

CITY ORDINANCE

An Ordinance Providing For the City Marshall to Cut Off the Supply Of City Water From Users When In Arrears For One Month and Ten Days.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of De Leon, Texas:

Section No. One. That users of the city water from the city water works of the City of De Leon, in Comanche County, Texas, shall pay to said City the rates of \$1.00 per month for each hydrant in any residence and ~~\$1.00~~ <sup>amount</sup> per month for each hydrant in any business house, where no meter has been installed, and where water meter has been installed such users shall pay <sup>a</sup> minimum of

\$1.00 per month and 50¢ per 1000 gallons <sup>sq used in excess</sup> of 5000 gallons, and same shall become due and payable on the <sup>(for the 1st 3000 gal - 1 1/2 for each gallon (1000 gal))</sup> first day of each month following the month for which such city

water had been so used, and if same is not paid for by the tenth day of the month following the month in which said water has been so used, then it shall be lawful and is hereby made the duty of the City Marshall to cut off the city water from such user or users that have become so delinquent.

Section No. Two. That when any user or users have been so delinquent <sup>due</sup> in said city water has been cut off as provided in Section No. One of this ordinance, then such user or users shall be compelled to pay such arrears and pay a fee of one dollar to the City Marshall of the said City of De Leon, Texas, before such user or users are entitled to again be connected with the said City water works.
