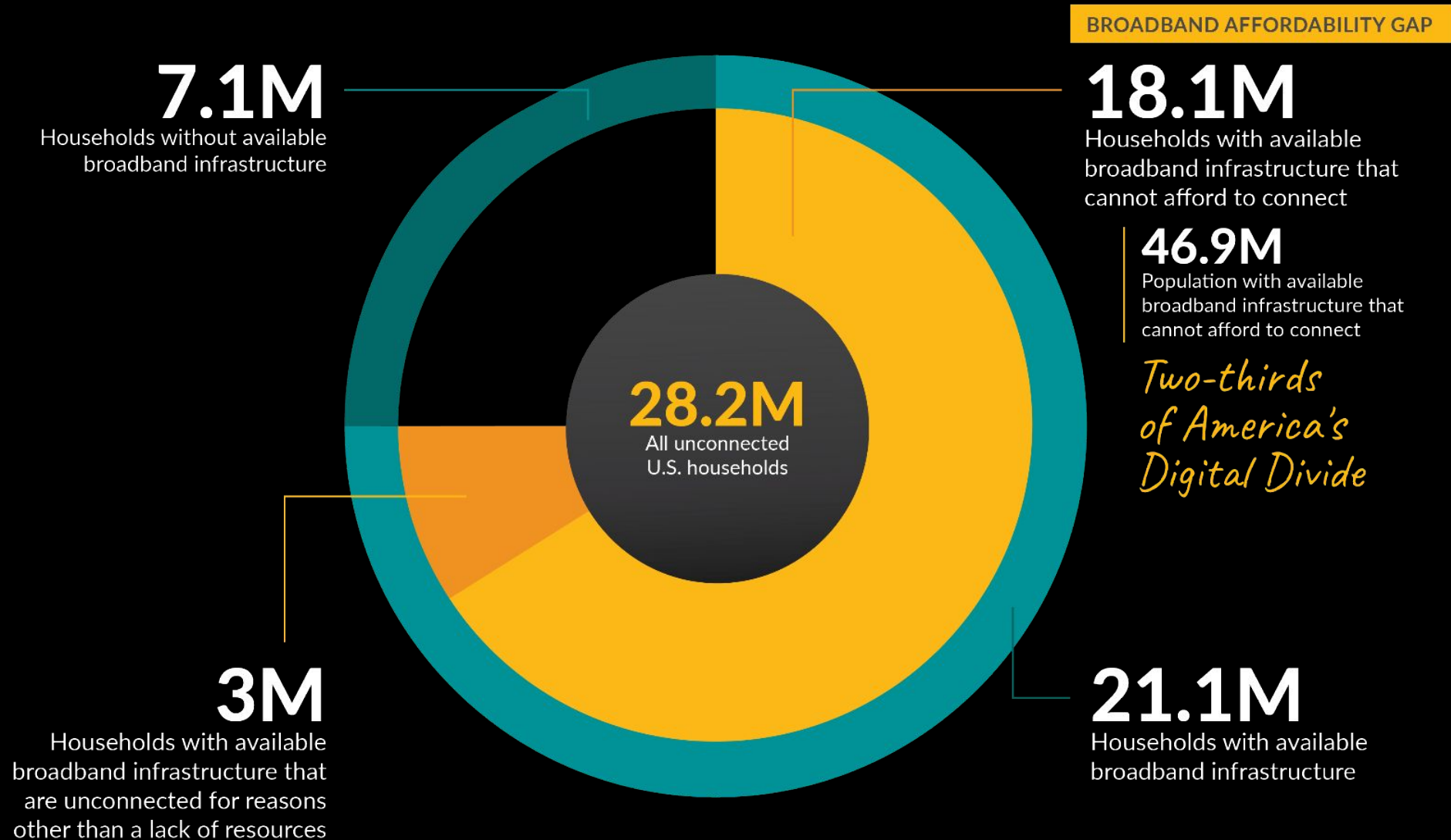

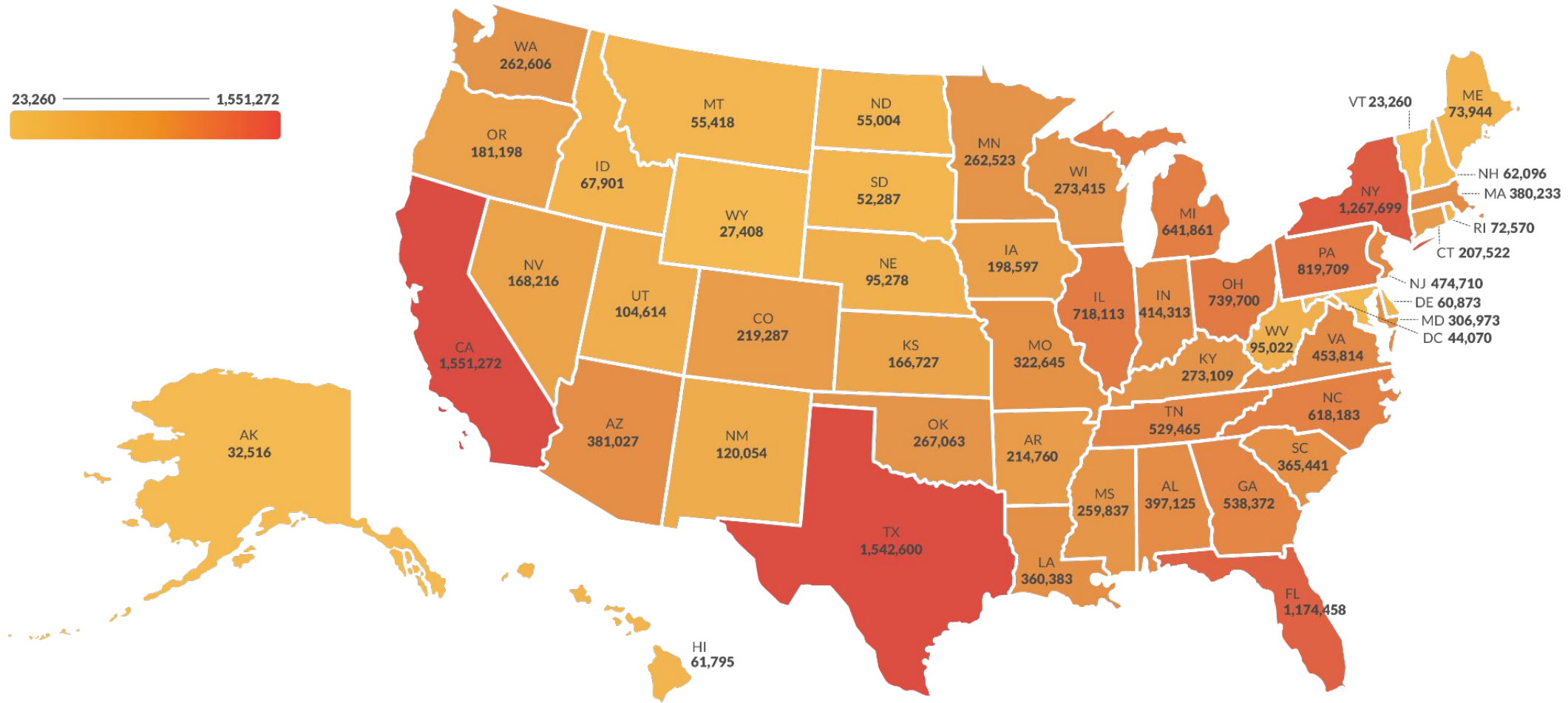

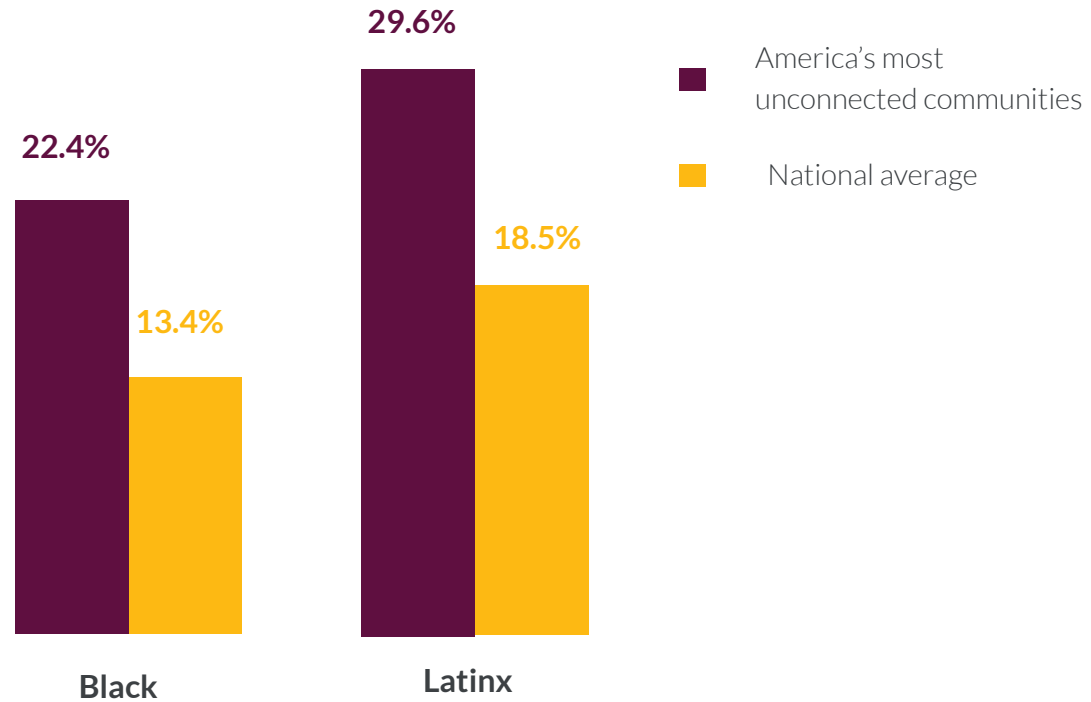


The Broadband Affordability Gap Impacts 18.1 Million Households.

Some Marin County Income Stats

Two of the most populous historically low-income and diverse areas are the Canal neighborhood in San Rafael and Marin City. Both regions have significantly lower household incomes than surrounding neighborhoods.

Marin City, represented by Census Tract 1290, has a median household income of \$38,950, compared to its neighboring Census Tracts (1281 and 1302.02) with median household incomes of \$160,417 and \$105,913 respectively.

Marin City neighborhood is 40% Black

The Canal neighborhood (Census Tract 1122.01) has a median household income of \$49,333. The median household income for Marin County as a whole is \$110,843.

The Canal neighborhood is 89% Hispanic

Marin County as a whole is 16% Hispanic and 3% Black.

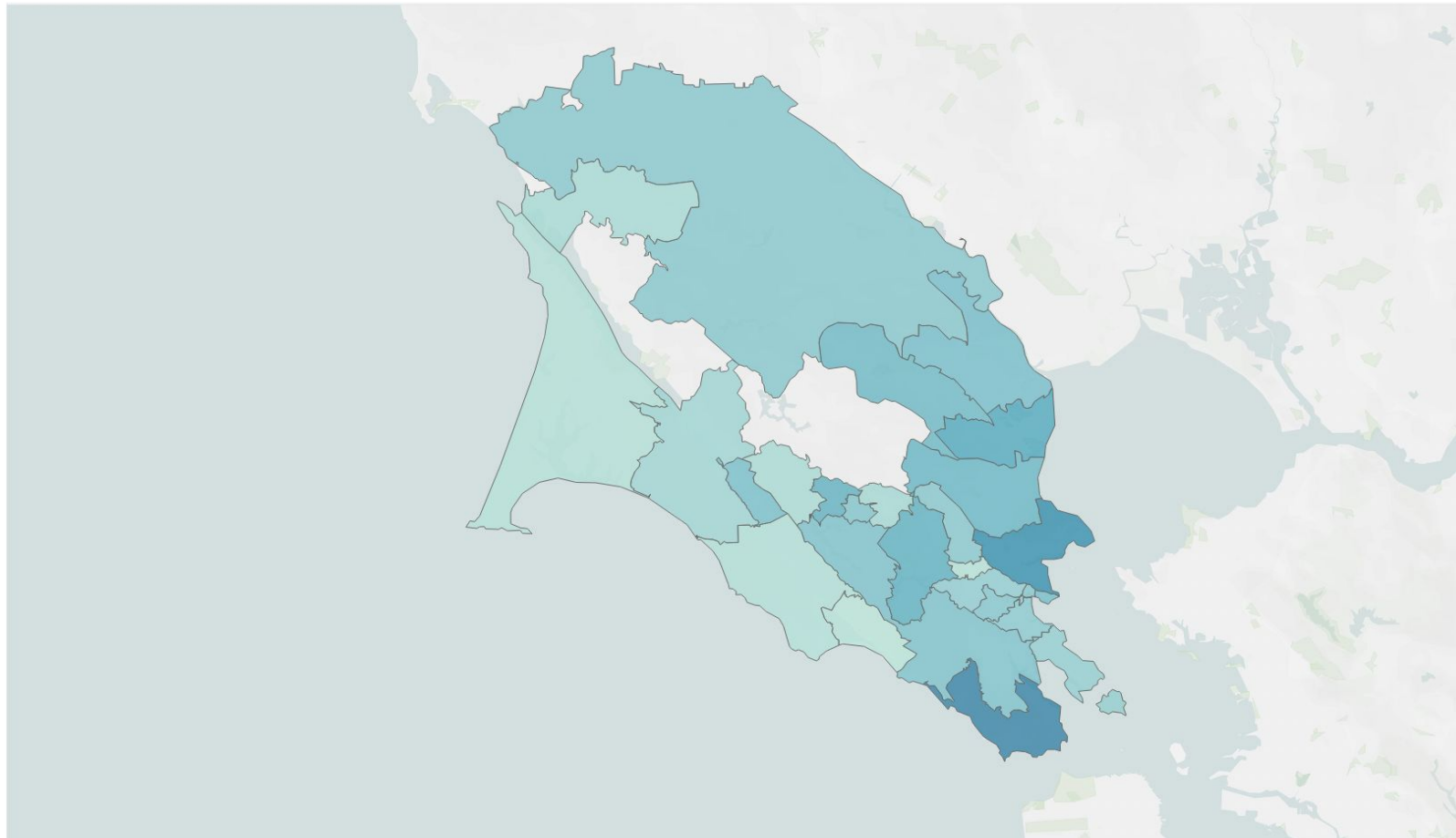

Why Internet?

As trusted voices in your community, it's important to know the obstacles they face due to their lack of at-home internet, and similarly to be able to communicate the benefits of internet access in the context of your unique community.

So why internet? ESH has put together resources to help you understand the impacts of the digital divide and to advocate for internet adoption in your communities within Charlotte.



Why Internet? A Community Partner's Cheat Sheet for Enrolling Communities into the Affordable Connectivity Program

In [November 2021](#), the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act extended the 2020 COVID relief bill to make a number of temporary responses to the ongoing coronavirus pandemic more long term. Amongst these revisions was the transition of the Emergency Broadband Benefit (EBB) Program into the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP). The ACP provides [qualifying](#) consumers with a benefit of \$30 a month (and \$75 a month for households on Tribal lands) onto their Internet or mobile plan, as well as a one-time discount of \$100 towards purchasing a device (laptop, desktop, or tablet) through a participating provider. Such a benefit is a victory for advocates who wish to close the digital divide, a barrier that gained national attention when the pandemic forced a number of students and adults to learn and work from home.

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP)



WHAT

A \$14.2 billion program of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) to assist families unable to afford broadband internet service.



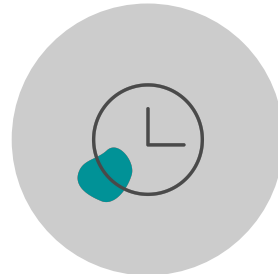
WHO

A household is eligible if a member meets at least one of the criteria, such as an income at or **below 200% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines**, participation in **government assistance program(s)**, or eligibility through dependents participating in the Free and Reduced Price School Meal program or their student attends a **Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) school**.



HOW

Households receive a **discount of up to \$30 a month** for broadband service (**\$75 for eligible households on qualifying Tribal lands**), as well as a one-time discount of \$100 toward the purchase of a connected device, such as a laptop, desktop or tablet.



WHEN

Began December 31, 2021



The ACP: *Eligibility*

Affordable Connectivity Program

A household is eligible if a member meets at least one of these criteria:

200% of the federal poverty guidelines

- Participates in **government assistance programs** such as:
 - Supplemental Nutrition Assistance (SNAP)
 - Medicaid
 - Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
 - Federal Public Housing Assistance
 - Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)
 - Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit
- Has a student that participates in the **Free and Reduced Price School Meal program** or attends a **Community Eligibility Provision (CEP)** school
- Received a **Federal Pell Grant** during the current year

ACP Eligibility

Lifeline + ACP

There are benefits to participating in both Lifeline and ACP:

1. Household receives up to \$9.25 off phone and internet services per month with Lifeline and up to \$34.25 for those of Tribal Lands
2. Eligible Lifeline plans include phone and internet services
3. Lifeline participation guarantees eligibility for ACP
4. Lifeline participation guarantees eligibility for ACP
5. Lifeline and ACP benefits can be used at the same time
6. Lifeline is considered a long-term benefit

ACP Enrollment Steps: Overview

The applicant:

- 1** Determines if they (or a dependent) are eligible for the ACP, and shows proof of eligibility.
 - A Household is eligible if a member meets at least one of the aforementioned criteria
- 2** Applies via one of two options:
 - Online through the National Verifier
 - Mailing in a paper application to the Universal Service Administrative Co (USAC)
- 3** Receives confirmation that their application is approved
 - Applicant can also navigate to their National Verifier dashboard to check that the “application status” reads “Qualified” at any time
- 4** Selects a [participating internet service provider](#)
 - Contacts their local ISP Provider
 - Search [USAC’s online tool](#) for a participating provider
 - Note that all internet service plans are now eligible for ACP*
- 5** Enrolls with the internet service provider and provides their Application ID from the National Verifier to show proof of ACP qualification
 - The service provider may have their own application that the applicant needs to fill out as well



Despite available funding, ACP adoption has remained low due to key barriers



AWARENESS

- Low awareness of subsidy and low-cost programs
- Only 25% of eligible households aware of federal subsidy
- Confusion about what the program is actually offering and its benefits



TRUST

- Lack of trust in government programs
- Worried that the bill will increase or subsidy will go away
- Concerned about sharing personal information with ISPs



ENROLLMENT

- Documentation required to prove eligibility
- Confusion about the application process
- Language barriers

ACP Enrollment Process: National Verifier



Preparation Steps

The community member needs a few things before starting their application:

1. A device to use for signing-up (unless going the paper route) such as their phone.
2. A form of identification
 - a. last four of social security,
 - b. tribal ID number,
 - c. ITIN,
 - d. driver's license
 - e. or other current government-issued ID
3. **Eligibility documentation. This could include:**
 1. Eligibility letter for a qualifying federal program
 2. Pell Grant award letter
 3. Dependent's report card/CEP letter
 4. 1040 Individual Income Tax Form
4. A form of identification for their dependent (if applicable)



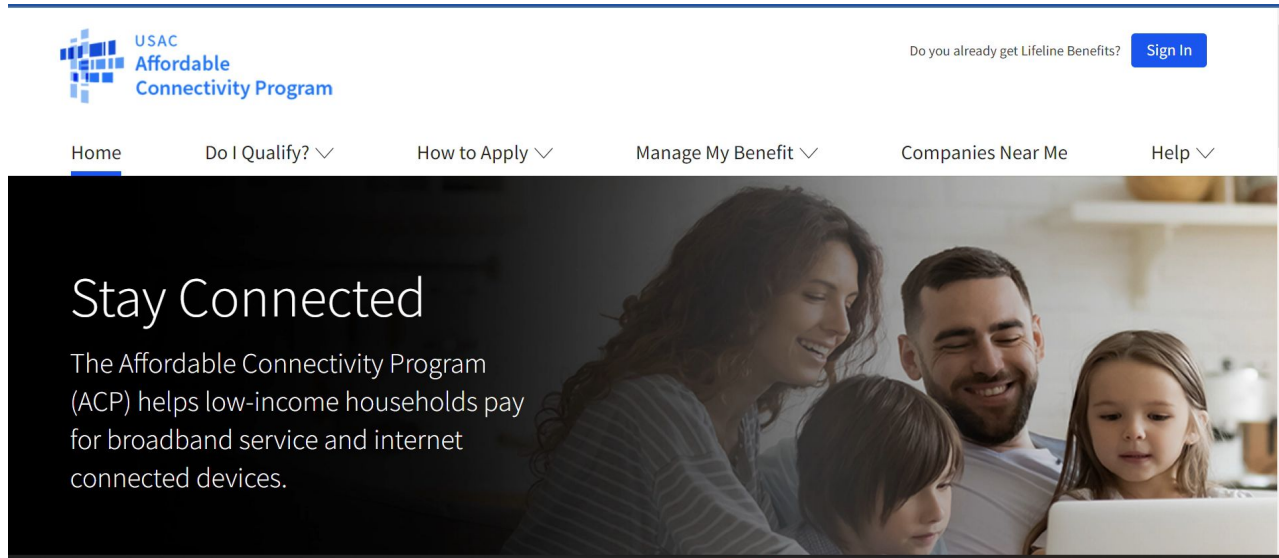

Documentation and Requirements to Confirm Eligibility for ACP

STEP 6: Confirm Eligibility

Qualifying Assistance Program Participation

If the applicant (or dependent) participates in one of the qualifying programs, they may need to provide a letter or official document as proof.

Documentation **must include:**

- Applicant's (or dependent's) first and last name
- Name of qualifying program (ex SNAP, Medicaid, etc)
- The name of the government, program administrator, school, school district, university, college, etc that issued the document
- An issue date within the last 12 months or a future expiration date
- Free & Reduced Price School Lunch Program/School Breakfast Program documents can be from either the 2019-20, 20-21, or 21-22 school year
- Proof of enrollment in a CEP school (i.e. enrollment letter or report card) that includes school name, student name, and current academic year
- Federal Pell Grant documents should be from the current award year

Document **Examples and Tips:**

- Benefit award letter
- Approval letter
- Statement of benefits
- Benefit verification letter
- For Federal Pell Grants, documents should be from this academic year and can include screenshots of a StudentAid.gov dashboard or a copy of the email sent by the Department of Education about the EBB Program

Household Income

If the applicant qualifies through their income, they *may* need to show documents that their annual income is at or below 200% of the [Federal Poverty Guidelines](#).

Documentation **must include:**

- Applicant's (or dependent's) first and last name
- Applicant's annual income

Document **Examples and Tips:**

- Prior year's state or federal tax return
- Current income statement from an employer or a paycheck stub
- A Social Security statement of benefits
- Veterans Administration statement of benefits
- Unemployment or Worker's Compensation statement of benefits
- Divorce decree, child support award, or similar official document with income
- Retirement or pension statement of benefits

Yes, it will be applied to the internet part.



CONSUMER PROTECTIONS

Internet Service Providers are not allowed to:

- Upsell or downsell services.
- Restrict the consumer from changing internet service providers or offerings (the consumer still needs to return any provider-owned equipment).
- Insist that the consumer enter into an extended contract to participate in the ACP.
- Require consumers to get a credit check to receive the benefit.



Other FAQs: De-enrollment

1. Household Usage Requirements

- a. ISPs are responsible for tracking the usage of subscribers not charged a monthly fee (the amount remaining on a customer's bill after the ACP and/or Lifeline benefit has been applied)
- b. Community members must use their ACP-supported service at least once every consecutive 30 days or be de-enrolled from the benefit.

2. Duplicative Support

- a. A community member will be de-enrolled if it is found that they are applying the benefit with multiple providers.
- b. They can also be de-enrolled if multiple members of a household are using the benefit.

3. Failure to re-certify eligibility

- a. The provider will de-enroll a community member if the participant does not respond to the request within 60 days.

Undocumented Households - FAQs

ARE UNDOCUMENTED INDIVIDUALS ELIGIBLE?

Yes. ACP does not take into account one's immigration status, meaning undocumented immigrants can receive this benefit

DOES THE ACP AFFECT GREEN CARD APPLICATIONS?

Applying for the ACP or receiving ACP benefits will not jeopardize anyone's ability to obtain a green card or sponsor a family member under the public charge test, as it is not considered in the test.

HOW CAN AN UNDOCUMENTED INDIVIDUAL QUALIFY?

They can qualify through their own eligibility or through their dependent's eligibility.

How to Prove Identity

- **Driver's License:** 16 states and Washington D.C. do not require proof of citizenship
- Up-to-date **foreign passports**
- **Taxpayer ID Number**
- **State or Municipal ID**



How to Prove Eligibility

- All students, regardless of immigration status may receive **Free & Reduced Price Lunch** or prove eligibility through attendance at a **CEP school**
- Undocumented immigrants are eligible to receive **WIC**
- Dependent (under 18) receives a **Federal Pell Grant**

Unhoused Individuals - FAQs

There are two important steps for unhoused individuals to follow when applying for the ACP:

1. When entering the address for service, the individual can use the address of the shelter where they reside or enter '123 Homeless'
2. The individual must then fill out a [household worksheet](#) and upload the worksheet with their application.

Houseless individuals can choose to find a plan that supports mobile internet and apply their device credit to the purchase of a hotspot.

Additional Enrollment Tips & Tricks

Applying for the ACP can be complicated.

Here are some tips and tricks to overcome commonly seen issues.

1

QUALIFYING WITH DEPENDENT

Use the youngest dependent's information since eligibility expires when a student graduates from a CEP/FRPL program.

2

FRPL/CEP ELIGIBILITY

If school name does not appear in the dropdown, select eligibility as F&RSL and then type in school name.

3

TWO PART PROCESS

Many people won't have the time or documents ready to complete the application when first contacted. Provide them with information to get started and set-up a follow-up time.

4

EMAIL ADDRESS

Options if the individual does not have an email include (1) use a family or friend's, (2) create a new account, (3) use a mobile one-way address (*options in notes*).

5

DIGITAL SIGNING

When digitally signing, the applicant's name must match with their chosen ID and the first letter of the first and last name must be capitalized (regardless of how it appears underneath).
