OLD/NEW BUSINESS

130 North Street- Discussion and vote to consider ratifying an Enforcement Order to be placed on the deed of this property for violations of the Wetlands Protection Act and Town of Danvers Bylaw and Regulations. The property owner has removed vegetation, disturbed soils and made changes to an existing drainage system within 100' ft of an existing wetland resource area without approval. The property owner has been notified in person and by certified mail with a violation notice. An Enforcement Order has the legal force from the Conservation Commission to order a property owner to cease and desist illegal activities at the site, and if necessary, to stabilize and/or restore the area.
