**UPDATES:**

The City is pleased to announce it was awarded \$8.5 million as part of the California Department of Parks and Recreation Proposition 68 Park Development and Community Revitalization grant. The City of Corning "Transforming Downtown Corning – Recreation Center and City Plaza" will be located on the southside of Solano Street between 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> streets. The plaza will consist of a 10,000 square foot Recreation Center, 7,500 square foot gymnasium, dance classroom, matted tumbling room, culinary classroom, language learning room, art classroom, restrooms, office, hallways, and storage area. Also included in the plaza will be a splash pad with concrete art mural, amphitheater with shade structure, music play area, a perimeter walking path, planter seatwall, chess tables all with lighting, landscaping, and shade structures. Attached is the site plan and the tentative timeline. The timeline will be adjusted due to the state awarding the grant later than anticipated.

**TIMING:**

Staff is estimating construction to begin in early 2023 and be completed in 2024.

**UPDATES:**

Some of the Corning City Parks will be given a facelift this year.

- ❖ All the old playground equipment at Children's Park located at 225 Edith Ave will be removed and replaced with new equipment.
- ❖ The Tennis Courts at Northside Park (city pool park) will be resurfaced and the court on the east side will be turned into 4 pickle ball courts.
- ❖ The Tennis courts at Clark Park have not been used for tennis in a long time. City Council directed staff to remove the southwest quadrant of concrete and install a playground there. The remaining concrete will be the home of a new Edu marking playground. The tennis court fencing will remain, but the gate will be relocated to enter and exit on the south side to keep children safe.
