

The regular meeting of the Board of Selectmen was held on Tuesday, April 19, 2016 at 7:00 P.M., in the Daniel J. Toomey Hearing Room, Town Hall, Danvers.

Present: Chairman Daniel C. Bennett, Gardner S. Trask, III; David A. Mills; Diane M. Langlais; Late to arrive, William H. Clark

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all in attendance.

On a motion by Selectman Trask and seconded by Selectman Langlais, the Board voted 3-0-1 (Chairman Bennett was not present at last meeting) to approve the Minutes of March 15, 2016.

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New public business brought forth, as follows:

- Bruce Getchell addressed the Board regarding a fence that is along the public way on the Rail Trail near the Agway. The Town Manager will have DPW look into its placement.

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The Board was in receipt of an application by DanversCARES “Light the Night Purple”, a walk and community gathering supporting awareness of opiate and other substance use in our community planned for Wednesday, May 18, 6:30-8:00 P.M., beginning and ending at the Rotary Pavilion, on the grounds of the Peabody Institute Library. Peg Sallade, Event Coordinator spoke on behalf of the event. On a motion by Selectman Trask and seconded by Selectman Mills, the Board voted 4-0 to approve the application.

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A public hearing was held in accordance with Chapter 82 to lay out the following private roads in anticipation of a vote for their acceptance as public ways at the May 2016 Annual Town Meeting: Lantern Lane; Little Drive; Post Gate Road; Ryan Road, and Seneca Drive. Town Engineer Rick Rodgers was present on behalf of this item. On a motion made by Selectman Clark and seconded by Selectman Trask the Board voted 5-0 to close the public hearing. On a motion made by Selectman Trask and seconded by Selectman Langlais the board voted 5-0 to lay out the above roadways as Public Ways in the Town of Danvers and recommend to Town Meeting that the above mentioned roadways be accepted as Public Ways in the Town of Danvers. Said Layouts being more particularly described in the respective layout description to be executed by the Board of Selectmen

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The Board was in receipt of gifts in the amount of \$2,000 for a memorial park bench at Pope’s Landing in memory of John T. Locke and \$100 for the Swamp Walk in honor of Stacy Carpenter in accordance with M.G.L. Chapter 44, §53A. On a motion by Selectman Trask and seconded by Selectman Langlais, the Board voted 5-0 to accept the gifts.

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A public hearing was held under Chapter 138 on the application of 2 High St. Tavern Inc., d/b/a The Berry Tavern, Joseph Caparella Jr, Manager, for the appointment of the new manager at that address. On a motion by Selectman Trask and seconded by Selectman Langlais the Board voted 5-0 to close the public hearing. On a motion by Selectman Trask and seconded by Selectman Langlais the Board voted 5-0 to approve this application.

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The Board heard an update regarding NYBOSDS, Inc., d/b/a Rio Bravo Café, 194 Endicott St. Atty Thomas Demakis spoke on behalf of his client. Atty Demakis indicated an agreement is pending for a new restaurant and requested a six month extension to finalize the transfer. A motion was made by Selectman Trask and seconded by Selectman Clark to give the license holder a “final” six month extension. On an amendment made by Selectman Langlais and seconded by Selectman Mills to strike “final” from Selectman Trask’s motion, the Board voted 2-3 not to remove “final” with Selectman Langlais and Selectman Mills voting to remove “final” and Selectman Clark, Selectman Bennett, and Selectman Trask voting to leave “final” in the six month extension. The original motion for a “final” six month extension was approved 4-1, with Langlais opposed.

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A public hearing was held on the application of North Shore Auto, LLC, d/b/a Michaud Certified Pre-Owned Center, 75 Newbury Street, for a Class II Dealer’s License at that location. Atty Nancy McCann appeared before the Board on behalf of this application. On a motion by Selectman Mills and seconded by Selectman Langlais the Board closed the public hearing. On a motion by Selectman Mills and seconded by Selectman Langlais the Board voted 5-0 to approve this application.

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The Board was in receipt of an application from Irene Metaxakis of Supreme Roast Beef, Inc., d/b/a Supreme Roast Beef, 18 Maple St., requesting the transfer of a Common Victualler’s license at that same location. On a motion by Selectman Trask and seconded by Selectman Langlais, the Board voted 5-0 to approve this application.

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The Board was in receipt of an application from Bakasa Corporation d/b/a Mike’s Place Pizza & Roast Beef, 116 Water St., requesting name change from Londis Roast Beef, Pizza & More. Atty William Goldberg appeared before the Board on behalf of this application. On a motion by Selectman Mills and seconded by Selectman Langlais, the Board voted 5-0 to approve this application.
