Trustee Rosemary Brown stated that she maintains her position on the proposed legislation from the December 5<sup>th</sup> meeting; she would prefer the street be made one-way westbound as it would eliminate the line-of-sight issue. Trustee Graham thought the village could begin addressing the issues with the intersection by adding stops, maybe amend code later to make the road one-way.
