CITY MANAGER:

COVID-19 Updates:

According to Tehama County Public Health, there are currently 162 Tehama County residents in isolation, there have been 51 deaths, with 4 deaths occurring in the last 14 days, 6 individuals are currently hospitalized, and 1 ICU bed is available in Tehama County.

Vaccines are still in short supply. As a result, those at high risk of exposure and those 65 or older are the priority for vaccinations right now. You can find out if you are able to get a vaccination right now and schedule your vaccination by accessing MyTurn: https://myturn.ca.gov/. If you do not have access to the internet you may call 1(833) 422-4255.

Please use public health practices to keep yourself and others safe, wear face coverings, wash your hands, social distance, and meet outdoors as much as possible.

Annual Financial Statements:

The City's Annual Financial Statements are being finalized and will be presented at the February 23rd City Council meeting.

PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT:

Water Service Repairs:

A water service line leak at Heritage Square was reported the evening of February 16th. It was determined that a repair would require the water for the entire Shopping Center to be shut off. Staff isolated the leak as best as possible and completed the repair, including replacing the meter the morning of February 17th before the businesses opened.

The Request for Proposals has been published for the installation of the new play equipment that the City purchased for Yost Park. POLICE DEPARMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 168 calls for service, a total of 29 officer reports were taken and there were 96 officer-initiated incidents, including 32 traffic stops. Officers made 13 misdemeanor and 2 felony arrests. Officers issued 15 citations, of which; 10 were

misdemeanors, 2 were unclassified, and 3 were parking during the period of February 10, 2021 through February 17, 2021.

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line training continues for Patrol and Dispatch personnel.
