

Ela Township Homework Club 2022-2023 Kindergarten - 5th Grade



Homework Club is our after-school program offered to the youth in Ela Township. Children engage in daily activities such as completing homework, playing games, making crafts, and building friendships. The goal of Homework Club is to provide children with a safe and enjoyable environment for them to grow academically and socially.

Safe Sitter and Safe@Home

Safe Sitter is a program designed to prepare students in grades 6-8 to be safe when they're home alone, watching younger siblings or babysitting. This class is filled with fun games and role-playing exercises. By the end of this day-long program, students will cover safety skills, child care skills, first aid and rescue skills, and life and business skills.



Class Dates: September 11, November 19, January 21, & March 11 Fee: \$60pp

Safe@Home is designed for children in grades 4-6 to prepare them to be safe when they are home alone. This 90-minute program that teaches how to practice safe habits, how to prevent unsafe situations, and what to do when faced with dangers such as power failures or weather emergencies.

Class Dates: September 14, December 10, & February 17 Fee: \$25pp

*All classes need minimum of 8 participants.

This is a great beginner class to incorporate some cardio into your day that raises your heartrate to improve your overall endurance. This class consist of a 10 minute warm up, 20 minutes of cardio and strength, and 15 minutes of a seated cool down with core.

REDUCE STRESS Restorative Yoga is a style of yoga that uses yoga props - bolsters, blankets, blocks and straps to make all yoga poses gentle and accessible to everyone. The goal of restorative yoga is to bring balance to body and mind.
