

The regular meeting of the Board of Selectmen was held Tuesday January 21, 2020 at 7:00 P.M., in the Daniel J. Toomey Hearing Room, Town Hall, Danvers.

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The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all in attendance

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On a motion by Selectman Trask and seconded by Selectman Langlais, the Board voted 5-0 to approve minutes from January 7, 2020.

On a motion by Selectman Langlais and seconded by Selectman Trask, the Board voted to endorse the Statewide effort (House Bill 3665) to rename Columbus Day as Indigenous Peoples Day. The Board requested the Town Manager to draft a letter of endorsement.
