(13) LONG CANYON TRAI
 Southern Trailhead: About 1 mile north of the intersection
of Long Canyon Road//Hacienda Avenue This newer trail connects Desert Hot Springs to Joshua Tree
National Park (JNNP), traversing wide-open desert terain National Park (JTNP), Haversing wide-open desert terrain
blankeied with barel cactic creosote, and brittlebush. The JNP trai coridor winds throught the naturual wash ond dlimbs long Canyon, ending in Yucca Valley.

Northern Trailhead: Access off Elk Trail Road in Yucca Valley ( $34.076455,-116.4222$ )
For a 12 -mile through-hike, have someone waiting for you at the
northern trailhead, which you can access by taking Acomal Toil
 west to Elk Triil, hen turn south on Elk Trail.
(14) KIM NICOLTRAIL

Trailhead: Intersection of Corkhill Road/20th Avenue Desert Hot Springs
Named affer Kim Nicol, who dedicated her Iife to protecting
endangered species and dopen spaces in Greater 1 Palm Sering endangered species and open spaces in Greater Palm Sprins
this ike climbs almost 1,200 feet and features breathtroking views, with snowcoppped mountains, windmills, and wide-ope

-1 CANYON VIEW LOOP TRAIL


This trail starts from the ranger station and takes you up along the ridge before rectroping down into the
riverbed ond winding back owward the station A Nvibed and winding back toward the stition. A
sightly longer loop up the Pacific Crest Triil to Red slightly longer loop up the Pacific Crest
Dome can be made into a 5 -mile hike.

The Pacific Cress Trail (PCT) Spans more than 2,000

(04) MISSION CREEK PRESERVE TRALI
 Trailhead: 60550 Mission Creek Road, Desert Hot Springs
(The Widldands Conservancy's Mission Creek Preserve) Mission Creek Preserve encompasses lands that were once a
dude ranch, and long before that, homet to th Mission Band of Sonoran Indians. To find the trailhead, turn onto Mission Creek onto Mission Creek
lane for 2 miles un and set out on the dirif path. This trail la losoed leads to to the historic Mission Creek Stone House, connecting from there to the tra
that leads back to the ronges station at Whitewater Preserver from trail \#2.
05 MARSH TRALL

Trailhead: 11055 East Drive, Morongo Valley Canyon Marsh Trail follows strickling stream and immerses
visitors in the rich riparian habitat of the Sand to Snow National Monument, connecting with the Mesquire Trail on one end and the Desert Willow Trail arthe ene.t the board walk portion

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7) WEST CANYON TRAIL
 Trailhead: 11055 East Drive, Morongo Valley Expecta a couple steep ssitcthbacks during this hike, which
climbst to the to of the saddle ridge efofore eeding to the canyon floor and marsh habitat. Creosote bush, honey mesquite, and wild plum blanket the hillsides, while springtime
wildflowers bring a dazzling pop of color a ffer winter rains.
(08) BIG MORONGO THROUGH-HIKE
 Trailhead: 11055 East Drive, Morongo Valley From the trailhead ot Big Morongo Canyon Presesve, this
through-hike follows a willow stream for 5.4 miles; once your reached the end outside Desert Hot Springs, you can return
 the lower end of hhe tail, loo tor tata bicick structure on the
north side of Indian Avenue about 1 mile east of the intersection of Highway 62 it turn onto a dirt road here and follow unil you get o o locked gate and a parking area where the trail down
trom the preserve ends. Arrow-weed, honey mesquite, and Coftonwood trees flouish h olong this path, as well as several coltonnood trees floursh
migrating and nesting birds
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
