

*Warrant & Explanation Report
Special Town Meeting
October 26, 2020*

Article 1: Transportation Network. To see what sum the Town will vote to appropriate from the Transportation Network fund, or take any other action thereon.

Article 2: Supporting First Responders. To see if the Town will vote: (1) to express its appreciation and support of Danvers first responders and their families as they work to preserve a safe and secure community, (2) to reaffirm its commitment to providing the training, tools, and equipment necessary to protect their health and safety and the health and safety of community members, (3) to acknowledge the vital role first responders have and continue to play as essential workers in the midst of this global pandemic, and (4) to express its condolences and deep sense of gratitude for those first responders who make the ultimate sacrifice in service to their communities, or take any other action thereon.

Article 3: Wetlands Protection By-Law Revisions. To see if the Town will amend Chapter 26, "Wetland Protection By-Law," of the General By-Laws to clarify the presumptions associated with projects in a riverfront area, update definitions, performance standards, and application procedures, conditions, an enforcement details, or take any other action thereon.

Article 4: Town By-Law Amendment – Stormwater Management and Land Disturbance. To see if the Town will vote to amend Chapter XXXIX of the General By-Laws, as follows, or take any other action thereon.

Article 5: MassDOT Request. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Zoning By-Law and Zoning Map to zone approximately 1.85 acres, bounded by Route 1, Centre Street, Amory Road, and Dayton Street, into the Highway Corridor Zone, or take any other action thereon.

Article 6: Citizens' Petition. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the use and display of the "Thin Blue Line" flag on fire and other public safety apparatus.

Article 7: Keeping of Animals. To see if the Town will amend the Zoning By-Law to revise how it regulates the keeping of animals, including the potential insertion and deletion of terms, uses, and dimensional requirements, up to and including the complete prohibition of the activity, or take any other action thereon.
