ORDINANCE NO. 82-202

ORDINANCE ABANDONING AN UNOPENED CITY ALLEY

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Commission of the City of De Leon, THAT WHEREAS a proposal has been presented to the City Commission by the land-owners in said block requesting the abandonment of an unopened alley which dissects Block Two of the Oak Lawn Addition to the City of De Leon; and

THAT WHEREAS this proposal has been considered by the City Commission at two regular meetings; and

THAT WHEREAS the City Commission is of the opinion that the abandonment of the aforesaid alley which has never been opened or used as a thoroughfare is in the best interest of the City for the reason that the City will not have to undertake the expense of opening, establishing and maintaining an alley in this locality; and

THAT WHEREAS all adjacent landowners have consented to the abandonment of said alley by the City;

THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED, to-wit:

All of that one sixteen (16) foot alley dissecting Block Two of the Oak Lawn Addition to the City of De Leon, Texas, is abandoned by the City of De Leon, except however, the abandonment of the alley is hereby limited only to the extent of the existing utility easements and lines, whether above or below ground.
