 - 14. Resolution No . 04-12-2022-01; a Resolution of Intention to annex the Magnolia Meadows Subdivision into Landscape and Lighting District 1, Zone 5.

Presented by City Engineer/Public Works Consultant Robin Kampmann who stated that this is the first of three actions required to annex the Magnolia Meadows Subdivision into the City's Landscape and Lighting District No. 1 initially formed in 2005. Mrs. Kampmann explained that annexing into a Landscaping and Lighting District was one of the 45 Conditions of Approval (Condition #43) required prior to approval of the Subdivisions Final Track Map as provided in the City Code and the Subdivision Map Act. She further explained that the purpose of the Landscape and Lighting District is to collect annual assessments to fund certain common or public facilities

proposed in and for the benefit of the new housing development. In this case, the assessments will pau for electrification of streetlights, and irrigation and maintenance of landscaping along the Marguerite Avenue frontage and the stormwater retention system.

Councilor Demo moved to adopt Resolution No. 04-12-2022-01, a resolution of intention for formation of Landscape and Lighting District 1 Zone 5 for the Magnolia Meadows Subdivision, Tract 20-1001. Councilor Hargens seconded the motion. Ayes: Snow, Demo, Burnett, Valerio, and Hargens. Absent/Abstain/Opposed: None. Motion was approved by a 5-0 vote.

15. Authorize the Fire Chief to submit a Rural Fire Capacity (RFC) Program Application with CALFIRE and approve grant match funding in the amount of \$7,964.04.

Presented by Fire Chief Tom Tomlinson who stated that, if approved, this Grant would provide funding in the amount of \$7,964.04 with a required match of City funds in the amount of \$7,964.04 for a total of \$15,928.07 to assist with the purchase of:

Councilor Burnett moved to authorize the Fire Chief to sign and submit a Rural Fire Capacity Grant Application with CALFIRE and approve the 50% grant match funding from fund 001-6552-2300 Safety Items/Fire in the amount of \$7,964.04. Councilor Demo seconded the motion. Ayes: Snow, Demo, Burnett, Valerio, and Hargens. Absent/Abstain/Opposed: None. Motion was approved by a 5-0 vote.

16. Approve purchase of a Programmable Sign from Stewart Signs in the amount of \$34,408.89 and authorize the appropriation of \$35,000 from General Fund Reserves for this purchase.

Presented by City Engineer/Public Works Consultant Robin Kampmann who stated Staff has been working with Stewart Signs (an authorized GSA Contractor) for the replacement of the existing Transportation Center Sign which includes an LED Display. She presented a sign sketch for conceptual approval. She stated that Staff will work with the owners of McBrayer's Hometown Café for their approval of graphics on the proposed sign that advertises their business. Mrs. Kampmann then presented the costs for the new programable sign, which includes sign installation, removal of the existing sign, and the cloud-based software for the life of the new sign at a total cost of \$34,408.89. She stated this purchase was not included in the FY 21/22 City Budget therefore a supplemental appropriation would be required for this project.

Councilor Hargens moved to:

- Approve the conceptual design of the new programable Led monument sign;
- Authorize Staff to award the contract to Stewart signs in the amount of \$34,408.89; and
- Approve the appropriation of \$35,000 from the City's General Fund Reserves to fund 001-3160 Prog. Sign/Transportation Facility.

Councilor Burnett seconded the motion. Ayes: Snow, Demo, Burnett, Valerio, and Hargens. Absent/Abstain/Opposed: None. Motion was approved by a 5-0 vote.

17. Approve Library Commission recommendation to purchase new Library furniture in an amount not to exceed \$33,226.83 to be funded by the Ridell Trust.

Presented by City Manager Kristina Miller. She explained that County Librarian Todd Deck, following discussion/direction provided by the City's Library Commission, created a list of proposed furniture to be purchased from DEMCO to replace some of the existing broken/obsolete furniture at the City Library. The total cost for the list of items presented including tax and shipping is \$33,226.83.

Councilor Demo moved to approve Library Commission and County Librarian recommendation and authorize the purchase of new Library furniture/fixtures in an amount not to exceed \$33,226.83 and approve funding this purchase from the City's Ridell Trust Funds. Councilor Hargens seconded the motion. Ayes: Snow, Demo, Burnett, Valerio, and Hargens. Absent/Abstain/Opposed: None. Motion was approved by a 5-0 vote.

18. Authorize Letter of Support for Tehama County's request for Community Project Funding through Congressman LaMalfa's Office for the Corning Veteran's Memorial Hall Rehabilitation Project.

Presented by City Manager Kristina Miller who explained Community Project Funding (CPF) requests are submitted by a member of Congress (Representative or Senator) for direct Federal Funding in support of a local Project or Program. Only government or non-profit entities are eligible for Community Project Funding requests. This "Community Project Funding" allows members to submit funding requests for specific programs based in their Districts. Congressman LaMalfa secured 10 projects totaling \$16.5 million for California's 1st Congressional District in Fiscal Year 2022 Federal Government Funding Legislation. Another round of Community Projects was recently announced for Fiscal Year 2023. Congressman LaMalfa's office will be able to submit 15 projects this year which will come out of the same \$17 - \$18 million allocated to each Representative.

Supervisor Bob Williams, a proponent of this grant request, was present and provided a brief background on the status of the Corning Veterans Memorial Hall and past efforts to secure funding for maintenance, repairs, and rehabilitation of the building which comes up to roughly \$6.5 million.

Councilor Demo moved to authorize a letter in support of Tehama County's request for Community Project Funding through Congressman LaMalfa's Office for the Corning Veteran's Memorial Hall Rehabilitation Project. Councilor Hargens seconded the motion. Ayes: Snow, Demo, Burnett, Valerio, and Hargens. Absent/Abstain/Opposed: None. Motion was approved by a 5-0 vote.

SUMMARY:

This is the second of three actions required to annex the Magnolia Meadows Subdivision into the City's Landscaping and Lighting District No. 1 that was initially formed in 2005.

The Magnolia Meadows Subdivision was approved July 28, 2020 with 45 conditions that must be met prior to approval of the "Final Tract Map" as provided in the City Code and the Subdivision Map Act. The tentative map proposes to create 53 single-family residential lots. A copy of the approved tentative map is attached.

Among the conditions of approval was the requirement to form or annex into a Landscaping and Lighting District (Condition No. 43). The purpose is to collect annual assessments to fund certain common or public facilities proposed in and for the benefit of the new housing development. In this case the assessments will pay for electrification of streetlights, and irrigation and maintenance of landscaping along the Marguerite Avenue frontage and the stormwater retention system.

BACKGROUND:

The process for annexing into a Landscaping and Lighting Districts is included in the State Streets and Highways Code. The process requires three separate Council actions. This is the first of the three meetings.

Attached for consideration is proposed Resolution No. 04-26-2022-01, a resolution of intention to annex into the Landscape and Lighting District Zone 1 as Zone 5. The resolution references the City Engineer's Report (also attached) as well the facilities that will be maintained by the district, the proposed zone number, its physical boundaries and the date of the required Public Hearing for annexation.

The City Engineer's Report includes a map of the proposed district zone. It also includes both overall and per lot annual costs to fund the facilities o be maintained by the district. The annual lot assessments are the sum of the expected annual costs divided by the number of lots; in this case 53 lots. The Engineer's report estimated the annual district assessment cost to be \$6,784.23 or \$128.00 per lot.

RECOMMENDATION:

WHEREAS, Tentative Tract Map 20-1001, approved by the Corning City Council on July 28, 2020, included a condition (#43) of map approval requiring the formation of or annexation into a Landscaping and Lighting District for the purposes of funding electrification and maintenance of street lights, and irrigation and maintenance of common landscaped areas within the public right of way, and maintenance of stormwater retention facilities and masonry walls, and

WHEREAS, the Corning City Council adopted Resolution No. 04-12-2022-01, a Resolution to Initiate Annexation into Landscaping and Lighting District No. 1, affecting the site on April 12, 2022, and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has filed the attached report with the City Clerk regarding the improvements withing and boundaries of the proposed Landscaping and Lighting District No. 1, Zone 5, and the proposed assessments upon parcels within the district.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the City Council of the City of Corning hereby schedules a public hearing for the purposes of annexing Magnolia Meadows Subdivision (Tract Map 20-1001) as described in the attached legal description and shown on the attached drawing, into Landscaping and Lighting District No. 1, Zone 5, and to levy the proposed assessment to properties within said district, to be conducted in the City Council Chamber at Corning City Hall on Tuesday May 24, 2022, at 6:30 p.m. and directs staff to publish notice of hearing in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Corning.

CITY ENGINEER'S REPORT

CITY OF CORNING LANDSCAPING AND LIGHTING ASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 1, ZONE 5 MAGNOLIA MEADOWS SUBDIVISION

Legal Requirements

In November 1996 the voters of the State of California passed Proposition 218, which significantly changed the Assessment Law. Among those changes was a requirement that a detailed Engineer's Report be prepared and signed by a registered professional engineer in the Sate of California. This report is being prepared in response to that requirement.

Another requirement of Proposition 218 is that eh Engineer's Report must establish a substantive "Special benefit" to property for the valid levy of an assessment. As part of the approval process for a land division or subdivision, certain conditions must be met by the property owner. The special benefit specific to this subdivision project includes the future replacement and annual operation and maintenance costs of electrification of street lights, irrigation and maintenance of landscaping along Marguerite Avenue frontage, the stormwater retention system and the masonry wall along the northern property line adjacent to the school.

Landscaping and Lighting Assessment District Improvements

As a condition of approval of Tentative Tract Map 20-1001, Magnolia Meadows Subdivision, a mechanism for maintenance purposes must be established to fund long term upkeep of the improvements of special benefit to that parcel. The landscaping and lighting assessment district boundary is described in Exhibit "A" and delineated in Exhibit "B" attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein. The spreadsheet setting forth the calculations used to determine costs for the landscaping and lighting assessment district is included as Exhibit "C". The assessment shall be used for the purpose of funding the future replacement and annual cost involved in the operation and maintenance of the following public improvements:

- 1. Electrification of street lights.
- 2. Landscaping and irrigation Marguerite Avenue frontage.
- 3. Maintenance and replacement of the stormwater retention facilities (infiltration trenches).
- 4. Masonry wall Northern property line adjacent to school.

Annual Assessment

The annual assessment for the landscaping and maintenance assessment cost breakdown is shown in Exhibit "C" attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein. The total annual cost for the district is \$6,784.23.

Method of Apportionment

The method of apportionment is based on equally proportionate benefit received by each lot within the maintenance assessment district. Each of the 53 lots shall be apportioned an equal share of the costs associated with Landscaping and Lighting Assessment District No. 1, Zone 5.

Annual Assessment per Lot

\$6.784.23 / 53 Lots = \$128.00 / lot

Adjustment to Annual Assessments Based on Increases in Consumer Price Index

Any increase in the amount of the total annual assessment as well as any increase in an annual assessment levied against a particular lot or parcel within the boundaries of this assessment district o account for inflation shall be calculated in the following manner:

If, on the first day of the City fiscal year commencing on July 1st following the establishment of a maintenance assessment district in the manner provided by the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972 (Streets and Highways Code Sections 22500 et seq.), and on the first day of each fiscal year thereafter that the assessment district remains in effect, there is an increase in the cost of operating and maintaining the public improvements to be funded with assessment district revenues, as measured by an increase in the consumer price index during such period of time, then the total annual assessment levied against all properties within the assessment district, as well as the proportional annual assessment levied against each lot or parcel withing the boundaries of the assessment district shall also be increased in proportion to the increase in such cost. The determination of whether there has been an increase in such costs and the amount of the increase in such assessments which is proportional to the increase in such costs shall be made by the Director of Public Works and shall be based exclusively on the percentage increase during such period of time in the consumer price index published by the Federal Bureau of Labor Statistics for all Urban Consumers - U.S. Cities Average (all items) or such other measure employed by the U.S. Department of Labor Statistics in lieu of such consumer price index which measures the cost of living in U.S. cities.

Credits Against Annual Assessments Based on Prior Year Maintenance Costs

If the actual cost of operating and maintain the public improvements funded by revenues from this assessment district during any year the assessment district remains in effect is less than the assessment levied for that year, the difference between the actual cost of operating and maintaining the public improvements and the assessment levied for that year shall be credited against the assessments levied during the next succeeding year in the manner prescribed as follows. If on the first day of the City fiscal year commencing on July 1st following the establishment of a maintenance assessment district in the manner provided by the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972 (Streets and Highways Code Sections 22500 et seq.), and on the first day of each fiscal year thereafter that the assessment district remains in effect, the total annual assessment levied during the preceding fiscal year exceeded the actual cost of operating and maintaining the public

improvements to be funded with assessment district revenues during such preceding year, then the total annual assessment levied against the property within the assessment district during the ensuing fiscal year shall be reduced by credit equal to the difference between the total annual assessment levied during the preceding fiscal year and the actual cost of operation and maintaining the public improvements to be funded with assessment district revenues during such preceding fiscal year.

In particular, the total annual assessment levied against all property within the maintenance assessment district shall be reduced during the ensuing fiscal year, and only during the ensuing fiscal year, by an amount equal to the difference between the total annual assessment levied during the preceding fiscal year and the total cost of operating and maintaining the public improvements to be funded with assessment district revenues during such preceding fiscal year, and he annual assessment levied against each individual lot or parcel withing the boundaries of the assessment district shall be reduced ruing the ensuing fiscal year, and only during such ensuing fiscal year, by a portion of such amount which is calculated by the Director of Public Works using the method of apportionment set forth in the City Engineer's Report as approved by the City Council at the time the district was established.

Termination Date of Assessment District

Landscaping and Lighting Assessment District No. 1, Zone 5 shall continue from year to year until dissolved by the City Council of the City of Corning.

Engineer's Statement

I do hereby assess and apportion said amount to be assessed upon the assessable lots within the "Magnolia Meadows Subdivision" upon each lot, severally and respectively, in accordance with the special benefits to be received by such lots and more particularly set forth in Exhibit "A", Exhibit "B" and Exhibit "C" attached hereto.


