Breaking Down the CARES Act

\$139 B

States

This funding will go to states. Counties and cities with over 500,000 people eligible for direct funding.

Title V

\$150 Billion for State, Local, Tribal, and Territory Governments



Tribes

Secretary of Treasury and Secretary of Interior to determine amount for each tribe.

\$3 B

Territories

Established to cover Coronavirusrelated public health emergency expenses reserved for the District of Columbia and five U.S. Territories.



5 Steps to Navigating COVID-19 Funding



Step 1: Assemble Your Grants Management Team

Grants Manager

Dedicated grants specialist to oversee compliance and minute details of funding requirements.



Senior Procurement Officer

Provides cradle-to-grave assistance with sub-award/subcontracting, and procurement support for grant funding.

Coordinating Officer

Manages at the organizational level from start to finish.




Provides general guidance to ensure agency/dept. creates a clear audit trail and is in compliance.





Step 2: Prepare Your Budget Appropriation and Spending Authority

Step 3: Maximize Your Funding

CARES Act emphasizes goals + metrics.
You need to cover the following:

- Show that adequate progress is being made
- Ensure there are no compliance issues
- Provide information useful for performance measures under COVID-19 guidance











Step 4: Revisit Your Cost Allocation Plans and Negotiated Indirect Cost Rate

Through individual or business application (for example, SBA PPP or EIDL)

Through competitive grant processes (USDA, others)

Through state requests (Coronavirus Relief Fund)

Small Business Resources

Update on April 16:
4,975 lenders approved 1,661,397 loans
for \$350 billion in less than two weeks that's equivalent to the past fourteen
years' worth of SBA funding. They're out
of money, for now...

SBA PAYCHECK PROTECTION PROGRAM & EIDL PROGRAM

SBA is offering two primary types of funding:

- Advance up to \$10K on EIDL (Economic Injury Disaster Loans) for businesses in states with declared disasters, offered through SBA
- <u>Paycheck Protection Program</u>, offered through other lenders and forgivable up to 75% if used to keep employees paid during closures

SBA is also offering extension and postponement options on existing loans. Direct businesses to SBA local offices here: https://www.sba.gov/local-assistance.

WITHIN CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUND

Of the \$150 billion in the CRF:

- ✓\$45.4 billion for a FEMA Disaster Relief Fund that includes \$400 million in grants for firefighters, emergency managers, and emergency food programs
- ✓\$1.5 billion for CDC State and Local Preparedness grants
- ✓\$955 million for HHS Aging and Disabled program grants
- ✓\$850 million for DOJ Byrne Grants and Byrne Justice Assistance Grants
- ✓\$425 million for HHS SAMHSA funding for behavioral health clinics and emergency grants
- ✓\$200 million for Federal Communications Commission telehealth program grants
