CITY MANAGER: New City Website:

Thanks to the hard work of Accounting Assistant Rubi Ordaz, Accounting Manager Mary Brimm, PD Administrative Services Manager Tom Watson, and the City's Department Heads the new City website will go live soon. We are in the process of completing final edits. Stay tuned.

FY 2021/2022 Budget:

The FY 2021/2022 Budget is being finalized. I anticipate presenting the budget to the City Council on June 8th.

COVID-19 Updates:

The County has moved into the Orange Tier which allows increased occupancy and attendance at social gatherings, retail, places of worship, gyms and fitness centers, and restaurants. It also allows bowling alleys to reopen at 25% occupancy (50% if certain conditions can be met). More information can be found at: https://covid19.ca.gov/safer-economy/#county-status.

Corning Restaurants financially impacted by COVID-19, please do not miss your opportunity to apply for funds from the Restaurant Revitalization Fund. It is first-come, first-served until the funds run out! The funds will provide restaurants with funding equal to their pandemic-related revenue loss up to \$10 million per business and no more than \$5 million per physical location. POLICE DEPARMENT:

Patrol:

In addition to responding to 176 calls for service, a total of 29 officer reports were taken and there were 93 officer-initiated incidents, including 39 traffic stops. Officers made 10 misdemeanor and 7 felony arrests. Officers issued 23 citations, of which; 14 were misdemeanors, 5 were infractions, 1 was animal, and 3 were parking during the period of May 12, 2021 through May 19, 2021.

Training:

Officers continue to participate in POST Portal Training and Lexipol Daily Training Bulletins. Other POST on-line training continues for Patrol and Dispatch Personnel.
