• Discussed library events: Feb 15: Well attended. There were almost 30 in the audience, including about a dozen students from Archie Williams.

- Earth Day Event: Mill Valley will have a scaled down event this year, not run by Green Change but by the city, so we are thinking of having something in Fairfax on Saturday, April 20th in Bolinas Park. Perhaps we could include other Fairfax groups: Open Space, Tree Committee, Community Emergency Preparedness (CEPC), Ross Valley Fire/Fire Safe Marin, Age Friendly Fairfax, San Anselmo CAC, others. We might look for some sort of entertainment.
- Climate Action Film Night: We would like to show the Patagonia film, "Scale of Hope". We might host it on May 7th, 8th or 14th at the Women's Club or possibly Fairfax Theatre.
- Discussed tabling: San Anselmo would like to table with us again. Looking at Sundays, March 17th or 24th, April 28th or May 5th
- Town Newsletter: Ask Sean to include Joe's rebate information soon

TRANSPORTATION INITIATIVES

- Shakeshaft reported on Orange Outlet pilot program: Clear Result (MCE) now has an interest form for MFH owners for EV outlet installation. They will send out a consultant to advise. You do not have to have made a decision. Sheryl has spoken to and sent this information to four Fairfax MFH; Creekside, Sherwood Oaks, Lanai Apartments, Piper Court Apartments.
- Costello discussed E-Bike Incentive Program: Want to come up with a model for an EV bike rebate program. We have \$5,000 and will ask for \$5,000 more. \$500 for low-income folks. \$750 for cargo bikes. Discussed minimum age and income limits.
- EV Car & Bike Show, waiting to hear on funding for a May 19th event in Fairfax.

BUILT ENVIRONMENT INITIATIVES

- Discussion of Home Energy Audits: Home Energy Score nationally recognized assessment, 1-10. Federal program. BayRen is running a pilot in Bay Area/Marin. Goal is to educate people in Marin and make it optional for now.
- Town of Fairfax Green Building & Electrification Web Page Joe to talk to Sean about some additions. We'd like to get it in the town newsletter.

SEQUESTRATION INITIATIVES

- BioDiversity Resolution (encourages replacing landscaping with native plants that support pollinators). Ask the town to pass a proclamation. Discussed having a Biodiversity Day in Fairfax on Saturday, September 7th.
- Fairfax Tree & Urban Forest Plan. Ask town about a tree inventory.
