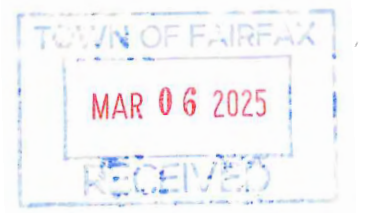

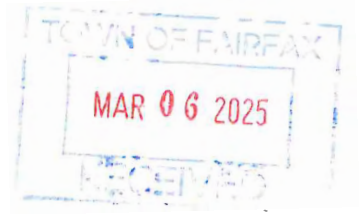

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO CIRCULATE RECALL PETITION

TO THE HONORABLE Councilmember Lisel Blash: Pursuant to Section 11020, California Elections Code, the undersigned registered qualified voters of the Town of Fairfax, in the State of California, hereby give notice that we are the proponents of a recall petition and that we intend to seek your recall and removal from the office of Council Member, in the Town of Fairfax. The grounds for the recall are as follows:

MISMANAGEMENT CHAOS:

- Blatantly ignored encampment crisis leading to fire hazards, contamination of watershed, hard drug use, and child endangerment
- Pursued high-density housing in downtown Fairfax - Increasing the risk of a death trap scenario for residents during wildfires, floods or earthquakes
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- Ignored crumbling town infrastructure - Mismanaged funds earmarked for maintenance and repairs leaving Fairfax with the worst roads in Marin County
- Frivolous spending - Wasted our taxpayer dollars on unnecessary consultants

SECRECY AND DECEPTION:

- Restricted free speech at meetings - Silencing opposing views
- Repeated deception about services to encampment - Concealed real intention to overdevelop Fairfax
- Intentionally mislead the public - Plans for a 7-story high rise at School Street Plaza were dismissed as "fear mongering"
- Pandered to outside political influences and previous employer Marin Environmental Housing Collaborative
- Disregarded election results - Defied the citizens' overwhelming vote to elect the town clerk
- Deceptive political maneuvering to silence new town council members
