Dear Chance and Stephanie, I am writing you (again) after reading the your public statement /proclamation purportedly on behalf of the Fairfax community to tell you (again) that placing an item on the topics of Israel, the Israeli people, the merits of the existence of the State of Israeli on the June 5 public meeting will bring hate filled language, harassment, and even threats of violence (and beyond should this item be held to a future agenda). We have seen it happen at other town meetings across the Bay Area. No reason exists to assume the same won't happen in Fairfax. Hate against Jews has recently risen 900%, according to ADL. To set up a public event that will inevitably be filled with such hateful comments about the Jewish community is deplorable.

After hearing from dozens of Jewish mothers in the community who fear for their safety and the safety of their children (both emotional and physical), please remove this matter from the June 5 public agenda. I do not know what your goals are with framing the volatile issue of Israel on the public agenda but I can tell you with 100% certainty that placing this matter on the public agenda will subject me, other Jewish mothers, and all the other Jewish families in the community to hearing hours of hateful speech against us - right here in Fairfax. Our children have deep connections to Israel. Our families are largely refugees from across the world. Mine is from South America. We all have family and friends in Israel, where half of the world's Jewish population (~8 million) lives. My daughter spent a semester in high school outside of Tel Aviv. Some children in the community, even one family that owns a popular cafe in Fairfax, served in the Israeli military. To create a public forum, as you have done, for people to claim that the Israel needs to be dissolved and people removed is a request to destroy all Jews.

Despite being asked from countless Jewish mothers to refrain from placing the issue of Israel on the Agenda, you did it. Your actions are deplorable.

The message you are sending to our families by inviting hate into our community is that we are not welcome here - rather you welcome open discussion in public forums about hurtful hateful topics, such as the right of the Jewish people to exist. People will say hateful things about Jews on June 5 and you, Chance and Stephanie, have invited this to happen with full knowledge of how destructive it will be to us. Your actions are deplorable.

At this point, I can only understand your efforts as an expression of your personal viewpoints, which includes hate towards Jews. You might disagree but I am telling you that the consequence of your conduct is creating hate towards Jewish families and, nevertheless, you continue. To the extent that legal avenues exists, such as a claim of discrimination against the Town of Fairfax & CMs named personally against Jews or your personal liability for defamation of me as a Jewish person, I will not hesitate to pursue these avenues.

Let me be clear, should the June 5 meeting devolve into a forum of hate filled harassment of me as a Jewish mother, I will take any reasonable legal action available to me for accountability.

I wish to thank Stephanie and Chance for the hard work that you put into drafting this resolution and my thanks to all the other council members whose thoughts and ideas found their way into this proclamation. You should all be proud of what you have done.

From my point of view, the most powerful aspect of the proclamation is when it references the 146 countries that have formally recognized the State of Palestine as a sovereign nation. It is of great significance that the vast majority of the nations of the world have recognized Palestinian sovereignty and that you have included this in the proclamation. Overall, knowing the deep divisions in the Jewish community around this issue, I believe you have come up with a most worthy proclamation knowing there is no way in hell you could please all sides.

If I may, I would suggest another version of your 4th item. It would read the following:

Calls for an immediate and enduring ceasefire on both parties that would allow for the exchange of all hostages and Palestinian prisoners; the immediate entry of humanitarian assistance in the form of food, water, medicine, and electricity; and would set the stage for renewed negotiations between the two peoples toward exploring a path forward for living together in peace, justice, dignity, and security.

You should feel you are on firm ground in calling for such a ceasefire because the May 24th ruling of the International Court of Justice is as follows:

"The State of Israel shall, in conformity with its obligations under the Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of the Crime of Genocide, and in view of the worsening conditions of life faced by civilians in the Rafah Governorate: immediately halt its military offensive, and any other action in the Rafah Governorate, which may inflict on the Palestinian group in Gaza conditions of life that would bring about its physical destruction in whole or in part."

Therefore, you might even consider the following generic statement: Calls on Israel to comply with all of the rulings of the International Court of Justice in the case before the ICJ.

I want all of you to know that you have my support in doing this proclamation and that if any of you get any abuse or suffer being called anti-Semitic, please know that I will defend and support you from any such scurrilous charges.

Hello Councilmembers,

I am following up with regards to the meeting on 5/29/24, with the hopes that at least some of my feedback can be addressed prior to Wednesday's meeting.

I've noticed the beginnings of a worrying development in the Council's deliberations and actions recently, highlighted in this most recent meeting. It seems as if the Council is conceding more and more to appease the very vocal and often belligerent group that has regularly attended meetings as part of their ill-informed and/or deceptive backlash to extraordinarily moderate tenant protections.

Prior to the 5/29 meeting, this has generally been limited to the Council making sure to specifically discuss and address the statements of that group after public comment has been closed on a particular topic. There seems to be a much higher priority on discussion of, and addressing the comments of that group rather than other members of the public. At the 5/29 meeting, this escalated to the council agreeing—with hardly any hesitancy or resistance to imposing unnecessary costs on the Town with no discernable benefit to the Town. Nor even to the substantive efforts of the ballot measure proponents! The Council's discussion from ~ 43:30 of the meeting recording to ~ 1:18:00 is particularly revealing. The Council conceded that it had no sense of what the cost could be, and that it could be "tens of thousands of dollars" and yet would still approve forcing that unnecessary cost on the town without knowing the extent of the issue. For a Town rightfully sensitive to environmental concerns, it was also very surprising to me that no one mentioned the extraordinary amount of extra paper and printing that would be done unnecessarily.

At various times during the deliberation we heard "I don't think it's worth causing more rancor over this issue" and other similar sentiments, but that just rewards the awful behavior and bad faith of certain people to detriment and financial burden of the Town. I understand if there are circumstances where it's worthwhile to balance costs of a particular action against the incremental disruption to Council meetings, but that should be determined expressly during the meeting. As-is the Council is simply incentivizing that group to continue along in a manner the Council is otherwise objecting to, or even escalate to get their way for more acute demands. The Council is also then encouraging other groups or individuals to be just as vitriolic so that they too can get particular concessions in the interest of limiting rancor and (the awfully misused) "divisiveness." I am sympathetic to the plight of the Council when dealing with what appears to be extremely frequent malicious behavior and comments, but there must be another way—a better way—to address that than rewarding such behavior/comments, by giving in to unjustifiable demands.

When the Town Attorney stated that: "it's going to be very small very tiny very difficult to read, it will cost thousands of dollars", the Mayor replied that "I think it's fine... whether I agree or not with the ballot initiative is not the question it's you know these folks as you said paid money did a perfect initiative let's leave it as is and still you will do your impartial analysis." (~45:00 of the recording). This misses the point, the issue isn't whether or not this helps or hurts the passage of the initiative. And just because an initiative is done properly doesn't mean the full text is then always printed in a voter guide. The point is that the Town is going to take on thousands of dollars in unnecessary costs with no objective discernable benefit, because the Council prefers to avoid dealing with the belligerent reaction of those deciding arbitrarily to make this unreasonable demand. Councilmember Ackerman similarly noted (correctly) that the vast majority of added printing would just be the prior code with a strikeout through it, and despite stating that printing it all is "nonsensical" (~52:50 of the recording), and that people "wouldn't actually benefit from it" (~53:15 of the recording), he conceded to such "nonsensical" demand saying "I agree that I don't want to fight about it with the proponents of the measure" (~53:00 of the recording). On top of that being the wrong thing for the Council to do in and of itself,

it's a choice made even more ridiculous by the reality that doing so will have <u>no effect</u> on the behavior of those the Council seeks to appease. I would expect that, giving a moments thought to the matter, the Council would know that this same group will still act with the same bunker mentality and take the same amount of time interfering and disrupting the regular course of business at Council meetings. The time devoting to complaining about this decision will simply be spent on other outlandish complaints.

I'll try to avoid overloading this email more than I already have, and will address what I believe are double-standards and a disregard for what was I believe appalling hate speech in a separate email. I would like to reiterate that I appreciate each of the Councilmembers and Town Staff and all of the time you devote on for the Town. The underlying substance here is that I want *your* judgement on the matters that the Council makes decisions on, I don't want you to substitute your much more well-informed understanding with that of bad faith actors regularly making unreasonable demands (even if you're doing it in the interest of conviviality).
