.

FIRE DEPARTMENT:

Corning Volunteer Fire Department (CVFD) Call Volume:

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department responded to 33 calls for service last week, they consisted of: 25 medicals, 4 public service, 1 fire, and 3 traffic collisions.

The Orland, Capay, Artois, Bayliss, Glenn Codora, Ord Bend, and Butte City Volunteer Fire Department Call Volumes:

The Orland, Capay, Artois, Bayliss, Glenn Codora, Ord Bend, and Butte City Volunteer Fire Departments were dispatched to a combined total of 17 calls for service last week, they consisted of: 5 medicals, 5 traffic collisions, 5 fires, and 2 public service.

Training:

Training on March 31st consisted of pump and ladder operations on Truck 3. On Monday, March 5th, 7 members of the Department attended an "Active Shooter" drill for 4 hours at Richfield School. Corning Fire, Tehama County Sheriff's, CALFIRE, Corning Police, Saint Elizabeth's Medics, and CAL OES were in attendance.
