NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT the Board of Trustees of the Village of East Hampton will hold a public hearing on the 5th day of June 2025 at 11:00 a.m. at the Emergency Services Building, 1 Cedar Street, East Hampton, New York at which time all persons interested will be heard with respect to Introductory #17-2025, a proposed local law amending Village of East Hampton Code Ch. 267. Vehicles and Traffic. §267-15. Penalties for offenses. (B)(E)(F).

INTRODUCTORY NO. 17-2025 LOCAL LAW NO. ____ - 2025

A Local Law amending Village of East Hampton Code Ch. 267. Vehicles and Traffic. §267-15. Penalties for offenses. (B)(E)(F).

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Trustees of the Village of East Hampton as follows:

SECTION I. Chapter 267 of the Code of the Village of East Hampton is hereby amended as follows (bold and underlined material is to be added; struck through material is to be deleted):

CHAPTER 267. VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC ARTICLE I. GENERAL REGULATIONS

§ 267-15. Penalties for offenses.

- A. Every person convicted of a traffic infraction, for a first conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$50 or by imprisonment for not more than 15 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; for a second such conviction within 18 months thereafter, such person shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment for not more than 45 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; upon a third or subsequent conviction within 18 months after the first conviction, such person shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$250 or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
- B. All persons cited on a Village parking summons for a violation of the parking permit requirements of this chapter as set forth in § 267-5 (Beach parking) shall be subject to a minimum fine of ~~\$150~~ **\$250** and shall answer and/or appear on or before 15 days from the date of issuance.
- C. All persons cited on a Village parking summons for a violation of stopping/standing/parking within a handicapped parking zone requirements of this chapter as set forth in § 267-4A(56) shall be subject to a minimum fine of \$250, not including the New York State mandatory surcharge under New York State Law and shall answer and/or appear on or before 15 days from the date of issuance.
- D. All persons cited on a Village parking summons for a violation of New York State Vehicles and Traffic Law § 306-b where the inspection is expired for less than 60 days shall be punishable by a fine of \$50 for each offense. Where the expiration of the registration or inspection is 60 days or more, the offense shall be punishable by a fine of \$75 for each offense. Such person shall answer and/or appear on such summons on or before 15 days from the date of issuance.

E. All persons cited on a Village parking summons for a violation of stopping/standing/parking within a fire zone requirements of this chapter as set forth in § 267-4D shall be subject to a minimum fine of ~~\$125~~ **\$165** and shall answer and/or appear on or before 15 days from the date of issuance.

F. All persons cited on a Village parking summons for a vehicle-related or other violation of this chapter or New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law, other than as set forth in Subsections B, C, D and E above, shall be subject to a minimum fine of ~~\$80~~ **\$120** and shall answer and/or appear on or before 15 days from the date of issuance.

G. Upon the failure of a person or owner of vehicle to appear or answer, on or before the return period or any subsequent adjourned date, such person or owner of a vehicle shall be subject to the following surcharges, in addition to the prescribed fines:

- (1) If the aforementioned fine shall not be paid within 15 days from the date summons was issued, a late penalty equal to half the original fine shall be added to the fine; and
- (2) If the fine is still not paid within 60 days from the date the summons was issued, an additional late penalty in an amount equal to half the original fine shall be added to the fine, in addition to the surcharge imposed by Subsection G(1) herein; and
- (3) If the fine is still not paid within 90 days from the date the summons was issued, an additional penalty of \$30 shall be added to all other fines and penalties previously assessed.

SECTION II. SEVERABILITY.

If any section or subsection, paragraph, clause, phrase or provision of this law shall be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, any judgment made thereby shall not affect the validity of this law as a whole or any part thereof other than the part or provision so adjudged to be invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION IV. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This local law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State.

RESOLUTION ADOPTING A HOME RULE MESSAGE REQUEST STATING VILLAGE'S SUPPORT FOR PENDING STATE LEGISLATION (NY S07945 and A08502 |2025-2026) WHICH SHALL AMEND THE NEW YORK STATE VEHICLE AND TRAFFIC LAW AND THE PUBLIC OFFICERS LAW, IN RELATION TO AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE OF EAST HAMPTON IN THE TOWN OF EAST HAMPTON, COUNTY OF SUFFOLK TO ESTABLISH A DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM IMPOSING MONETARY LIABILITY ON THE OWNER OF A VEHICLE FOR FAILURE OF AN OPERATOR THEREOF TO COMPLY WITH POSTED MAXIMUM SPEED LIMITS; AND PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF SUCH PROVISIONS UPON EXPIRATION THEREOF

WHEREAS, the safety of pedestrians and cyclists residing in or visiting the Village is of the utmost concern to the Village; and

WHEREAS, the failure of motorists to come to a full stop at intersections controlled by a stop sign has become an increased problem in the Village and thus an increased risk to pedestrians and cyclists; and

WHEREAS, the Village, like all small municipalities, lacks the resources to conduct live surveillance at all such intersections; and

WHEREAS, technology is available to conduct such surveillance using cameras; and

WHEREAS, the New York State Legislature has proposed a law to amend the New York State vehicle and traffic law, in relation to owner liability for failure of an operator to comply with stop signs in designated villages located within the counties of Nassau and Suffolk; and

WHEREAS, the Inc. Village of East Hampton is willing to participate in a demonstration or pilot program for the benefit of the Village and its residents; now

THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that the Village Board of the Inc. Village of East Hampton supports the legislation pending in the New York State Legislature as NY S07945 and A08502 (2025-2026), which shall authorize the Village to participate in a demonstration program to install and operate a photo speed violation monitoring system; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Inc. Village of East Hampton Board of Trustees recommends immediate passage of said bills to help address the safety concerns of pedestrians, cyclists and other motorists.

(TWO-TOUR WORK SCHEDULE)

Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) by and between the Village of East Hampton (Village) and the East Hampton Village Police Benevolent Association (PBA) dated this ___ day of May 2025.

WHEREAS, by this Memorandum of Agreement between the Village and the PBA the parties agree to make the current Two-Tour trial work schedule permanent for patrol officers and patrol supervisors (patrol officers or officers) except as modified herein and will make certain changes to the collective-bargaining agreement (CBA); and

WHEREAS, this agreement will be an addition to Section 15 of the current CBA between the parties and will only affect members who are currently assigned to rotating tours except for paragraphs 1(f), 1(i) and 5 which will be applicable to all PBA members and modify the applicable sections of the current CBA; and

WHEREAS, the Two-Tour work schedule shall become permanent effective upon full execution of this agreement; and

WHEREFORE, it is hereby stipulated and agreed by and between the Village and PBA as follows:

1. Effective upon full execution of this agreement the Village and PBA agree to implement the following Two-Tour work schedule for patrol officers:

a. There shall be a rotating two-tour.

- The day shift shall start at 0700 hours and end at 1500 hours. The rotation shall be five days on duty (40 hours) with two days off (72 hours).
- The afternoon shift shall start at 1500 hours and end at 2300 hours. The rotation shall be five days on duty (40 hours) with three days off (80 hours). Overtime for officers assigned to work 1500 to 2300 shall be from 1500 to 2100 (6 hours) unless manpower requires additional hours.

b. There shall also be a steady midnight tour.

- The midnight tour shall start at 2100 hours and end at 0700 hours. The rotation shall be four days on duty (40 hours) with four days off duty (110 hours), four days on duty with four days off duty (110 hours), and four days on duty with three days off duty (86 hours). Overtime for officers assigned to work 2100 to 0700 shall be from 2300 to 0700 (8 hours) unless manpower requires additional hours.

c. The night differential for the rotating two-tour shall remain at the current amount of 5.5% of top step police officer rate. The night differential for the steady midnight tour shall be 10% of top step police officer rate.

d. The rotating two-tour shall receive five extra days off (XDOs).

e. The steady midnight tour shall have to pay back one eight-hour day per year. The payback day shall be used for training not for patrol coverage.

f. Each patrol officer covered by this agreement shall be entitled to utilize three mutual exchange of tours per fiscal year. A mutual exchange of tours is a complete swap of tours, with both officers agreeing to the tours to be worked. The mutual exchange of tour request must be provided in writing at least one week in advance of the proposed mutual exchange. The mutual coverage does not have to be on the same day it can be used to cover any other tour during the fiscal year. The conditions for the mutual exchange of tours set forth in Section 15 of the CBA remain applicable. The parties agree that this section will modify Section 15 of the CBA and is applicable for all PBA members.

g. Patrol officers will submit a shift assignment request on or before June 1, 2025. Shift assignments will be assigned at the Chief's discretion, with consideration given to rank and then to seniority. Rank followed by seniority will be the determining factors when practical, but the Chief shall retain the right to change tours and assignments to meet the needs of the Department. Changes shall not be made in an arbitrary and capricious manner and an explanation shall be given if requested.

h. All current accrued time except personal leave and bereavement leave shall be converted to hours.

i. The utilization of XDOs will not be permitted beginning July 1 and up to and including Labor Day, with the exception of "after birth" maternity leave. A modification of tour assignment resulting in the accruing of XDO time between July 01 through July 31, will be carried over to the following East Hampton Village fiscal year, without penalty. The restrictions limiting the utilization of Vacation and Holiday time in the CBA will be amended from "between Memorial Day and Labor Day" to "beginning July 1 and up to and including Labor Day." Said amendments will take effect August 1, 2025.

2. Except as specifically changed by this Stipulation, the terms of the CBA shall control. Without limiting the foregoing, nothing herein shall be deemed to change the existing calculation of the rate of pay, including the daily or hourly rate of pay, for purpose of the calculation of any compensation or benefit.

3. The terms and conditions contained in the Stipulation are only applicable to officers working the Two-Tour schedule rotation. Except for paragraphs 1(f), 1(i) and 5 which are applicable to all members. Any terms and conditions not addressed herein shall continue to be governed by the CBA.

4. Officers assigned to five (5) days on duty two (2) days off shall not be subject to this work schedule.


5. The maximum workday will be sixteen (16) consecutive hours. Officers will be granted eight (8) hours of rest time from when they go off duty before they must report back for duty. The eight (8) hours of rest time will be at no cost to the officer and the Village will cover the rest time with overtime. The officer must notify the duty officer of such instances. The parties agree that this section will modify Section 15 of the CBA and is applicable for all PBA members.

6. In the event that unanticipated issues arise regarding the application of the work schedule and/or terms of this Agreement, both parties agree to establish a joint labor management committee to attempt to address such issues.

7. This Stipulation is subject to ratification by the PBA membership and the East Hampton Village board.
