Commissioner Calkins asked if we had received any information regarding the remaining furniture purchased but not received (tabletops and coffee table)? City Clerk Lisa Linnet stated no, she would reach out to DEMCO.

Commissioner Sehorn moved to approve the Minutes; Commissioner Calkins seconded the motion. Ayes: Mueller, Sehorn, and Calkins. Absent: Turner and Olson-Higgins. Abstain/Opposed: None. Motion was approved by a 3-0 vote.

2. Report on Ridell Trust Funds and Expenditures:

Current balance: \$221,865.86 Expenditures: \$0.00 (None since last meeting.) Informational item only, no action required.

3. Presentation, Discussion, and possible recommendation relating to CMC Architecture's Proposal for the Corning Library Remodel.

There were no questions on the initial proposal. Items discussed were:

- Is the bathroom remodel covered/funded by the City? Yes, the City has budgeted \$80,000 in this fiscal year budget under Fund No. 001-9077-1700, Library Remodel/Library specifically to address bringing the restrooms into ADA compliance. It was stated that also budgeted was \$100,000 in Ridell Trust Funds to accommodate the possible interior design/remodel construction of the Library.
- County Librarian Alicia Meyer brought up the emergency door not being ADA compliant.
- There was discussion about moving books between libraries; the library may need to close for a little bit during the remodel.
- Discussed using carpet squares for carpeting replacement.
- · Confirmed that the remodel work would be at prevailing wage.
- Commissioner Calkins stated she had not gotten Library square footage/measurements; she will work with Lisa Linnet on this.

With no further discussion, Commissioner Sehorn moved to approve a recommendation to the Corning City Council to approve a contract, at a cost not to exceed \$6,000 to be funded utilizing the Ridel Trust Funds, with CMC Architecture for Interior Design & Construction Plans for a potential interior remodel of the Corning Library. Commissioner Calkins seconded the motion. Ayes: Mueller, Sehorn, and Calkins. Absent: Turner and Olson-Higgins. Abstain/Opposed: None. Motion was approved by a 3-0 vote.

Subject: Updated Library Remodel Plans for review

HI Laura,

Attached are the updated plans for your review.

There are a few items to discuss, which I have drawn a cloud around on the demolition plan. Not sure how much work you want called out on the bathrooms in terms of new finishes, etc. We can call out everything to be updated and then when the bids come in, review for items to mark as "leave for later" to bring the price in budget.

For larger projects, there is a valuation threshold of \$193K. Any project up to that amount must spend 20% on accessibility upgrades. This could be door handles, the walkways, parking stall, etc. If the project goes over that amount then all the facilities need to be updated for accessibility. This does vary from jurisdiction to jurisdiction, so it would be good to know if the City Building Department's take on the upgrades needed.

I marked on the last sheet what I anticipated the final finishes to be, but that will also need some fine tuning. I had noted for everything to be vinyl tile or plank, which is really durable, but after hearing the sound concerns from the RB branch, it may be better to go in with carpet squares like they did to help soften the noise overall and then add the vinyl in high traffic or designated wet areas.


