PROCLAMATION APRIL 2022 SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS (SAAM) MONTH

WHEREAS, Sexual Assault Awareness Month calls attention to the fact that sexual violence is widespread and impacts every person in this community.

WHEREAS rape, sexual assault, and sexual harassment harm our community, and statistics show one (1) in five (5) women, and one (1) in seventy-one (71) men will be raped at some point in their lives.

WHEREAS child sexual abuse prevention must be a priority to confront the reality that one (1) in six (6) boys and one (1) in four (4) girls will experience sexual assault before age eighteen (18). Young people experience heightened rates of sexual violence, and youth ages 12-17 were 2.5 times as likely to be victims of rape or sexual assault.

WHEREAS on campuses, one (1) in five (5) women and one (1) in sixteen (16) men are sexually assaulted during their time in college.

WHEREAS we must work together to build online communities free from sexual harassment, abuse, and assault by practicing digital consent, intervening when we see harmful behaviors, and promoting online communities that value inclusion, safety, and respect.

WHEREAS prevention is possible when everyone gets involved. The first step is increasing education, awareness, and community involvement. It's time for all of us to take action to create a safer environment for all.

WHEREAS we join advocates and communities across the country in taking action to prevent sexual violence. April is Sexual Assault Awareness Month, and each day of the year is an opportunity to create change for the future.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT I, ROBERT SNOW, AS MAYOR OF THE CITY OF CORNING, do hereby proclaim April 2022 as "Sexual Assault Awareness Month" in the City of Corning.

PROCLAMATION APRIL 24, 2022 GENERAL FEDERATION OF WOMEN'S CLUBS FEDERATION DAY IN THE CITY OF CORNING

WHEREAS, the General Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC) was organized on April 24, 1890, and duly chartered by President William McKinley and the United States Congress on March 2, 1901; and

WHEREAS the General Federation of Women's Clubs is one of the world's largest and oldest non-denominational women's volunteer service organizations, with members in fifty states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and twenty countries.

WHEREAS the GFWC provides opportunities to develop personal leadership skills, study issues and educate the public, commemorate women's history, and participate in constructive public service, thus continuing the commitment to community improvement.

WHEREAS the Maywood Woman's Club of Corning; the oldest in the Shasta District of the California Federation of Women's Clubs, continues to be an excellent example of the contributions made by Women's Clubs. Since the Clubs founding on September 27, 1898, it has actively participated in such events as the women's suffrage movement, planning and fund raising to build and furnish Woodson Park with trees, tables, and swing sets, founding of the Maywood Colony Library, and by 1908 forming the Corning Library Association to help bring the Carnegie Library to the Community. In 1903 the Club tackled the need for Corning's first High School followed by their leadership in the successful Bond Issue to build the Grammar School.

WHEREAS, the example set by the Maywood Woman's Club and their members, both past and present, illustrate the importance and impact that leadership from Community Service Clubs provide toward the continued enhancement of our Communities.

WHEREAS the General Federation of Women's Clubs will celebrate April 24, 2022 as GFWC Federation Day, commemorating more than a century of volunteer service to their communities, and the Maywood Woman's Club will celebrate the 120th anniversary of their Charter, established on April 2, 1902 with the California Federation of Women's Clubs.

NOW, THEREFORE I, ROBERT SNOW, as Mayor of the City of Corning, do hereby proclaim April 24, 2022 as General Federation of Women's Clubs "Federation Day" in the City of Corning. Presented by City Engineer/Public Works Consultant Robin Kampmann. She announced the City received no formal Bids. As a result, the City reached out to First Serve Productions, Inc. as allowed by Municipal Code who provided the Bid presented for consideration tonight.

Councilor Demo moved to award the Northside Park Tennis Court/Pickleball Court Resurfacing Project in the amount of \$84,950 to First Serve Productions, Inc. and authorize the City Manager to execute the Contract. Presented by City Engineer/Public Works Consultant Robin Kampmann who presented and explained the proposed corrections to Solano Street from Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Streets. Mrs. Kampmann stated her concerns regarding costs and holding prices as a result of a bid opened in Red Bluff today.

Councilor Burnett moved to approve the Plans and Specifications and authorize Staff to solicit Bids for the Solano Street Improvement Project. Councilor Demo seconded the motion. She then presented the quote provided by Holistic Playgrounds in Chico and explained what a Holistic Playground is and announced that the illustrations of the proposal have been provided to the Council in the Council packet.

An audience member attending via Zoom stated they would like to see some improvements to Clark Park, such as additional fields, etc. Mayor Snow suggested scheduling a meeting with the City Manager to discuss these suggestions.

Councilor Hargens moved to approve the Holistic Playground to design and lead the community paint day along with the expenditure for supplies, for a total amount not to exceed \$11,000. 11. Approve Program for Business Awning Replacement utilizing American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) Funds.

Presented by City Manager Kristina Miller who stated that the City helped organize a Façade Improvement Program with the assistance of 3CORE. She stated that following a brainstorming session, Staff though this might provide the opportunity to help revitalize the City's downtown. 3CORE has been contacted and they are wiling to administer such a Program on behalf of the City. Staff suggests allocating \$200,000-\$250,000 in funding for such a program. City Manager Miler then provided the aspects of the proposed Program. She stated that the City was allocated 1.8 million in ARPA funds.

Councilor Demo moved to approve the Downtown Corning Historical Business District Awning Program and allocate \$250,000 in American Rescue Plan Act 2021 Funds for the Downtown Corning Historical Business District Awning Program. Councilor Hargens seconded the motion. Ayes: Snow, Demo, Burnett, Valerio, and Hargens. Absent/Abstain/Opposed: None. Motion was approved by a 5-0 vote.

SUMMARY:

This is the first of three actions required to annex the Magnolia Meadows Subdivision into the City's Landscaping and Lighting District No. 1 that was initially formed in 2005.

The Magnolia Meadows Subdivision was approved July 28, 2020 with 45 conditions that must be met prior to approval of the "Final Tract Map" as provided in the City Code and the Subdivision Map Act. The tentative map proposes to create 53 single-family residential lots. A copy of the approved tentative map is attached.

Among the conditions of approval was the requirement to form or annex into a Landscaping and Lighting District (Condition No. 43). The purpose is to collect annual assessments to fund certain common or public facilities proposed in and for the benefit of the new housing development. In this case the assessments will pay for electrification of streetlights, and irrigation and maintenance of landscaping along the Marguerite Avenue frontage and the stormwater retention system.

BACKGROUND:

The process for annexing into a Landscaping and Lighting Districts is included in the State Streets and Highways Code. The process requires three separate Council actions. This is the first of the three meetings.

The purpose of this meeting is to "initiate" the annexation through adoption of the attached Resolution No. 04-12-2022-01. Should the Resolution be approved, subsequent resolutions will be prepared and presented to Council for action to make this property part of the Landscape and Lighting District Zone 1 as Zone 5.


WHEREAS, the Land Use Element of the General Plan includes a Goal (Goal 2) that encourages the City to "Insure that new development pays for the necessary City facilities and services to support it through tax revenues, fees, or other means", and

WHEREAS, Tentative Tract Map 20-1001, approved by the Corning City Council on July 28, 2020, included a condition (#43) of map approval requiring the formation of or annexation into a Landscaping and Lighting District for the purposes of funding electrification and maintenance of street lights, and irrigation and maintenance of common landscaped areas within the public right of way, and maintenance of stormwater retention facilities and masonry walls, and


NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Corning hereby INITIATES the formation of Landscape and Lighting District No. 1 Zone 5, which boundaries shall be coterminous with the boundary of Tract map 20-1001 to fund electrification and maintenance of street lights, and irrigation and maintenance of common landscaped areas within the public right of way, and maintenance of stormwater retention facilities and masonry walls.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the developer is hereby directed to prepare, or have prepared, information regarding the items listed in Street and Highways Code Section 22567 and provide it to the City Engineer. 

The Corning Volunteer Fire Department currently has 16 older hand-held radios that are no longer manufactured. The purchase of these radios will be a step to upgrade our communication capabilities which is paramount for firefighter safety. The grant program requires an equivalent funding match from the City (50/50 split) that will enable us to equip our people at a reduced cost to the City.

BACKGROUND:

In 2021 the Department received an RFC Grant in the amount of \$2,495.00 and including matching City funds, a total of \$4,990.00 which was used to purchase wildland coats, pants, helmets, shrouds, goggles, and gloves.

The cost for the new sign from Stewart Signs including the removal and disposal of the existing sign, the purchasing of the new sign, the installation of the new sign and cloud-based programing software for the life of the sign is \$34,408.89. The purchase of the programable sign was not included in the FY21/22 budget therefore a supplemental appropriation would be required for this project.

BACKGROUND:





SUMMARY:

Tehama County is pursuing Community Project Funding for the needed Corning Veterans Memorial Hall Rehabilitation Project. This project is of great importance to our community, as this facility serves numerous veteran, youth, and civic groups. It also functions as a meeting place, Resource Center, and Community Center to many underserved groups in the Corning area.

BACKGROUND:

Last year, Congress created a new process called "Community Project Funding" which allowed Members to submit funding requests for specific programs and projects based in their Districts. In total, Congressman LaMalfa was able to secure projects totaling \$16.8 million for California's 1st Congressional District in Fiscal Year 2022 Federal Government Funding Legislation.

Another round of Community Project Funding was recently announced for Fiscal Year 2023. Congressman LaMalfa's office will be able to submit 15 projects this year as compared to last year's 10. Keep in mind that the 15 projects will still come out of the same amount of about \$17 - \$18 million allocated to each Representative.

Community Project Funding (CPF) requests are submitted by a Member of Congress (Representative or Senator) for direct Federal Funding in support of a local Project or Program. Only governmental or non-profit entities are eligible for Community Project Funding requests.

It is hoped that the rehabilitation of the Corning Veterans Memorial Hall will meet the criteria for qualifying for this funding. As such, all funding requests along with documentation showing community support for this project (such as letters of support from elected officials) must be submitted by **Monday, April 25, 2022**.
